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Directions for...

"All About Me"

Read a Story about Back to school, such as "I am Too Absolutely Small for School," by Lauren Child, or "First Grade Jitters," by Julie Danneberg, or "Froggy Goes to School," by Jonathan London.

As a class, discuss what the students will be filling in on the page. Review the spelling of the school name. If your students are early learners and your school name is very long, you may wish to fill in that spot by hand before photocopying the sheet.

"This is Me"

Encourage students to draw a picture of themselves as they really look today (hair color, clothing color, etc.) If possible, provide small mirrors for the students to look at themselves!

"My Favorite Things"

Have a chart prepared that has several topics for "favorite things", such as animals, food, colors, sports. Give students the opportunity to "pair share" their favorites of each of those. To do a pair share they turn to a partner and take turns sharing their answer. After a few moments, redirect the attention back to you, and have several partners share what the other person said. This can ensure that the partners actually listen to each other. Write down those examples on the chart.

Directions for... "Name sorting"

Early Learners:

Have students first circle the letters in their name before they cut. Then they glue those circled letters in the left column. When their name letters are complete, they glue the remaining letters in the right column.

Advanced Option:

Option A: Paste the letters in each column in alphabetical order

Option B: Paste the letters divided by consonants and vowels in each column. Have them glue the vowels on top and the consonants below, as in this example:


Directions for...

“All About My Teacher”

Whole Group: Gather students at your meeting place. Have chart paper set up with teacher's name at the top and divide it into four rectangles like the student page.

Go over the four “about the teacher” sections.

1. Ask students to describe some of your characteristics such as hair length and color, glasses, clothing. Show a simple way to draw the head and shoulders.



2. Ask students to think about their favorite animal. Turn and ask two neighbors what their favorite/favourite animal is. Share with the class what yours is, and draw it simply on the chart.
3. Tell the students a bit about your love for books and reading. Have your favorite book available. Show the cover of the book and tell a little bit about the book. Draw a simple picture that represents the book. Write the title in the circle as well. You might want to plan to read that book to them.
4. Talk about the wide variety of subjects your students will be studying this year. Tell what your favorite subject is. Draw a simple picture to represent your favorite subject.

Seatwork:

Students complete the “All About My Teacher page, using the chart as a guide.

(Alternate pages with British spelling are available in the appendix)

Directions for...

“My First Week”

At some point each day (right after lunch, for example) have the students draw or write about one thing that they did at school that day.

Included are three versions: one with 5 days, one with 4 days, and one unlabelled. (Many schools start with a four-day week). There is also a writing page to do at the end of the week as a reflection on the week as a whole. Choose which works for you!

“My School Goals”

Discuss activities and skills that your students are really good at. Complete sentences on chart paper or on a white board with “expert statements.” For example, “Jocelyn is an expert at drawing.” “Ben is an expert at dancing.”

Next, make a class brainstorm chart about things that the students would like to get better at during the school year. Have each student complete the student sheet. A word bank of suggested goals is provided on the sheet.

Directions for...

“I Know Numbers”

Have students match the number to the pictures. Photocopy the two pages back to back. Keep for your records as a sample of beginning of the year number sense or send home in packet.

“I Write Numbers”

Have students print each number with finger spacing in between. Keep for your records as a sample of beginning of the year number printing, or send home in packet.

“I Know Colors”

Ask students if they have a favorite color. Have each student go back to their table/desk and find a crayon in their favorite color. Sort the students by favorite colors. Have students color a square in their favorite color and make a graph.

Make charts labeled Red is.... Blue is.... Yellow is.... Etc. Brainstorm objects that are those colors. Keep charts up as anchor charts for the first weeks of school.

Have students color in the labelled crayon worksheet with the appropriate colors.

Demonstrate how to complete a color-by-numbers worksheet. Refer students to anchor charts for help reading the color words.

Alternate pages with the British spelling of “colours” instead of “colors” is available in the appendix.

Directions for...

“I Know Letters”

Play a phonemic awareness game using flash cards from your classroom or from the end of this packet. Show three cards, two beginning with the same letter, and one that starts with a different letter. Have students find the card that doesn't belong. This can be done individually or in small groups (for assessment purposes), or as a whole-class activity using a pocket chart.

Give each child a copy of the “I know Letters” page. Demonstrate how to cut and paste the initial consonant squares out and glue onto appropriate spot. To complete, they print the initial consonant at the beginning of each word.

“I print Letters”

Have students print each letter on the line several times, using finger spaces. Next they color the pictures and trace the letters at the bottom of the page. Keep for your records as a sample of beginning of the year letter printing, or send home in packet. Do one page per day.

“I can Draw and I can write”

Have students write and/or draw themselves doing something they enjoy. Keep for your records as a sample of beginning of the year writing/drawing, or send home in packet.

Directions for...

