## Superintendent's Corner




On behalf of the Delmar School District, enclosed please find highlights for the remainder of the winter and spring season, spanning February 2017 through May 2017.



## Curriculum, Instruction and Assessment – Lisa R. Morris



### Testing:

Testing dates for the remainder of the school year are listed to the right. We have a busy spring with testing.

All students in grades 5 – 10 took the Winter MAP test in math and reading in December. The final round of MAP Math and Reading testing will take place in the spring (Beginning of March). All of our students are working hard to meet their individualized growth goal in Reading and Math by the spring. The spring testing results will be one piece of information used in class placement for next school year.

The Smarter Balanced Test in Reading and Math will be administered to all students in grades 5 - 8 starting March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Smarter Assessments measure students' mastery of the Common Core State Standards in English Language Arts/ Literacy and Mathematics for grades 3-8. The assessments include:

- Writing at every grade.
- New question types that require students to think more deeply and solve more complex problems.
- Performance tasks such as reading several different
- documents and writing short essays based on them.

## Computer-adaptive technology that makes the assessments more accurate.

All 10<sup>th</sup> grade students should have been able to access their PSAT 8/9 scores from last school year through the College Board Website. In addition, they can link their College Board accounts to Khan Academy and get personalized practice problems to get ready for the PSAT.

All of our 10<sup>th</sup> graders will take the PSAT on Wednesday, April 5<sup>th</sup> during the school day. The PSAT is a test that will help your child and their teachers figure out what your child needs to work on most so that they are ready for college when they graduate from high school.



All 11th grade students will take the SAT test on Wednesday, April 5<sup>th</sup>. We will also offer a makeup test day on Wednesday, April 25<sup>th</sup>. The SAT is a required test for all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students to take in April. The SAT has replaced the SBAC Reading and Math tests that were the previous requirements for all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. Our guidance department has been working hard to set

up all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students with Khan Academy accounts so they can receive individualized practice for the SAT based on their PSAT score from last year.

## Save the date Financial aid workshop

Mark your calendar for our next Parent PRIDE Night on February 16<sup>th</sup>. We will have a representative from Stand By Me to help parents and students complete their FAFSA Application. This is a great opportunity to get questions answered while you complete the FASFA application. The FAFSA form is the "Free Application for Federal Student

Aid". This is the form is completely annually by current and prospective college students (undergraduate and graduate) to determine their eligibility for student financial aid. All federal grant and loan awards are determined by the FAFSA, and nearly all colleges use the FAFSA as the basis for their own financial aid awards. The FASFA form can be found on the web at: <u>https://fasfa.ed.gov/</u>.



We will also be holding a Parent PRIDE Night on Thursday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm. This PRIDE Night will inform parents about the upcoming assessments in both the middle school and high school. Make plans to attend to hear more about the Smarter Balanced Test for grades 5 - 8, and the PSAT/SAT for grades 10 and 11.

Advanced Placement Program

Our final PRIDE Night for the school year will be our Advanced Placement and Wilmington University Night which will be held on Thursday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> at 6pm. Parent and students in

grades 10 – 12 are welcome to attend to learn more about our AP and Wilmington University courses that will be offered in the 2017-18 school year. We will discuss course options, prerequisites and requirements for courses, and cost of courses. This is the perfect time to get to ask questions about these courses prior to scheduling by our guidance department for next school year.





## PSAT and SAT Resources:

Below you will find links to various resources for students.

Khan Academy SAT (www.khanacademy.org/test-prep/sat) This site has practice for students now as well as a video overview of the changes to the SAT. Students can go on now, take a short diagnostic assessment and get a personalized plan tailored just for them to practice for the SAT. Once a student has their PSAT results, students can elect to have their PSAT

scores (item level information) sent to Khan and a tailored plan will be created based on the student's individual areas of need as demonstrated on the PSAT. Best part is, it is the best practice out there AND it is FREE!!!

<u>College Board Site:</u> (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/) This site has everything you could possibly want to know about the SAT Suite of Assessments (including all PSAT-related assessments). There are practice tests and items, information about registering, dates, college search link; it is a wealth of information.

SAT Question of the Day App: (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/practice/daily-practice-app) Students can download this app from any cell device and get a daily practice question.



