One Point Perspective Comic Inspired Word Collage



Students will create a collage incorporating one point perspective inspired by class comics



Collage – "a piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing"

Materials

4 different types of paper

- When your resources are limited be creative!
 - ✓ junk mail flyers, coupons
 - ✓ magazines
 - ✓ newspaper
 - \checkmark cardboard
 - ✓ gift wrap
 - ✓ tissue paper
 - ✓ "clean" trash
 - $\checkmark\,$ construction paper
 - ✓ cardstock
 - \checkmark shoe box
 - ✓ bubble wrap

Scissors

Glue

Black Sharpie – the super common one fine point (or other marker)


Pencil/ eraser

Ruler or cardboard straight edge

To create the collage you must be able to accurately draw using one point so ... practice first – following the assignments in the Thursday folder



One Point Perspective Comic Inspired Word Collage

Your collage will consist of 4 layers

- Top Layer Comic Inspired Word Conveying sound drawn in ONE POINT PERSPECTIVE
- 2ND AND 3RD LAYERS shapes that help accentuate that sound-word
- A rectangle sheet to hold it all together and balance your composition
- **from the papers you gathered decide which one will be designated for each layer
- The words should be on a plain color paper the other 3 are your choice



- Check my comments the "1 Pt. Comic Style Word" Assignment in Schoology
- You can do this by clicking on the "grades" tab in our class on Schoology
- 3. Draw the word in block style letters
- Follow the same steps as yesterday
- All letters should be capital and drawn with a ruler!
- The face (or front of the letter) should not touch but the sides (the converging lines can touch)
- 4. Place the vanishing point in the same position as your practice
- 5. Draw converging lines and the back of the letter

*message me if you are having trouble with this - we can set up a Zoom meeting

- Trace over your pencil with a sharpie use a ruler (or straight edge) to trace – do not try to "free hand" it
- Cut out the whole shape it's okay if your word is more that one piece



- 8. Think about what kind of shapes would help accentuate your word
 like the artist's did in the examples to the right
- Use your 2nd and 3rd type of paper. Cut out a comic style shape (like the ones at the right) to help convey the meaning of your word
 - The 2nd shape should be smaller than the 3rd so that all of your layers will be at least partially visible
- 10. Outline he shapes with a marker (like the example below I understand that you probably don't have metallic markers)






11. cut out small pieces of cardboard to glue to each of you layers (except the bottom – 4th layer)
*glue them carefully so that they do not show on the "good" side

*We want the collage to pop off the page

12. Move the pieces around until you have the placement that you are happy with – where it looks neat and thought out and where all layers are visible

13. Glue the cardboard tabs to the layer underneath



Rubric - One Point Perspective Comic Inspired Word Collage 25 points Due Monday, 11/9

- The Comic-Inspired Word is accurately drawn using one point perspective (one vanishing point, curves and right angles draw to that vp, back of the letters drawn correctly (10 points)
- The collage consists of 4 layers with 2 layers cut out in "comic style" shapes that help convey the meaning of your sound-word (5 points)
- 3. The shapes have been outlined with a marker further demonstrating the comic style. Lifts have been placed under each layer to help the collage "pop" (5 points)
- 4. Effort and Craftsmanship the pieces are neatly cut out, the marker lines are straight and not "wavy". The cardboard lifts are hidden so that they are not showing on the final view of the collage. You tried to meet the objectives to the best of your ability (5 points)
