Opening: Hook your audience!

Read a quote from the book, ask a question of your audience, describe the main character, or vividly set the scene.

Don't forget to share the author and title.

Summary

Provide a summary that introduces the main character, identifies the conflict, and leads us toward the solution – without giving away the ending.

Impression

How did you feel about the book?
Would you recommend it to others?
What would you rate it? Why? (Give reasons.)

Closing: Entice your audience!

Read a quote from the book, use a cliffhanger, or excite your audience about reading this for their quarter 2 assignment.

Summary restates the events of the novel in your own words without adding opinion. It includes multiple key details, events, or quotes from the story to guide the explanation of events.	I can compose an objective summary stating the key points of the text without adding my own opinion or feelings (until the conclusion).	Summary emphasizes opinion and lacks evidence from the story.
Student evaluation of the novel is supported with reasons, evidence, and explanation.	I can develop the topic to evaluate the book and who would enjoy reading it by providing relevant facts, concrete details, or explanation.	The novel is evaluated with a rating system, but no suggestion of who would enjoy the text or might want to consider reading.
Introduction captures attention of the audience and guides the viewer to the rest of the presentation. Includes author & title. Conclusion successfully wraps up the book talk and promotes further reading.	I can provide an engaging introduction and concluding statement that supports the information or explanation presented.	Introduction jumps directly into the topic without a hook to draw your audience. Author or title are missing. Conclusion wraps up abruptly or is forgotten.
Media/visual is easy to read and clearly organized. Text, font, & images support the message and demonstrate an awareness of audience in the presentation.	I can clarify information using media component or visual display.	Media/visual needs to be more effectively used to convey your message. Text might be too small. Font might be difficult to read. Image might not be associated with topic or difficult to connect. Appears to be put together without considering audience.

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
