
Third Grade Summer Reading Assignment 2015 Tic Tac Toe Choice Board

Create a poster about one insect from your book or the attached information.


You may use or illustrate at least 2 pictures of the insect, and record at least 5 facts. Make sure to label each part of the insect.

Write a letter convincing another third grader to read this book. Include interesting facts that you learned. Use the letter format attached to help you do your pest work.




Words, Words, Words!
