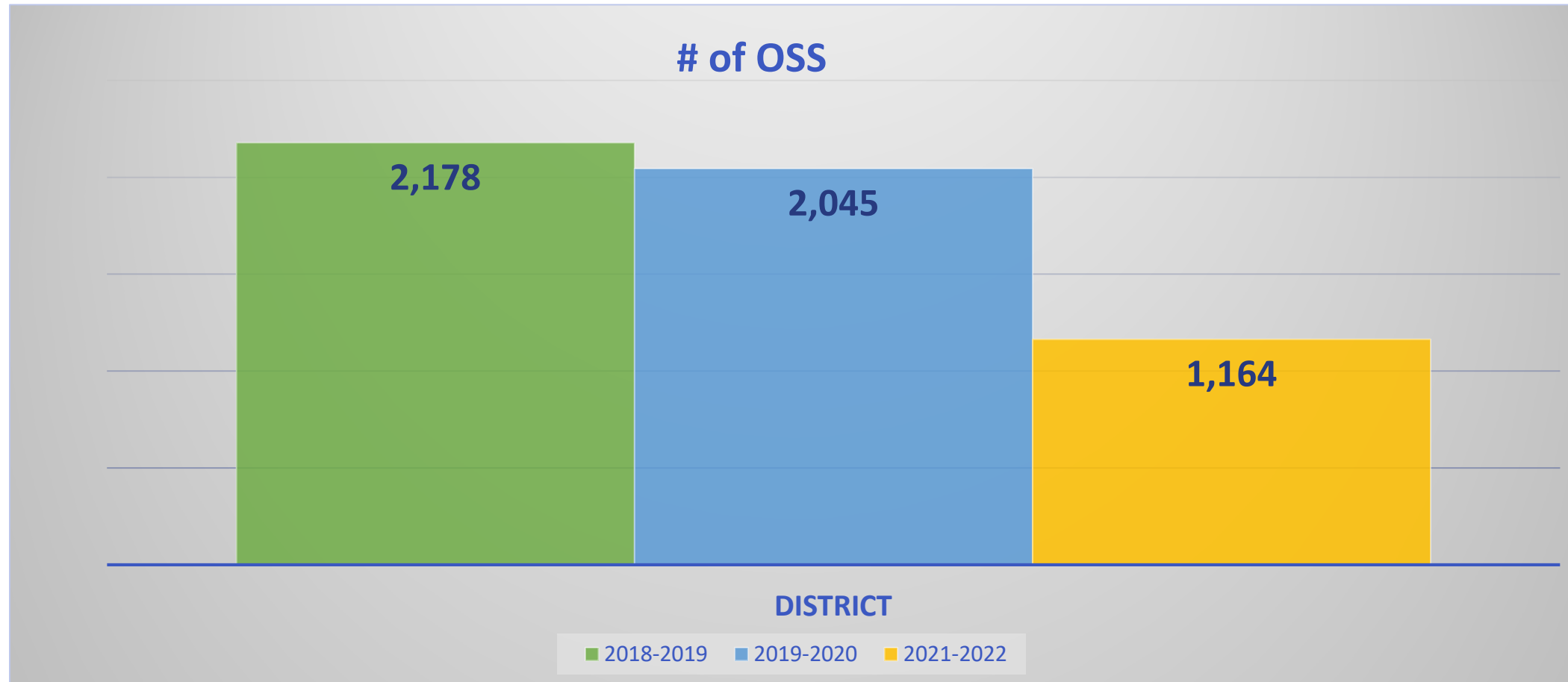




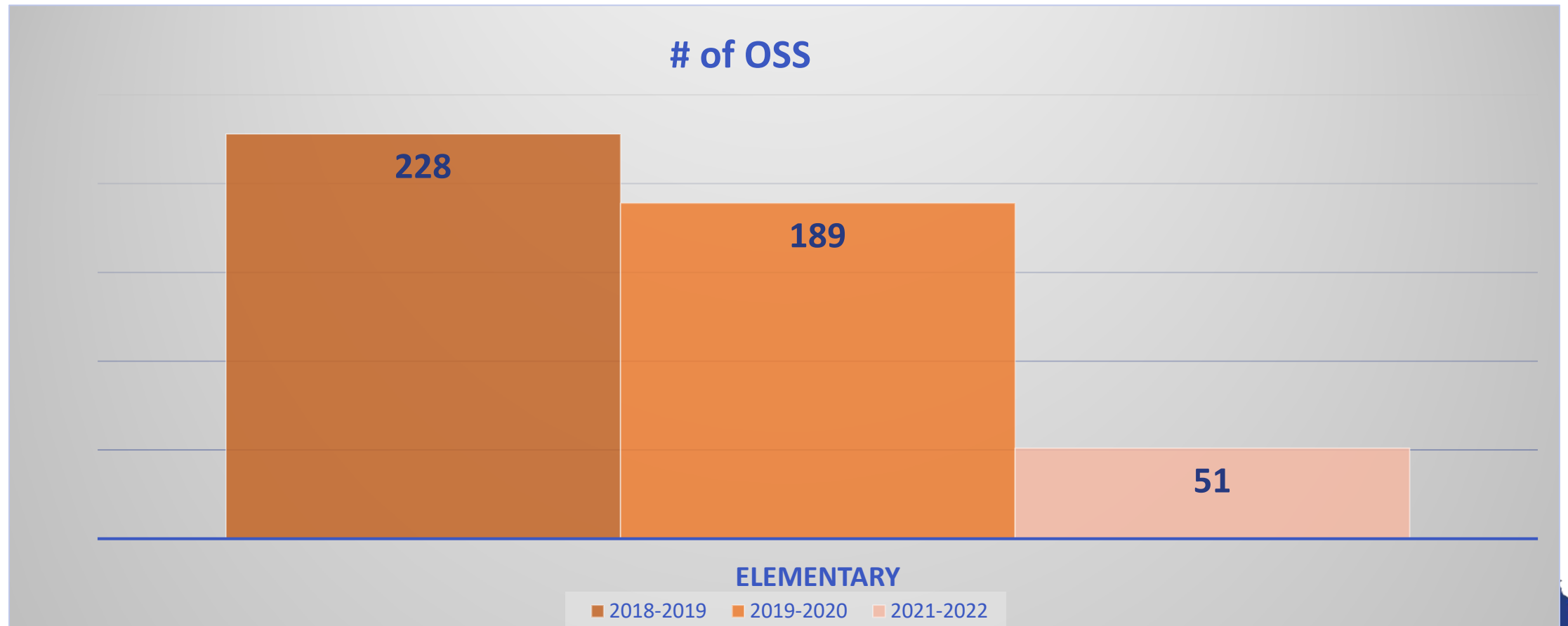

August, September, October