### **Delaware School Success Framework (DSSF)**

The Delaware School Success Framework (DSSF) provides students, families, and schools with important information on school performance. Reports include information covering demographics, growth, culture and climate. Visit <u>http://dssf.doe.k12.de.us/</u> to see Delmar Middle School and Delmar High School reports.

The Delaware School Success Framework applies to all schools and districts in the state. This Framework raises the expectations for students, schools and districts as it is focused on college and career readiness. The DSSF is an index made up of four categories that include:

- 1. Academic Achievement
- 2. Academic Growth
- 3. On Track to Graduation
- 4. College and Career Preparation

These areas include nine (ES and MS) to eleven (HS) individual metrics. The metrics are:

- Proficiency in English Language Arts (ELA), Mathematics, Science and Social Studies
- Growth in ELA and Mathematics
- Growth to proficiency in ELA and Mathematics (elementary and middle schools only)
- Average daily attendance (elementary and middle schools only)
- On track to graduation in 9th grade (high schools only)
- 4-, 5- and 6-year cohort graduation rate (high schools only)
- Successful participation in a college or career experience while in high school, such as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, dual enrollment, and technical skill attainment (high schools only)

Schools and districts receive ratings based on performance in each category (e.g., Academic

Achievement, Growth, On Track to Graduation, and College and Career Preparation). Individual student data is aggregated at the school and district levels to generate a numeric score for each category. Each of the metrics contributes a weighted value toward the numeric score, which is then converted into a star value.

## ESSA – "Every Student Succeeds Act"



In December 2015, Congress reauthorized the Elementary and Secondary Education Act, the main federal law governing public education. The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) replaces the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). As part of NCLB, Delaware is one of the 43 states operating under ESEA Flexibility. This new law gives states more flexibility and provides more state and local control over the accountability process.

ESSA implementation will begin during the 2017-18 school year. The 2016-17 school year is our opportunity to consult with stakeholders, develop our plan, and submit it to the U.S. Department of Education for their approval.

Although ESSA was signed into law last December, we are still waiting for detailed information that will be included in federal regulation and guidance.

In the meantime, DDOE staff have been learning the content of the new law and working to understand the changes in policy and requirements. These efforts helped us to see Delaware's strength and readiness for ESSA and to identify areas of opportunity and discussion.

Our early work has set the stage for us to plan for **effective**, **focused**, **and meaningful** stakeholder consultation, which we will use to draft our State Plan.

I want to take this opportunity to say **THANK YOU** to all of our students, faculty, staff, and substitutes for a great first semester in the 2016-2017 school year; Mr. O'Neal and I couldn't do it without your help!

There are several upcoming events and highlights I'd like to share with you:

The first week in February your student will bring home paper copies of the annual DOE Climate Survey. The **Delaware School Climate Survey** was developed by the Delaware Positive Behavior Support Initiative (a partnership between the Delaware Department of Education and the Center for Disabilities Studies at the University of Delaware). There is no identifying information on the survey so no one will know how you individually answered any of the questions. Completed surveys will be sent to the University of Delaware where the information will be compiled into a report for our school. The completed survey must be returned to school by February 24<sup>th</sup>. We will send periodic reminders via BlackBoard.

It has been a great start to the 2016-2017 school year and I know that our middle schoolers are doing great things!

# Math Tech Corner – Math Apps



Math Quizzer is an interactive and fun way to, not only learn, but also to boost your skills in; Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication, and Division. It offers an easy to understand chalkboard visual, which keeps track of your "score" as you progress.



Thinking Blocks Fractions teaches children how to model and solve word problems involving fractions and whole numbers. In this interactive tutorial, children are introduced to 6 problem solving models. The models help children organize information and visualize number relationships. It is ideal for children who are learning model drawing strategies found in math books from Singapore.



This app allows students to explore how changes in the formula or graph or table will impact the other two. Another nice feature of the graph is the ability to watch how a change in the scale will not change the formula or table but will change the graph appearance. The app allows you to enter a linear equation to be displayed on the graph, but you can also use the dots on the line to move it around yourself. You can also choose a different starting point for x in the table.

Linear Model supports equations in both slope intercept, y = mx + b, and standard form, Ax + By = C formats.

