Annual Open House scheduled for August 11

The Odessa R-VII School District will host its eleventh annual Open House on August 11 from 4pm-7pm. The districtwide event is held to help parents and students prepare for the first day of school on August 16.

Students and parents have the opportunity to locate classrooms, meet teachers, drop off school supplies, check out lockers and combinations, confirm class schedules and ask any last-minute questions during the open house.

Transportation personnel will be present to answer questions regarding busing schedules, numbers, etc. All health rooms will be open, and a health aide will be available to accept medications for storage before the school year begins.

The District hosts the annual event to ease any worries or apprehensions students or parents may have about starting a new school year.

Registration Requirements

A child must be five (5) years old before August 1, 2011 to enroll in Odessa schools. No student will be allowed to enter school without updated immunizations in accordance with Missouri state laws.

Student fees or fines owed from the previous school year must be paid prior to enrollment. Secondary students participating in athletics must have a completed physical form on file before participation will be allowed. Each school office has forms available.

All students new to the district are required, at the time of registration, to provide the following information:

- Updated immunization records
- Birth certificate
- Social Security number
- Proof of residency
- Previous school's name, address and telephone number
- Any school records at home
- Current address and telephone number, as well as parents' work telephone numbers and other emergency information.

Odessa R-VII Board of Education

Popular control of public education is one of the cornerstones of a free society. The people exercise that control through their Board of Education. The following information briefly describes the workings of the Odessa R-VII School District Board of Education.

The Board is composed of seven citizens elected to serve overlapping terms of three years each. These Board Members are: Board President Aaron Dillon, Board Vice President Brian Young, and Board Members Mike Alumbaugh, John King, Brian Madsen, Ronnie Steelman, and Tim Wulfekotter. At the end of a term, a Board

Member wishing to continue unsalaried service to the community must be reelected to an additional three-year term. State law does not limit the number of terms a member may serve. Voting for school board positions takes place on the first Tuesday in April.

The Superintendent of Schools is appointed by the Board of Education and acts as its executive officer in administering the Board's policies in the operations of the schools. The Superintendent for the Odessa R-VII School District is Robert C. Brinkley. Mr. Brinkley acts as advisor in keeping the Board informed of the needs and progress of the schools. He is available to the Board as a professional resource, and is expected to provide the Board with background information and recommendations regarding issues that require Board action.

The Board meets regularly on the second Tuesday of each month in the Library/Media Center at Odessa High School. Meetings are called to order at 7:00 pm and follow an agenda prepared by

Mr. Brinkley and Board President, Aaron Dillon. Patrons may request to have items placed on the agenda by presenting a written request to the central office one week before the regular Board meeting. When speaking to the Board, patrons shall give his/her name, address and the group, if any, that is being represented. Presentations should be as brief as possible and shall be limited to five minutes unless a time extension is granted. The Board will not hear personal complaints of school

personnel nor against any person connected with the school system.

The Board's function is to make decisions. Residents are encouraged to first contact the administrator closest to a situation for questions before contacting the Superintendent of Schools.

When an item of business comes before the Board in the form of a motion, it is necessary that a majority of votes be cast in favor of the motion for the Board to act. Members of the Board do not have authority to act independently as individuals in official matters. The Board has complete and final control over local school matters only to limitation by federal and state law, regulations of the state and the will of local residents as expressed in district elections.

State law provides that all meetings of governmental bodies shall be open sessions unless a closed session is expressly permitted by law. Closed sessions are normally held to discuss student and personnel matters. A governmental body may hold a closed session only by an affirmative public vote of a majority of members present at the meetings and only to the extent a closed session meets the guidelines established by statute.

The District encourages its patrons to attend future meetings of the Board of Education. Continued interest and support helps ensure that educational opportunities will continue to expand and improve.

Activity Passes To Go On Sale

Odessa Bulldogs Activity Passes will be available for the 2011-12 activity seasons. Bulldog Activity Passes may be used for admission into all home regular season games, contests and performances. This includes varsity and lower level games. Bulldog Activity Passes may not be used for Odessa hosted tournaments, away contests or MSHSAA activities. There are three options of passes:

FAMILY PASS: These may be purchased for \$100 and may be used for admission for one household. All family members receiving admission for this MUST live IN the household.

SINGLE ADULT SEASON PASS:

These may be purchased for \$75 and may be used only by the adult who has purchased the pass.

STUDENT SEASON PASS: These may be purchased for \$25 and may be used only by the Odessa School District student grades K-12 who has purchased the pass.

Safety Lessons and Reminders for Back to School Time

It's "that" time of year again when students are preparing to return to school. Most attention goes to school supplies and new outfits, but school safety should also be considered in new school year preparations. A little bit of planning can help everyone have a more pleasant and safer experience for the entire school year and beyond.

Safety can no longer be assumed as a given characteristic to the school environment. As the students head back to school, it is important to take this opportunity to address important issues and take steps to establish a climate where students and teachers can perform to the best of their abilities. The following are a few guidelines for a safe school year:

Before school begins...

