We will work on building our repertoire of texts throughout the year, but we would like you to begin by choosing a text from the list below and completing a Major Works Data Sheet (MWDS) or a one-pager. On the first day of school, hard copies of these documents will be provided as this work MUST be submitted in hard copy. If you would prefer to complete over the summer, access to digital copies is available via the AP Lit Google Classroom (code: 4tnym5a). (Work can be typed but must be printed for submission.)

Although this assignment will not be due until **Friday**, **September 20th**, the start of the school year (especially for seniors) is always hectic, so we are suggesting that you use time over the summer to begin this assignment by selecting and reading a book from the list below.

When we return to school, we will offer you the opportunity to ask any questions or get any help you need. Then, on September 20th, you will use your MWDS or one-pager to write an in-class essay responding to a FRQ 3 prompt. Your assignment and essay will then be collected and assessed. (Therefore, Al and CliffsNotes/Sparknotes will only get you so far. You need to read!)