## Preparing Your Student for the MAP, SBAC, and SAT assessments

- **1.** Review curriculum materials/ interactive notebook with your child as each assessment is aligned to the common core standards.
- 2. Search for Smarter Balanced Assessment items on the internet to see sample problems.
- 3. Sign up to receive SAT questions of the day.
- 4. Have your child "teach" you what they are doing in math class. This will help them to articulate the math concepts at home.
- 5. Remind your child to read each question carefully so that they answer the questions completely.


## M.S. Band and Chorus with Mr. Smith **M.S. CHORUS**

As the weather changes through the seasons please remember:

Our District Tardy Policy is on page 20 of the handbook. The building opens in the morning at 7:30 am for students to eat breakfast in the cafeteria. At 7:45 am all students are permitted to enter the building and proceed to their classes. All students must be **IN** their first class prior to the bell ringing at **7:50 am**. Students arriving between 7:50 am and 8:15 am will be required to report to the tardy office.

**Tardy records are maintained per semester.** We are now in the second semester which means that all students were granted a "clean slate" on January 23<sup>rd</sup>. Once students have been tardy to school on three occasions, an office detention will be scheduled. The 6<sup>th</sup> tardy will result in one day of In-School Suspension. I am sure we can all agree that we certainly do not want to see this happen for any student. Our goal is for all students to be in class at all times in order to benefit from instruction and ultimately be successful in all areas.

## In order to be eligible for exemption, students must meet the criteria below:

### **Attendance Requirement**

Students absent more than 6.5 days will not be eligible for exam exemptions.

The Delmar School District Attendance policy states "Any student who accumulates more than 10 but less than 20 personal day absences, not including medical/administrative, may make up those days in excess of ten during a <u>summer make-up sessions (Attendance Summer School)</u>. Failure to make up those days at the assigned time/days will result in the student receiving no credit for the courses taken during the school year."

## **High School Department Academic Highlights & Activities**

### News from the High School English Department:



Currently in 9th grade English I, we are working towards creating more independent learners to prepare our students for 10th grade English. Some sections are exploring author's purpose and perspective and will complete a unit on argumentative writing. Other sections will

be starting a unit on Socratic Seminars. These are student led activities and class discussions which will prep them for taking the



reins in class as we work through a study of The Outsiders in English I and To Kill a Mockingbird in Honors English I. Honors will wrap up the year with a unit centering on the short stories of Edgar Allan Poe.

10th grade English II is beginning a unit on Argument and Persuasion. Students will be learning about the rhetorical elements writers use to persuade their readers first exploring texts and then implementing the techniques in their own writing. From there, the Honors sections will be focusing on critical analysis working with visual texts. Other sections will be working through a short story unit. All 10th grade classes are finishing the year with an in depth study of Romeo and Juliet.

11<sup>th</sup> grade English III starts the second half of the year continuing the examination of argumentative writing and exploring the world of research. Students will have hands on experience gathering research, evaluating sources for credibility, and synthesizing information gathered in order to write research papers and present their ideas. Students will then begin to analyze the historical context and cultural characteristics of America during the 1920's while reading and analyzing *The Great Gatsby*.

12<sup>th</sup> grade English IV students will be working on Medieval and Renaissance literature for the 3rd marking period. For the 4th quarter, we will be focusing on research and analysis of argument. In the spring, we will also begin preparing for graduation.

### News for the High School Science Department:



The annual state science assessment called DCAS Science will take place at the end of May for all students with a 10<sup>th</sup> grade homeroom. The test covers the material from 9<sup>th</sup> grade Physical Science as well as 10<sup>th</sup> grade Biology. Scores are based on a 1-4 scale with a 3 meaning they



have met the standards and a 4 meaning they have exceeded the standards. Those students earning a 3 or a 4 will be exempt from the final exam in Biology. Those scoring a 3 will be given a 93% as an exam grade. Those scoring a 4 will be given a 100% as an exam grade.

Please encourage your child to do the best they can. The Science Olympiad Competition will take place on Saturday March 4<sup>th</sup> at Delaware State University. The Science Department is also working with prom coordinator, Mrs. Terri Hurley, as well as the student prom committee to prepare for Delmar Junior/Senior Prom which is on Friday May 12<sup>th</sup>. We appreciate all of the fundraising support this year which included the Quarter Auction and Greene Turtle night.