- Check student records at school.
 - Is your contact information correct?
 - Do they have your work and cell phone number?
 - Do you have alternate contacts in case you cannot be reached?
 - Are your student's medical records up-to-date, including allergies and current medications?
- Review with your student what will happen in an emergency.
 - Where will students be located?
 - When and where will parents reunite with children?

Before leaving home...

- Identification
 - Ensure that your student has identification with them that includes
 emergency contact information such
 as work numbers and cell phone
 numbers.
- · Secret Password
 - Create a password that only your family members know. Anyone who picks up the child has to know the password. Remind them to never get in a stranger's car.
- Information sharing
 - Discuss with students the importance of sharing information. Stress to them that if they hear students

- talking about being destructive or hurting someone, that it is OK to tell a trusted adult - parent, teacher, counselor, law enforcement officer, principal.
- Safest Route Plan with your student the safest route to walk or bike. Practice the route several times reminding them how to safely cross streets and what to do when they come to an intersection.
- Clothing If your student must walk or bike to or from school or stand at the bus stop, be sure that they wear light clothing or clothing with reflective stripes.
- Bus Stop
 - Discuss with your student the importance of walking directly to and from the bus stop. No horseplay.
 - Do not allow your student to be at bus stop alone. They should go with a parent or buddy.
 - Remind them not to talk to strangers.

Violence Prevention...

- Know where your kids are, what they are doing, and who they are with at all times
- Build a good relationship with your child through good communication.
 Encourage talk and be attentive. Talk about school daily.
- Communicate clearly on the violence issue. Explain that you don't accept and won't tolerate violent behavior.
 Teach children how to reduce their risk of being victims of crime.
- Settle your own conflicts peaceably and manage anger without violence.
 Help your children learn nonviolent ways to handle frustration, anger, and conflict.
- Take an active role in your children's schools. Talk regularly with teachers and staff.
- Set clear limits on behaviors in advance. Disciplining with framework and consistency helps teach self-discipline.

Great High School Experience Starts with Freshman Orientation

To ensure the start of a great high school experience and a successful completion of the next four years, incoming freshmen and their parents need to attend Freshman Orientation at OHS on August 9, 2011. This year's orientation will have a planned program from 5:30-7:30pm. The orientation will include a complete walk-through of the student's schedule, finding the student's locker, a meeting with the advisor assigned to each student for the next four years, and turning in paperwork required for students to attend the first day of school. Odessa School District Child Care Center

The Child Care Center provides care and developmental learning opportunities for children 6 weeks through preschool age. The center is housed on the McQuerry campus with a director and eight child care providers. Each staff member is trained in CPR and receives 12 training hours each year in child care education. The center uses Creative Curriculum in the classrooms, and sends home a progress/developmental report twice a year.

The location of the Child Care Center on the McQuerry campus provides extra opportunities for children preparing for kindergarten. Children 3-5 years old have many extra experiences: attend the

McQuerry Library once a week for story time and book check out, take a field trip at least once a year, sing at the nursing home, peer-mentors for the Early Childhood Special Education class in the building, participate in Grandparents' Day, put on a Holiday Program, participate in the preschool graduation, and much more!

The District's S.O.A.R. program can help ease that stress by providing a solution to that dilemma for area parents. S.O.A.R. (Student Opportunities for Activities and Recreation) is the District's school-age child care program where trained staff members care for children grades K-6 before and after school. It is located at the east end of the cafeteria in the McQuerry Elementary building located at 607 South Third Street.

The program is accredited by the Missouri Center for Accreditation of Early Childhood Education and School Age Child Care Programs. Its curriculum includes art, cooking, games, science, creativity, free-choice activities, music, manipulatives, reading, computer and dramatic play. District and School Policies Describe Parental Involvement for Title I Program

District Policy

Pursuant to federal law, the district and parents of children participating in the Title I Program will jointly develop and agree upon a written parental involvement policy. This policy will describe how the agency will accomplish the following:

- Involve parents in the joint development of the Title I Program plan, and in the process of reviewing the implementation of the plan, suggest improvements.
- Provide the coordination, technical assistance and other support necessary to aid participating schools in planning and implementing effective parental involvement activities to improve student academic achievement and school performance.
- Build the schools' and parents' capacity for strong parental
- Coordinate and integrate Title I parental involvement strategies with those of other education programs.
- Conduct, with the involvement of parents, an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of the parental involvement policy in improving the academic quality of the schools served, including identifying barriers to greater participation by parents in activities authorized by law, particularly by parents who are economically disadvantaged, have disabilities, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are of any racial or ethnic minority back-

- ground. The district will use the findings of such evaluation to design strategies for more effective parental involvement and to revise, if necessary, the parental involvement policies.
- Involve parents in the activities of the schools served.

School Policy

Each school receiving Title I funds will jointly develop with and distribute to parents of children participating in the Title I Program a written parental involvement policy agreed upon by such parents in accordance with the requirements of federal law.

- The policy must be made available to the local community, and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of parents and
- The policy shall contain a school-parent compact that outlines how parents, the entire school staff and students will share the responsibility of improved student academic achievement and the means by which the school and parents will build and develop a partnership to help children.
- Each school participating in the Title I Program will convene a meeting annually to inform parents about Title I and to involve parents in the planning, review and improvement of Title I programs, including the planning, review and improvement of the school parental involvement policy.

