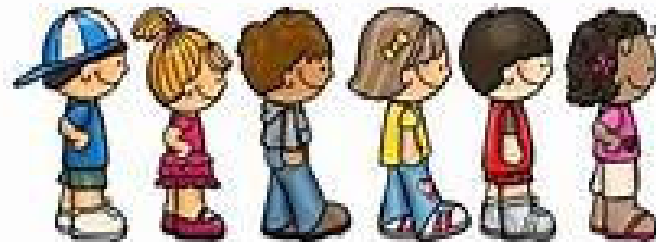


Handwashing in Line

Put your name on your water bottle.

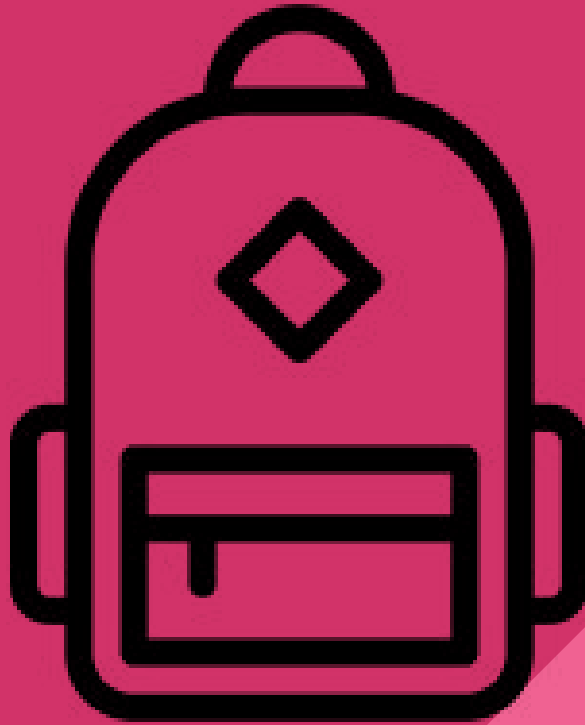
Put your water bottle in the back window. You may take it home each day, or leave it at school.

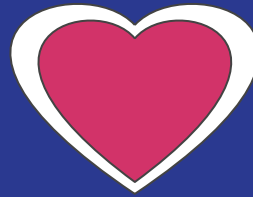






Dismissal

Grown ups who are picking up students can wait in the grass area in front of the school. I will walk students through the gate closest to my classroom, to the front of the school, where you can drive through or walk up to pick them up.

Bussers will be dismissed first.

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 schooldays, and Student C will have read for 3.
