

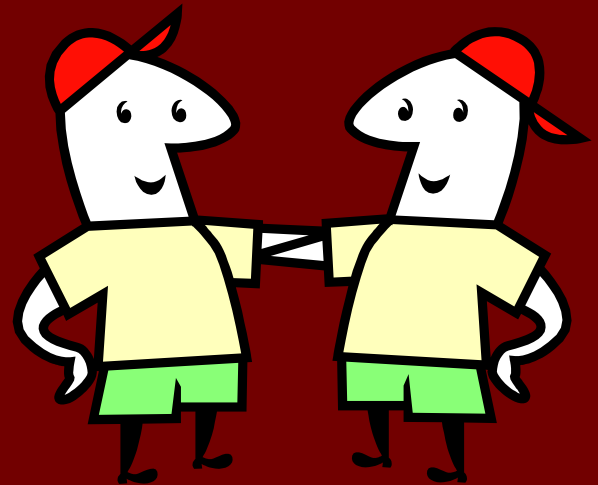

- Bonus: universal = applicable everywhere or in all cases

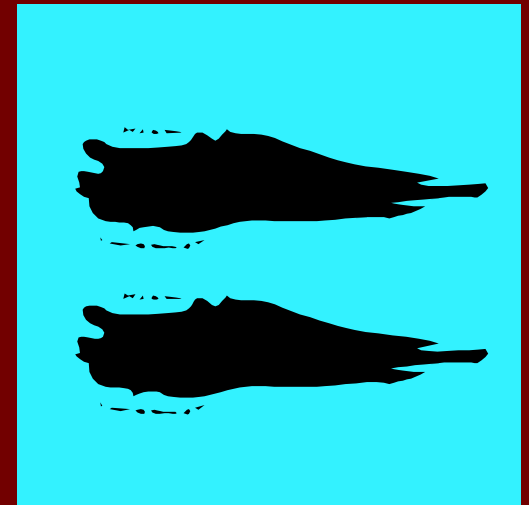
UNANIMOUS

- Synonym: corruption
- Antonym: morality



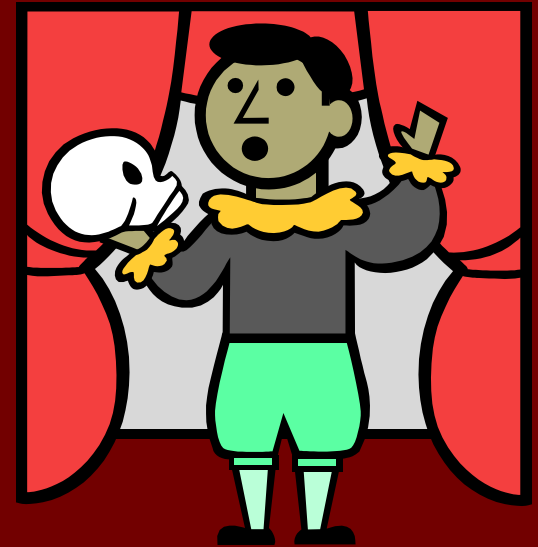
mono