Complaint Resolution Procedure Outlined in 'No Child Left Behind' Program

This complaint resolution procedure applies to all programs administered by the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education under the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). A complaint is a formal allegation that a specific federal or state law or regulation has been violated, misapplied or misinterpreted by school district personnel or by Department of Education personnel.

Any parent or guardian, surrogate parent, teacher, administrator, school board member or other person directly involved with an activity, program or project operated under the general supervision of the Department may file a complaint. Such a complaint must be in writing and signed; it will provide specific details of the situation and indicate the law or regulation that is allegedly being violated, misapplied or misinterpreted.

The written, signed complaint must be

filed, and the resolution pursued in accordance with local district policy. If the issue cannot be resolved at the local level, the complainant may file a complaint with the Missouri Department of Education. If there is not evidence that the parties have attempted in good faith to resolve the complaint at the local level, the Department may require the parties to do so, and may provide technical assistance to facilitate such

Any persons directly affected by the actions of the Department may file a similarly written complaint if they believe state or federal laws or regulations have been violated, misapplied or misinterpreted by the Department itself.

Anyone wishing more information about this procedure or how complaints are resolved may contact local district or Department personnel.

Bulldog Alerts

Sign up for the Bulldog Alert and get important information about the Odessa R-VII schools sent as text messages directly to your mobile phone, wireless PDA or pager. Messages sent include information about school closings, early dismissals, school event reminders and emergency information.

Sign up is easy. Click on the Bulldog Alert button located on the district web page at www.odessa.k12.mo.us. Follow the simple two-step process then select the schools whose information you wish to receive. You may also select the Odessa R-VII Activity Updates category to receive schedule changes or updates for all Odessa R-VII school activities.

There is no sign-up fee, however, standard texting fees assessed by your wireless provider may apply. Your name and personal information are protected and will remain private.

Expectations for Student Bus Riders

Bus transportation is provided by the district to qualifying students. Students who do not obey the rules and/or do not obey the bus driver are subject to disciplinary action. Classroom behavior is expected on the school buses. A list of infractions and consequences follows:

Type I Infractions

- 1. Horseplay including pushing and
- 2. Excessive talking or noise either from individual students or between students or groups of students.
- 3. Opened beverage cans and/or eating food or candy on a school bus.
- 4. Failure to sit in an assigned seat.
- 5. Blocking the school bus aisle.
- 6. Out of assigned seat while bus is loading or unloading other students or while bus is in motion.
- 7. Students must be seated on bus with back touching seat backs. Turning around, sitting perpendicular to the seat, or sitting with feet or knees in the seat is not allowed.
- Throwing objects and/or littering.
- 9. Disrespectful action or language toward the bus driver, authorized adult on the school bus or another student.
- 10. Obscene language, innuendos or gestures.
- 11. Any other student behavior deemed to be a Type I Infraction by the district administration.

Type II Infractions

1. Throwing objects out of a moving school bus and/or hitting driver with object.

- Bullying or harassment.
- Vandalizing or tampering with equipment. (Restitution must be made before student will be allowed back onto the school bus.)
- 4. Failure to obey a request of a bus driver or other authorized adult on school bus.
- Fighting or assault.
- Use, possession, distribution or sale of tobacco and/or tobacco products or of an item represented to be tobacco or a tobacco product.
- Possession, sale, distribution, use or under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance or of an item represented to be alcohol or a controlled substance.
- Possession of a weapon or fireworks.
- Any other student behavior deemed to be a Type II Infraction by the district administration.

CONSEQUENCES Type I Infractions

First offense: Warning, conference with student and contact with parent either by telephone or written notice.

Second and more offenses: 1-3 day bus suspension, conference with parent either by telephone or written notice.

Type II Infractions

First offense: 5-day bus suspension, conference with student and contact with parent either by telephone or written notice.

Second offense: 5-day bus suspension, conference with student and contact with parent either by telephone or written notice.

Third offense: Recommendation of bus suspension for balance of semester/ school year.

After a student has accumulated more than 10 days of bus suspensions during one school year, the student will be recommended for a bus suspension for the balance of the semester/school year. Parents may appeal to Peter Rorvig, Assistant Superintendent.

Note: All Type I and Type II Infractions will accumulate for the entire school year. Depending on the infraction, administrators may impose consequences more severe than those listed above. Frequent and consistent misbehavior on school buses may lead to more serious consequences. Consequences may include expulsion or suspension from school, in-school suspension, detentions and referral to the proper legal authorities in addition to those consequences listed above for serious and/or consistent misbehavior. Bus suspensions assigned to students at the end of a school year may carry over to the beginning of the next school year.

Bus suspensions will not start until an administrator has contacted a parent either by telephone or written notice with the following exception: An attempt will be made to contact parents in a timely manner, however, a student whose conduct may endanger the safety of himself/herself or others on the school bus will not be allowed back on a school bus until a conference with parents has been held. If contact with a parent cannot be made, safety will take precedence.