### News from the High School Social Studies Department:

Welcome to the second semester. We are busy preparing for the second half of the year and history day, if your child is interested please have the see Mrs. Higbee. Our 9th graders will be starting Geography for the rest of the school year. Our 10th graders will continue their journey in Economics. The 11th grade will be examining the World Wars and our AP class will continue to prepare for their test in May. The seniors will continue

to explore the world of Psychology and the history of the world.

### News from the High School Math Department:





## From the Office of the School Nurses

## Lice Lessons





Head lice are a common community problem. An estimated 6 to 12 million infestations occur each year in the US. Most infestations occur in children age 3 to 12 years old. Head lice are not dangerous and do not carry any diseases (unlike ticks). They are a nuisance bug that spread from head to head in the community setting.

Head lice are tiny, wiggling insects that must live close to a person's scalp to feed. An adult louse is the size of a sesame seed. Baby lice, or nymph's are smaller. Nits are the tear-shaped lice eggs that attach to the hair. Head lice crawl. They are mostly spread by head to head contact. For example, during a sleep over or at camp. Symptoms of head lice infestations are usually noticed after at least one month after infection. People will report itching, tickling feeling, or a crawling sensation on the scalp. Sometimes, redness can be seen on the scalp from lice either biting the person and scratch marks.

If you suspect your child has head lice, you should contact a health care professional. Your school nurse can be useful in identifying an infestation and can help guide your treatment plan. As part of the treatment plan, you will be guided to contact your child's medical provider for advice on medicated shampoo. Most head lice are now resistant to the available over the counter shampoos available for treatment and prescriptions are often necessary. Although shampoo's report that they will prevent the nits from hatching, this is unproven. The only way to be sure to break the cycle is to completely remove ALL nits from your child's hair.

Don't forget to treat your home! Carpets should be vacuumed. Bed linen, clothes, and towel should be washed and dried in hot temperatures daily while the infestation is active. Stuffed animals can be dried for at least 20 minutes in the drier or bagged for 2 weeks. Brushes, combs, hair clips, and hair bands should be thrown away or washed in hot soapy water.

Please remember if your child should be exposed to head lice... Don't worry or panic. They will not hurt your child. It just takes time to rid your child and home of the issue to stop the cycle. (NASN)

Just complete the form, have your student bring it into the Wellness Center and they can have their physical done right here at school.

Just go to the "Our District" tab, then "Offices", "School Health Services" and "Wellness Center". You will find a registration form at the bottom of the page. In addition to sports, school and employment physicals The Wellness Center provides a variety of medical, nutritional, educational and mental health services. Parents can select from a menu of services the services they would like their student to have access to when they complete the registration form. Students currently in 5<sup>th</sup> grade moving to 6th are eligible to become members of the Wellness Center as of July 1, 2016 and could have their physicals done any time after that. As noted above, The Wellness Center will be open limited hours during the summer months.

Tempted to connect to that "Free Wi-Fi" hotspot? It's worth doing your homework before selecting any network that's open or not familiar to you.

For example, if you're in a coffee shop or public library, make sure to verify the name of the network with staff.

It's fairly easy for someone who wants to intercept your data in a man-in-themiddle attack to set up a network called "Free Wi-Fi" or any other variation that includes a nearby venue name, to make you think it's a legitimate source.


You should also take the time to learn about the security settings for your mobile devices. Use these settings to prevent your phone or tablet from

automatically connecting to any Wi-Fi within range. Opt instead to manually connect only after viewing Wi-Fi options and approving.

### Tis for Safer Wi-Fi

There is no way to guarantee absolute security while using public free Wi-Fi, but there are some steps you can take to lessen exposure of your personal information while on a public network.

- \* Never conduct banking, bill payment or direct online shopping on a free Wi-Fi network
- If you are connecting via Windows, make sure to turn off file sharing and mark the Wi-Fi connection as a public network. You can find this option in the Control Panel > Network and Sharing Center > Change Advanced Sharing Settings. Under the Public heading, turn off file sharing. You may also want to turn on the Windows Firewall when connecting to a public network if it's not already activated. These settings are also found in Control Panel > Windows Firewall.
- On Mac, open up System Preferences and navigate to the Sharing icon. Then, uncheck the box next to File Sharing. You can also turn on the firewall within OSX by heading to System Preferences, Security & Privacy and click the Firewall tab.
