

## ONLINE RESOURCES– WOMEN’S HISTORY MONTH

The following web sites may provide research information for students and lesson plan ideas to develop instructional activities for **Women’s History Month**. Using the media center online catalog Destiny, a keyword search will allow you to locate resources in the UGHS media center. The Media Center Online Catalog can be assessed at UGHS from the desk top of any computer and by visiting the media center website. In addition, students have access to the [GALILEO](#) Database. GALILEO stands for GeorgiA Library LEarning Online, an initiative of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia. [GALILEO](#) is an online library offering information that isn’t available through free search engines or Web directories. Other resources include encyclopedias, business directories, and government publications.