Please be aware that a person commits the crime of trespassing on a school bus if he knowingly and unlawfully enters any part of or unlawfully operates any school bus. (569.155 RSMo.) ●

Apple Bus Company will announce the bus routes for the 2011-12 school year in The Odessan prior to the start of the school year.

Beginning August 2, 2011, patrons may call Apple Bus Company at 816-633-4055 for bus route information. (Call between 7am and 4pm)

2011-12 Transportation **Procedures and Policies**

Bus service is provided by the school district. Students who do not observe the rules, and/or do not obey the driver are subject to disciplinary action. Cameras have been placed on all buses to help ensure the security and safety of all bus riders.

Prior to loading:

- 1. Pupils must be on time! The bus cannot wait beyond its regular schedule for those who are tardy.
- 2. Bus riders should conduct themselves in a safe manner while waiting for the bus.
- 3. Bus riders should wait until the bus comes to a complete stop before attempting to board the bus. Riders should never stand in the roadway.
- 4. Pupils waiting for the bus on the opposite side of the road should not cross the road to board until the bus comes to a complete stop, and the bus driver motions to the students to cross the road.

After leaving the bus:

- 1. Students should cross the road, when necessary, at least 10 feet in front of the bus. Students should look to see that no traffic is approaching from either direction. Students should also wait for a signal from the bus driver before crossing. Students should never cross behind the bus.
- 2. Students should not run beside the bus or hang onto it in any way. CLEAR the bus path as soon as possible.

While on the bus:

- 1. The driver is in charge of pupils and the bus. Pupils must obey the driver promptly.
- 2. Unnecessary conversation with the driver is prohibited.
- 3. Classroom conduct is to be observed by the students while riding the bus.
- 4. Pupils should remain seated until the bus has fully stopped at its destination.
- 5. Pupils must not, at any time, extend arms or head out of the bus.
- 6. The use of tobacco, food or drink on the bus is prohibited. Animals and oversize objects, as well as glass containers, are prohibited.
- 7. Keep aisles and step-well clear at all times.
- 8. If a student willfully causes damage to a bus, the student will be charged for damages.

9. Students will be assigned seats by the bus driver.

Other transportation policies:

- 1. The district will abide by all state rules and regulations regarding bus transportation.
- 2. No student will be able to ride a different bus than the one he or she has been assigned. The only exception will be in an emergency, and it must be approved through the school office.
- 3. Students who ride a bus, and a bus goes by a babysitter's house may make arrangements to be dropped off at the babysitter's house, but it MUST be for every day.
- 4. The Apple Bus Company has a policy which indicates they will not go farther on the road than the last child's house who is to be picked up. If driveways are not suitable to turn the bus around, the child must catch the bus at the location where the bus can turn around. Buses will be required to come to a complete stop at their pick-up points, and do their utmost to be within five minutes of their pick-up time. Students will be picked up at their designated bus stop, and dropped off at the same. There will not be undesignated stops.
- 5. If your child has not boarded the bus three days in a row, you will need to contact Apple Bus Company to resume transportation services.
- 6. Please provide Apple Bus Company with current telephone numbers to enable us to reach you or a babysitter.
- 7. Kindergarten and young students only: If your child is not to get off the bus unless someone is available to receive him/her, Apple Bus Company must have this information on file. If no one is home to meet your child, telephone calls will be made to try and reach someone, or your child will be brought back to the bus lot.
- 8. Early childhood: The district requires that someone bring early childhood students to the bus stop, and meet students returning from school at the bus stop.
- 9. Please go over the bus rules with your child. We want to make sure each child has a safe ride, and we need your support to help us do this.
- 10. Bus routes will be posted in the newspaper before school starts, and are subject to change.

2011-12 Bus Schedule

The Odessa R-VII School District will continue the established bus schedules that include afternoon bus pick-ups at individual buildings every day of the school week:

MCQUERRY ELEMENTARY:

Parents should notify the office at McQuerry Elementary prior to 2:30pm of any dismissal changes for your child. It will be impossible to make any changes after the buses leave the school.

ODESSA UPPER ELEMENTARY:

Parents should notify the office at Odessa Upper Elementary prior to 2:15pm of any dismissal changes for your child. Information received after that time will not be dispersed. Bus dismissal begins at 2:35pm. Buses will load in front of the building, and car riders will load in the drive. Walkers and bicycle riders will be released after all buses are gone.

ODESSA MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Parents picking up children should arrive no earlier than 3pm. After exiting Odessa Middle School, all cars should proceed north on Fifth Street. College Street will be a "bus lane only" during afternoon dismissal time.

ODESSA HIGH SCHOOL:

Students will be picked up from the north side of the Odessa High School building, or from the north parking lot only. Please do not block entrances, exits or right-of-ways. There is ample parking space in the north parking lot to wait for students. The drive to the east of the school will be reserved for buses. The district thanks you for your cooperation.

TRANSPORTATION

Students transported under 1 mile from the attending school will be required to pay a fee of \$30.00 per month. NOTE: There will be no transportation fee for students in Kindergarten through grade 5.

