Yearbook Course Syllabus Laura Parkerson

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Prerequisite: Honors or teacher recommendation (not a recommended course for a 9th grade student; because of the transition from middle to high school, the increased responsibility level may become overwhelming)

I. Expectations:

- A. Discipline Students must follow school rules as outlined in the Thomas County Central High School Handbook and *Code of Conduct*. Following classroom rules is required in order to maintain a positive learning environment.
- B. Attendance Students must follow the school attendance policy. Excessive or unexcused absences will not be tolerated.
- C. Homework- Both daily and long-term assignments will be given and must be submitted when due.
- D. Grading- Grading will conform to the Thomas County Schools Grading System as noted in the student handbook. Grades will be determined by the quality of work and the timeliness of completion. E. Additional Requirements and Consequences:
- 1. Students need a 3-ring binder (not a spiral), blue or black ink pen, planner/calendar, and notepad for interviews. Students must have the necessary material to complete assignments.
- 2. Because of the cost factor involved, all deadlines must be met.
- 3. Ad Sales are a vital part of the yearbook class and production; therefore, involvement in ad sales is expected from all staff members. Efforts in ad sales will be reflected as a portion of the student's first semester grade. Color ad prices: \$275 Full page, \$175 Half page

Black and White ad prices: \$175 Full page, \$115 Half page \$75 Quarter \$50 Eighth

All sales contracts must be complete and money turned in by deadline given in advance.

- 4. Fundraisers are also a vital part of the course and production. Students will be expected to attend and participate in any and all fundraisers. Ad sales are considered a fundraiser.
- 5. Lunch, after school, and weekend work will be expected of a student if that student has a deadline to meet.
