Subject: Chariho State Aid; Housing Aid Application Process FY23

The Rhode Island Department of Education (RIDE) requires all school departments requesting state housing aid follow a four step process every (5) years to secure housing aid reimbursement rates (Chariho = 61%). The FY23 Chariho capital budget is proposed in section 6 and a draft, unapproved 5 year capital plan was established during the last RIDE Housing Aid process.

This stage I submission dated February 17, 2020 has expired and a new and updated submission is required by February 15, 2022. Chariho currently has a \$500K emergency funding approval.

Chariho has much of the information required in the Stage I checklist, and in particular item #3 Capital Facilities Improvement Plan highlights the need to secure this funding source. At present the major school deferred maintenance needs anticipated in the next 3-5 years are:

- CTC roof replacement, \$1.5 million
- CHS electrical and deferred maintenance, \$0.5 million
- CMS deferred maintenance, windows, HVAC, flooring, \$1.5 million
- Richmond Elementary pavement, site work, deferred maintenance, lavatories, \$2 million
- Ashaway Elementary elevator, pavement, septic, play areas, site work, \$1.5 million
- Charlestown Elementary pavement, electrical, deferred maintenance, \$1.7 million
- Hope Valley Elementary electrical, elevator, septic, deferred maintenance, \$1.3 million

Total minimum deferred maintenance need: \$10 million

The five year capital plan draft also has HVAC improvements that require further review and assessment and are not included in the totals above. Anticipating at least a 61% reimbursement rate the impact to Chariho is roughly \$750K/year to maintain existing facilities. Bonuses are available for health and safety items as well as other incentives per legislative and RIDE authorizations and may increase this reimbursement percentage.

I recommend approval of an agreement with our owner's representative, Colliers International, for a Fee for Service price of \$22,500(attached) and approval to submit a Stage I application to RIDE to protect future reimbursement opportunity. This cost is budgeted in capital funds as part of the FY22 owner's representative services for capital improvements.