Hotline Allows for Anonymous Reports

The Odessa School District is a member of the Kansas City 4-SCHOOL Hotline and Safety Program.

The Kansas City Metropolitan Crime Commission sponsors the program, implemented in 1999 in response to nationwide juvenile violence.

Students, teachers and parents can call the hotline to anonymously report information about crime, weapons, drugs and school violence. No caller ID is used, and the calls are not recorded.

Experienced operators answer the hotline 24 hours a day, seven days a week. They send reports directly to school administrators, and, if appropriate, to the police.

The program encourages students to develop a sense of responsibility for their schools, as well as helps them understand how they can help their teachers and administrators keep weapons and drugs out of schools.

Emergency List Should Include Names of Responsible Adults

When authorizing another person to pick up your child at school, please carefully consider the following criteria. People you list on your child's School District Emergency Card should be:

- At least 18 years old
- Usually at home during the day
- Able to walk to school if necessary
- Known to your child
- Aware of and able to assume this responsibility

*We will not release your child to an older sibling or anyone else not listed on the emergency card.

Emergency Procedures in Place

The Odessa R-VII School District is prepared to respond effectively should an emergency or disaster situation arise while school is in session. While we hope that a serious incident never occurs, our goal is to be prepared for any potential emergency.

At all times, our first priority is to protect all students and staff from harm. School personnel will care for your child if a disaster occurs during school hours. Our district has a detailed disaster plan, which has been formulated to respond to major emergencies. In an emergency, we need your cooperation to help us protect the safety and welfare of all children and school employees.

- In an emergency, we request that you not come to the school. It may be necessary to keep the streets and parking lots clear for emergency vehicles.
- ➤ If the emergency or disaster harms students or staff, we will broadcast emergency announcements and status reports as well as instructions on where you should go, and how and when you may be able to pick up your child. Tune your radios and televisions to the same stations you would listen to or watch when seeking weather dismissal information.
- ➤ If the Odessa R-VII School District receives a bomb threat, we will relocate

- students. We will alternate locations to which we relocate them, and we will not announce these locations ahead of time to deter any perpetrators from planting explosive devices at alternate locations.
- We will not release students to anyone en route to the alternate location. If we did, we would be unable to account for the location of all of our students.
- Once students reach the alternate location, they will stay there for the remainder of the school day, because we cannot risk transporting a child to an empty home, and it would be impossible for us to contact all parents.
- Students at the alternate location will be released only to parents and persons identified on the School District Emergency Card.
- For a bomb threat, we will not broadcast information on the radio or television. Experts say broadcasting such information encourages repeat and copycat behavior. If an explosive device is found, however, we will notify the public.
- ➤ If school is to be canceled for the next day, we will announce the cancellation via radio and television. If you hear no

announcement of a cancellation, you will know that all buildings have been searched by trained personnel, and that they have given us an "all clear" to conduct classes and activities according to our regular schedule. We will not occupy buildings until professionals clear them. Please assure your child we will take these steps. After an incident of this nature occurs, we will send parents a letter the next day explaining it to the best of our knowledge.

Please discuss these matters with your family. Talk with your children about such emergencies and emphasize how important it is for them to follow instructions from their teachers and school officials. Assure them we will care for them during any situation. Additionally, please talk to your child about an alternate place to obtain a key to your house. In an emergency, students might need to leave backpacks or purses at the school site.

Planning ahead will help alleviate concern during an emergency situation. We are proud that Odessa R-VII is a safe school district, and we are doing everything possible to keep it that way. We appreciate your cooperation and support.

A+ Program gives incentive to perform well

The A+ Schools Program was created in 1993 by state law as an incentive for improving Missouri's high schools. The A+ program offered by the Odessa R-VII School District will help pay for two years of college tuition at a Missouri community college or area vocational-technical school for qualifying students.

To be eligible for financial incentives of the A+ Schools Program, the student must be designated as an A+ Program/Student, which includes:

- Enter into a written agreement with the high school prior to graduation.
- Attend a designated school for three consecutive years immediately prior to graduation.
- Graduate with an overall grade point

- average (GPA) of 2.5 points or higher on a 4-point scale.
- Have an overall attendance rate of at least 95 percent for grades 9-12.
- Perform 50 hours of district-supervised, unpaid tutoring or mentoring.
- Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the use of drugs and alcohol.
- Starting with the class of 2015, receive a score of Proficient or Advanced on the Algebra I EOC exam.

The financial incentive is available only after the student has made a good faith effort to first secure all available federal financial aid through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) that does not require repayment. Parents must complete and send in the Free Application

for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form. Parental income is not a criteria for an A+ student incentive reimbursement.

Students may receive this incentive for a maximum of six (6) semesters and must be enrolled as a full-time student and maintain a GPA of 2.5 or better on a 4.0 scale. Students are eligible to use the incentive for up to four years after high school graduation, subject to legislative appropriation.

More than 90,000 students statewide have qualified for the A+ financial incentive since the program's inception. PAT Provides Support to Area Families

The Parents as Teachers program is a free program for families residing in the Odessa School District. The program will provide two group meetings for the 2011-12 school year, home visits for families who qualify, and screenings birth through five years old.

