## Phonemic Awareness, Word Recognition and Fluency

- 2.1.3 Blend phonemes (sounds) of letters and syllables to read unknown words with one or more syllables.
- 2.1.8 Demonstrate a growing stock of sight words.
- 2.1.9 Read text using fluid and automatic decoding skills.

### Acquisition of Vocabulary

- 2.2.1 Use knowledge of word order and in-sentence context clues to support word identification and to define unknown words while reading.
- 2.2.2 Identify words that have similar meanings (synonyms) and words that have opposite meanings (antonyms).
- 2.2.4 Read accurately high-frequency sight words.
- 2.2.8 Determine the meaning of prefixes, including un-, re-, pre- and suffixes -er, -est, -ful, -less.
- 2.2.9 Use root words (smile) and their various inflections (smiles, smiling) to determine meaning of words.

## Reading Process

- 2.3.4 Summarize text by recalling main ideas and some supporting details.
- 2.3.5 Create and use graphic organizers, such as Venn diagrams and webs, to demonstrate comprehension.
- 2.3.6 Answer literal, inferential and evaluative questions to demonstrate comprehension of grade-appropriate print texts.
- 2.3.7 Monitor comprehension by recognizing when text does not make sense and look back or read on to reinforce comprehension.

## Reading Application: Informational Text

- 2.4.2 Arrange events from informational text in sequential order.
- 2.4.3 List questions about essential elements from informational text (why, who, where, what, when, how) & identify answers.
- 2.4.5 Identify information in diagrams, charts, graphs and maps.
- 2.4.6 Analyze a set of directions for proper sequencing.

- 2.5.2 Describe characters and setting.

# Writing Processes

- 2.6.2 Develop a main idea for writing.
- 2.6.4 Use organizational strategies (e.g., brainstorming, lists, webs and Venn diagrams) to plan writing.
- 2.6.5 Organize writing with a developed beginning, middle and end.
- 2.6.6 Use a range of complete sentences, including declarative, interrogative and exclamatory.

# **Writing Applications**

## **Writing Conventions**