“About My Summer”

Talk about summer activities across a wide range. For example, talk about going to the library, swimming in a pool, going through the sprinkler, playing games, etc. in addition to more “extravagant” activities like camping, trips, etc. Have students share some of their summer activities, and then complete a drawing or writing response page

“Ready For School”

Choose the mini booklet that works best for your students. Fold the page in half lengthwise and then again to make a mini book with cover and three pages. Students complete the book and take it home. If you are printing all of the pages in this download into a packet, do not include this page, as it needs folding to be formatted correctly.

cover pages

Choose the cover page that works for you. You might choose to either make this packet up before school starts and have the students complete the pages while already assembled. If you are doing this, ensure that you do not include the Ready for School folding booklet or the letters for name sorting in the packet. Alternately, you might want to hand out individual pages as you need them and then collate them at the end.

Directions for...

“cut and paste puzzles”

Each student will need the puzzle page as well as either a blank piece of paper or the grid that is provided. Students should solve the puzzle, and then glue the pieces onto the second paper. The provided grid contains a clue piece for the middle to help in case the puzzle is too difficult for some students.

“word search”

Students will read the provided words, and then attempt to find the hidden words in the word search. This can be a difficult concept, so students may want to work together, or you can do this as a whole class activity.

“ word scrambles”

Students will unscramble the words and print them correctly. This can be a difficult activity for early readers, so students may want to work together, or you can do this as a whole class activity.

Directions for...

“Best Book”

This activity works best if you do it near the end of your first week of school, or at a point in time where you have already read a variety of books. Before the students begin, you should brainstorm the books you have read, and write the titles on the white board or on a chart. You could have students “vote” for the book they liked the best by placing a sticky note with their name under the book title. Alternately, you can simply place the books on a table, and have students vote by placing their name card or token near their preferred book. After this warm up, demonstrate the writing portion of the activity and have the students complete their own page.

“Weather Journal”

Choose the page that works best for you. Some schools have a 4 day week for their first week of school and some have 5 days. You can also use these pages beyond the first week of school if you prefer. This activity will work well as part of a morning routine.

“Show What You Know”

Math assessment

Do some oral counting practice with your students starting at 1 and going as high as the majority of your students are capable of doing (this varies according to the grade level and group). Next do some basic skip counting (by 10's, 5's and 2's, again, only as much as your students can manage).

There are three levels of this basic math assessment. Choose the one that works best for you, or use all three, starting with the one easiest one, which is labeled with an “a”. Teach the students how to complete each section of the assessment. Alternately, you could do this in small groups and make your assessments based off of the observations you make, and noting the assistance that each child needs.

Directions for...

“Even and Odd”

After teaching/review the concept of even and odd, present your students with this page to complete. Ensure that you have an anchor chart or example with the coordinating colors available for your students to see. If you know that your students will not be ready to complete this task, you can save it for later in the year! When you use this page, it can be helpful to provide the students with counters that they can use to make “equal shares” to determine odd/even.

“Making 10”

Discuss the meaning of “making 10”. Discuss that they will need to determine how many more they would need to add to the ten frame in order to come to the sum of 10. Demonstrate with large ten frames. You can also use the provided blank 10 frames to have students use manipulatives to show the complements of 10.

“Missing Numbers”

Play a missing number game using number cards or a numbers to 100 pocket chart. Turn over a few numbers, and have students guess which numbers are missing. Alternately, write a few sequences of numbers on the whiteboard, leaving out a few. Choose several students to come up to the board to write the missing numbers. Then present the practice page and have students complete it independently or in partners.

Directions for...

“All About Me” Boom Deck

This is an All About Me deck where students can answer questions about themselves. There are no wrong answers. This interactive deck will help familiarize students with the drag and drop function as well as the next/submit button. The directions are written out on each slide, and there are audio directions available to students if they wish to click on the icon.

The final slide is completely open-ended, so students can spend as much time as they like customizing a beach scene.

Please note, because Boom is not a survey tool, teachers will not be able to see what each child answered on the slides, but the children will enjoy a deck with no pressure! This is a perfect deck to assign during the first week(s) of school, either with face-to-face instruction, or for distance learning.

How do I use this Boom deck?

At the end of this PDF you will find a download link along with basic instructions for accessing the Boom platform. You will click the link from within the PDF to add the deck to your Boom library (if you do not already have an account, you will be prompted to set up a free one).

Important Information from Boom Learning:

To use Boom Cards, you must be connected to the Internet. Boom Cards play on modern browsers (Chrome, Safari, Firefox, and Edge). Apps are available for Android, iPads, iPhones, and Kindle Fires. For security and privacy, adults must have a Boom Learning account to use and assign Boom Cards. You will be able to assign the Boom Cards you are buying with “Fast Pins,” (play provides instant feedback for self-grading Boom Cards). Fast Play is always a free way for students to engage with Boom Cards decks.