Odessa R-VII **Public Foundation**

The Odessa R-VII is a non-profit dedicated to enhancing public school education. Each year this organization raises \$10,000 to support students and teachers in their quest for a better educational experience.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

One student scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior annually in the amount of \$2,500. The recipient demonstrates community service and involvement, good moral character and above average aptitude.

TEACHER GRANTS

Each year several grants totaling \$5,000 are awarded to our district's teachers. The grants are open to any R-VII employee whose grant proposal demonstrates activities that will help to improve student achievement and learning.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Statute: 20 U.S.C. § 1232g. Regulations: 34 CFR Part 99.

FERPA provides that an LEA (local educational agency) that receives Department of Education (Department) funds may not have a policy or practice of denying parents the right to:

- Inspect and review education records (34 CFR § 99.10).
- Seek to amend education records (34 CFR §§ 99.20,99.21, and 99.22).
- Consent to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from education records except as specified by law (34 CFR §§ 99.30 and 99.31).

These rights transfer to the student when he or she turns 18 years of age or enters a post-secondary educational institution at any age ("eligible student").

LEAs must annually notify parents and eligible students of their rights under FERPA. 34 CFR § 99.7. The annual notification must also include:

- The procedure to inspect and review education records;
- The procedure to request amendment of education records:
- A specification of criteria for determining who constitutes a school official and what constitutes a legitimate educational interest if the agency or institution discloses or intends to disclose personally identifiable information to school officials without consent; and
- The right of parents to file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office (FPCO) in the Department. (A model FERPA notification for LEAs is enclosed and is also available on FPCO's website - www.ed.gov/policy/gen/guid/fpco.)
- The viewing of any video from district or bus security cameras, that includes the photographic image of a student, will be in accordance with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and will not be considered directory information.

If the LEA or educational institution under the LEA discloses directory information from education records without consent, it is required by 34 CFR § 99.37 to notify parents and eligible students of:

The types of information the LEA (or institution)

has designated as directory information (see 34 CFR § 99.3 "Directory information" for definition);

 The right to opt out of disclosure of directory information. (A model "directory information" notice is enclosed and is also available on FPCO's website - www.ed.gov/policy/gen/guid/fpco.)

LEAs must also comply with FERPA's redisclosure and recordation provisions, set forth in 34 CFR §§ 99.32 and 99.33, except for disclosures that are specifically exempted.

Outlined below are changes in the NCLB that do not amend FERPA, but relate to the disclosure of personally identifiable information from students' education records.

Suspension and expulsion disciplinary records:

- Section 4155 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA), 20 U.S.C. § 7165, as amended by the NCLB, requires that each State have "a procedure in place to facilitate the transfer of disciplinary records, with respect to a suspension or expulsion, by local educational agencies to any private or public elementary school or secondary school for any student who is enrolled or seeks, intends, or is instructed to enroll, on a full- or parttime basis, in the school" no later than January 8, 2004. LEAs should include a notice in their annual notification of rights under FERPA that they forward education records to other schools that have requested the records and in which the student seeks or intends to enroll (34 CFR §§ 99.7 and 99.34(a)(ii)). (See enclosed model notification of rights.)
- Section 9528 of the ESEA, 20 U.S.C. § 7908, as amended by the NCLB, and 10 U.S.C. 503, as amended by § 544 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2002 (Pub.L. No. 107-107), require LEAs to:
- → give military recruiters the same access to secondary school students as provided to postsecondary institutions or to prospective employers; and
- → provide students' names, addresses, and telephone listings to military recruiters, when requested, unless a parent has opted out of providing such information. (Military Recruiter Guidance is on FPCO website.)

Special Education Public Notice

All responsible public agencies are required to locate, evaluate, and identify children with disabilities who are under the jurisdiction of the agency, regardless of the severity of the disability, including children attending private schools, highly mobile children, such as migrant and homeless children, and children who are suspected of having a disability and in need of special education even though they are advancing from grade to grade. The local public school assures that it will provide a free, appropriate public education (FAPE) to all eligible children with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 under its jurisdiction. Disabilities include autism, deaf/blindness, emotional disorders, hearing impairment and deafness, mental retardation, multiple disabilities, orthopedic impairment, other health impairments, specific learning disabilities, speech or language impairment, traumatic brain injury, visual impairment/ blindness and young child with a developmental delay.

The local public school assures that personally identifiable information collected, used, or maintained by the agency for the purposes of identification, evaluation, placement or provision of FAPE of children with disabilities may be inspected and/or reviewed by their parents/guardians. Parents/guardians may request amendment to the educational record if the parent/guardian believes the record is inaccurate, misleading, or violates the privacy or other rights of their child. Parents have the right to file complaints with the U.S. Department of Education or the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education concerning alleged failures by the district to meet the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA).

The local public school district has developed a Local Compliance Plan for implementation of State Regulations for the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). This plan contains the agency's policies and procedures regarding storage, disclosure to third parties, retention and destruction of personally identifiable information and the agency's assurances that services are provided in compliance with the General Education Provision Act (GEPA). This plan may be reviewed in the superintendent's office or the special services director's office during regular school hours on the days that school is in session.

