

What was the Inquisition?


- •It's sole purpose was to extract confessions from heretics.

Tomas Torquemada


- Grand Inquisitor

- Ejected all unbaptized Jews from Spain.






If the subject wouldn't confess...

A Brank for the Lovely Lady


· Take a brankmedieval torture device which would prohibit one from speaking.

La Garrucha




Drop the big boot!

Assorted Torture Devices



















Crackles or the Inquisitors.

Effects?
