Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program Florida Academic Scholarship (FAS) / Florida Medallion Scholarship (FMS) 2020-21

Initial Eligibility Requirements: (As determined by the Department of Education)

- 1. Submit the Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) no later than August 31 after high school graduation,
- 2. Complete the 16 college-preparatory courses required for admission to a state university,
- 3. Achieve the required weighted GPA in the 16 college-preparatory courses per chart below,
- 4. Complete the required number of service hours per chart below, and
- 5. Achieve the required composite ACT or combined SAT score per chart below.

Requirements to Receive an Award: (As determined by the postsecondary institution)

- 1. Evaluated by Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) as meeting the initial eligibility requirements
- 2. Graduated with a standard high school diploma or its equivalent
- 3. Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible noncitizen
- 4. Enroll as a degree- or certificate-seeking student at a Florida institution in at least 6 non-remedial semester credit hours

Renewal Requirements: (As determined by grade and hours submitted by the postsecondary institution)

- 1. Students must earn the number of credit hours based on the student's enrollment type per term, and
- 2. The renewal cumulative GPA requirements are outlined in the table below.


A Bright Futures Scholarship is a smart way to make paying for college more affordable.

The evaluation is based on information provided by your school district and the Florida Department of Education. It shows you exactly which Bright Futures Scholarship requirements you've already satisfied, and those you still need to complete.

BRIGHT FUTURES EVALUATION

The FloridaShines Bright Futures Scholarship Eligibility Evaluation measures a student's progress toward meeting the requirements of a Bright Futures Scholarship. Scholarship amounts vary based on GPA, college entrance exam scores, community service hours, and other factors. The evaluation is based on information received from the student's school district and the Florida Department of Education. Any public high school student may use this free online evaluation.

To get started:

- 1. Go to www.FloridaShines.org
- 2. Under the "Go to College" icon, select "Pay for College"
- 3. Follow the information for Bright Futures Scholarships
- When prompted, log in with the school district, student's last name, and the Student Identifier Number (SIN). The SIN may be a 10-digit number assigned by the school or the student's SSN, followed by an X (e.g., 123456789X).
- Once logged in, simply choose a scholarship level (e.g., Florida Medallion Scholars) from the "My Progress" section to display an evaluation of eligibility for that scholarship level.


On the right is a quick guide to interpreting the evaluation results. Students are encouraged to verify the results of the evaluation with their high school's Guidance office.

TO LEARN MORE ABOUT BRIGHT FUTURES AND HOW TO APPLY

There are three levels of Bright Futures Scholarships available: Florida Academic Scholars (FAS), Florida Medallion Scholars (FMS), and Gold Seal Vocational Scholars (GSV). Requirements for each scholarship level vary. For eligibility requirements, refer to the "Bright Futures Student Handbook," available online from the Florida Department of Education's Office of Student Financial Assistance (OSFA) at www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org/ssfad/bf/



INTERPRETING THE EVALUATION RESULTS



The Course Requirements section lists total credit hours required for each subject area, credit hours that have been completed by the student, and any missing/remaining credits required for eligibility. The requirements listed in this section vary based on the scholarship level selected.


The GPA Requirements section lists the minimum weighted GPA required for the scholarship level selected. The student's weighted GPA, as calculated by Bright Futures, is also displayed.



The Vocational GPA
Requirements section
applies only to the Gold
Seal Vocational Scholars
(GSV) scholarship. It lists
the minimum unweighted



GPA required for GSV eligibility, along with the student's unweighted GPA, as calculated by Bright Futures.



The **Test Scores** section displays the students highest score in each subject area, as reported by ACT, SAT, and/or other testing source. Results for each subject area may originate from different test dates.

The Summary of Missing Achievements section lists any eligibility requirements still needed by the student for the scholarship level selected.

The Courses Taken section is a chronological list of all courses taken and grades earned. Not all courses may be used in the evaluation. The "Subject Area" column identifies where the course was applied on the evaluation. Subject Area is coded on the transcript by the school.