This notice will be provided in native languages as appropriate.

Vision Exam Required for Kindergartners/1st Grade New Enrollees

All students entering kindergarten or new enrollees into 1st grade must have a comprehensive vision exam.

The Children's Vision Bill, which went into effect last school year, was signed on June 21, 2007 by Governor Matt Blunt. The law mandates that all students enrolling in kindergarten and new enrollees into 1st grade receive a comprehensive vision examination performed by a state licensed optometrist, ophthalmologist, or physician.

Missouri joins Kentucky as the second state in the nation requiring eye exams for children entering public schools. In a survey conducted following the enactment of the Kentucky mandatory children's eye exam law, 14 percent of the more than 5,000 children entering the school system in 2000 needed corrective lenses, and hundreds of children were diagnosed with eye diseases.

The comprehensive vision exam has been defined in the bill to include, but not limited to: complete case history, visual acuity (clarity of sight) at distance (aided and unaided), external examination, internal examination (opthalmoscopic examination), and subjective refraction to best determine visual acuity. The comprehensive exam needs to be reported on the State Developed Form.

Along with immunizations, parents will need to supply a copy of the comprehensive vision exam as part of the enrollment process. A copy of the comprehensive vision exam must be on file in the health room for a child to start kindergarten or for new enrollees to enter 1st grade.

Protection of Pupils' Rights Amendment (PPRA)

Statute: 20 U.S.C.§ 1232h. Regulations: 34 CFR Part 98.

PPRA governs the administration to students of a survey, analysis, or evaluation that concerns one or more of the following eight protected areas:

- 1. political affiliations or beliefs of the student or the student's parent;
- 2. mental or psychological problems of the student or the student's family;
- 3. sex behavior or attitudes;
- 4. illegal, anti-social, self-incriminating, or demeaning behavior;
- critical appraisals of other individuals with whom respondents have close family relationships;
- legally recognized privileged or analogous relationships, such as those of lawyers, physicians, and ministers;
- 7. religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent; or
- income (other than that required by law to determine eligibility for participation in a program or for receiving financial assistance under such program).

PPRA also concerns marketing surveys and other areas of student privacy, parental access to information, and the administration of certain physical examinations to minors.

The rights under PPRA transfer from the parents to a student who is 18 years old or an emancipated minor under State law.

GENERAL NOTIFICATION - LEAs must provide parents and students effective notice of their rights under PPRA. In addition, the NCLB amendments to PPRA require that LEAs provide for reasonable notice of the adoption or continued use of the policies described later in this article. The LEA must provide such notice at least annually, at the beginning of the school year, and after any substantive change in such policies. This new notification requirement may be included in the PPRA general notification.

The general notification must indicate that PPRA applies to surveys that contain questions about one or more of the eight protected areas listed above. The notification must explain that for surveys that contain questions about one or more of the eight protected areas and that are funded in whole or in part by Department funds, the LEA must obtain prior written consent from parents before students are required to submit to the survey.

The general notification must also indicate that, for surveys that contain questions from one or more of the eight protected areas but are not funded in whole or part by Department funds, the LEA will notify the parent, at least annually at the beginning of the school year, of the specific or approximate dates during the school year when it will administer the survey(s) and provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participating.

In addition, LEAs must notify parents that they have the right to review, upon request, any survey that concerns one or more of the eight protected areas, any instructional materials used in connection with any survey that concerns one or more of the eight protected areas, and any instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum for the student. (A model PPRA general notification for use by LEAs may be obtained on FPCO's website.)

Section 1061 of NCLB amended PPRA to give parents more rights with regard to the surveying of minor students, the collection of information from students for marketing purposes, and certain non-emergency medical examinations. Here are some of the changes made to PPRA by NCLB:

- An eighth category of protected information was added to PPRA. Sec No. 7 above, "religious practices, affiliations, or beliefs of the student or student's parent."
- The following new provisions apply to educational agencies and institutions that receive funds from any Department program.
 - A. LEAs are required to develop and adopt policies in consultation with parents regarding the following:
 - 1) The right of parents to inspect, upon request, a survey created by a third party before the survey is administered or distributed by a school to students.
 - 2) Arrangements to protect student privacy that are provided by the LEA in the event of the administration of a survey to students containing one or more of the eight protected items of information noted above (including the right of parents to inspect, upon request, a survey that concerns one or more of the eight protected items of information).
 - 3) The right of parents to inspect, upon request, any instructional material used as part of the educational curriculum for students, and the procedure for granting a request by a parent for such access.
 - 4) The administration of physical examinations or screenings that the school may administer to students.
 - 5) The collection, disclosure, or use of personal information (including items such as a student's or parent's first and last name, address, telephone number or social security number) collected from students for the purpose of marketing or selling, or otherwise providing the information to others for that purpose, including the LEA's arrangements for protecting student privacy in the event of collection, disclosure, or use.
 - 6) The right of parents to inspect, upon request, any instrument used in the collection of personal information, as described above in paragraph 5, before the instrument is administered or distributed to a student and the LEA's procedure for granting a parent's request.

- B. SPECIFIC NOTIFICATION An LEA must "directly" notify, such as through U.S. Mail or email, parents of students who are scheduled to participate in the specific activities or surveys noted below and must provide an opportunity for the parent to opt his or her child out of participation in the specific event or survey. An LEA may make this notification to parents at the beginning of the school year if the LEA has identified the specific or approximate dates of the activities or surveys at that time. Thereafter, parents should be provided reasonable notification of the planned activities and surveys and be provided an opportunity to opt their child out, as well as an opportunity to review any pertinent surveys. A model-specific notification for use by LEAs may be obtained on the website noted at the end of this guidance. LEAs must offer an opportunity for parents to opt their child out of participating in the following activities:
 - → Activities involving the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the purpose of marketing or for selling that information, or otherwise providing that information to others for that purpose.
 - → Any non-emergency, invasive physical examination or screening that is: 1) required as a condition of attendance; 2) administered by the school and scheduled by the school in advance; and 3) not necessary to protect the immediate health and safety of the student, or of other students.
 - → The administration of any survey containing one or more of the eight protected areas of information listed above and that is not funded in whole or in part by Department funds. (LEAs must obtain active consent, and may not use an opt-out procedure, if the survey is funded in whole or in part with Department funds.)
- C. An LEA is not required to develop and adopt new policies if the SEA or LEA has in place, on the date of enactment (January 8, 2002) of the NCLB, policies covering the requirements set forth in this law; however, the LEA must still provide annual notice of these policies to parents.
- D. The requirements concerning activities involving the collection and disclosure of personal information from students for marketing purposes do not apply to the collection, disclosure, or use of personal information collected from students for the exclusive purpose of developing, evaluating, or providing educational products or services for or to students or educational institutions, such as the following:
 - 1) College or other post-secondary education recruitment, or military, recruitment.
 - 2) Book clubs, magazines, and programs providing access to low-cost literary products.
 - Curriculum and instructional materials used by elementary schools and secondary schools.
 - Tests and assessments used by elementary schools and secondary schools to provide cognitive, evaluative, diagnostic, clinical, aptitude, or achievement information about students.
 - 5) The sale by students of products or services to raise funds for school-related or education-related activities.
 - 6) Student recognition programs.
- E. This law does not preempt applicable provisions of State law that require parental notification.
- F. This law does not apply to any physical examination or screening that is permitted or required by State law, including physical examinations or screenings permitted without parental notification.
- G. An SEA or LEA may use funds provided under part A of the ESEA to enhance parental involvement in areas affecting the in-school privacy of students, such as reimbursement for costs associated with this direct notification.

DEFINITION OF SOME TERMS USED IN PPRA:

"Instructional Material" - instructional material that is provided to a student, regardless of format including printed or representational materials, audio-visual materials, and materials in electronic or digital formats (such as materials accessible through the Internet). The term does not include academic tests or academic assessments.

"Invasive Physical Examination" - any medical examination that involves the exposure of private body parts, or any act during such examination that includes incision, insertion, or injection into the body, but does not include a hearing, vision, or scoliosis screening.

Personal Information" - individually identifiable information including

- (1) a student's or parent's first and last name;
- (2) a home or other physical address (including a street name and the name of a city or town);
- (3) a telephone number, or;
- (4) a social security number.

Immunization Requirements for 2011-2012

All students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status, including month, day and year of each immunization before they can attend school.

The Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) allows a 4-day grace period (meaning 4 or fewer days prior to the recommended interval or age), so students in all grade levels may receive immunizations up to 4 days before they are due.

For children beginning kindergarten during or after the 2003-04 school year,

required immunizations should be administered according to the current ACIP Schedule, including all spacing, (http://www.cdc.gov/vaccines/recs/schedules/child-schedule.htm).

To remain in school, students "in progress" must have an Imm.P.14 form (which includes appointment date for needed immunization(s)) on file and must receive immunizations as soon as they become due. In progress means that a child has begun the vaccine series and has an appointment for the next dose. This appointment must be kept and an updated

record provided to the school. If the appointment is not kept, the child is no longer in progress and is noncompliant. (For example, hep B vaccine series was begun but the child is not yet eligible to receive the next dose in the series.) In progress does not apply to the Tdap or Td booster.

Religious (Imm.P.11A) and Medical (Imm.P. 12) exemptions are allowed. The appropriate exemption card must be on file. Unimmunized children are subject to exclusion from school when outbreaks of vaccine-preventable diseases occur.

²Tdap. which contains pertussis vaccine, is required for students enrolled in eighth grade and ninth grade who have completed the recommended childhood DTP/DTaP vaccination series and have not received a Td booster dose within the past two (2) years. **If a student received a Tdap the student is up-to-date. Tdap is currently licensed for one dose only; an additional dose is not needed.** For grades 10-12, a Tdap or Td booster is required ten (10) years after the last dose of DTaP. DTP or DT. In the event of a pertussis outbreak situation, Tdap may be given at intervals less than 10 years.

³ <u>Kindergarten & 1st Grade:</u> Last dose must be administered on or after fourth birthday.