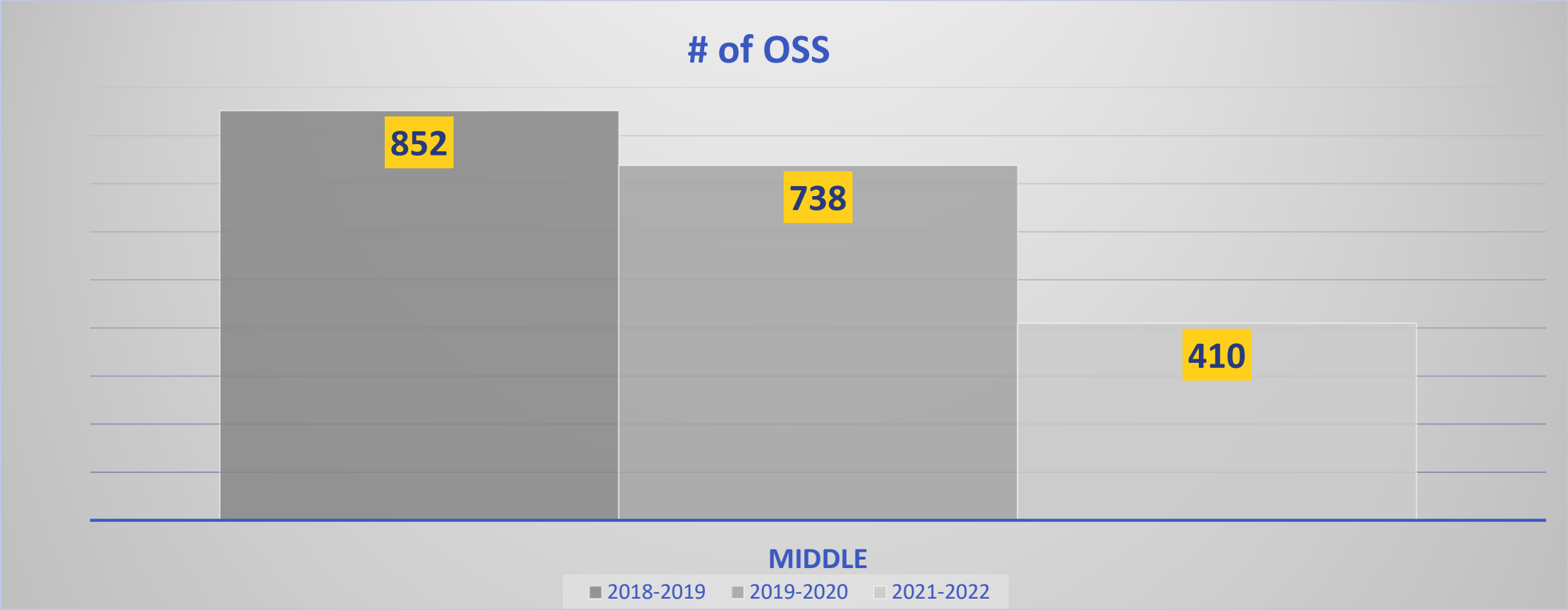


Out of School Suspensions August, September, October



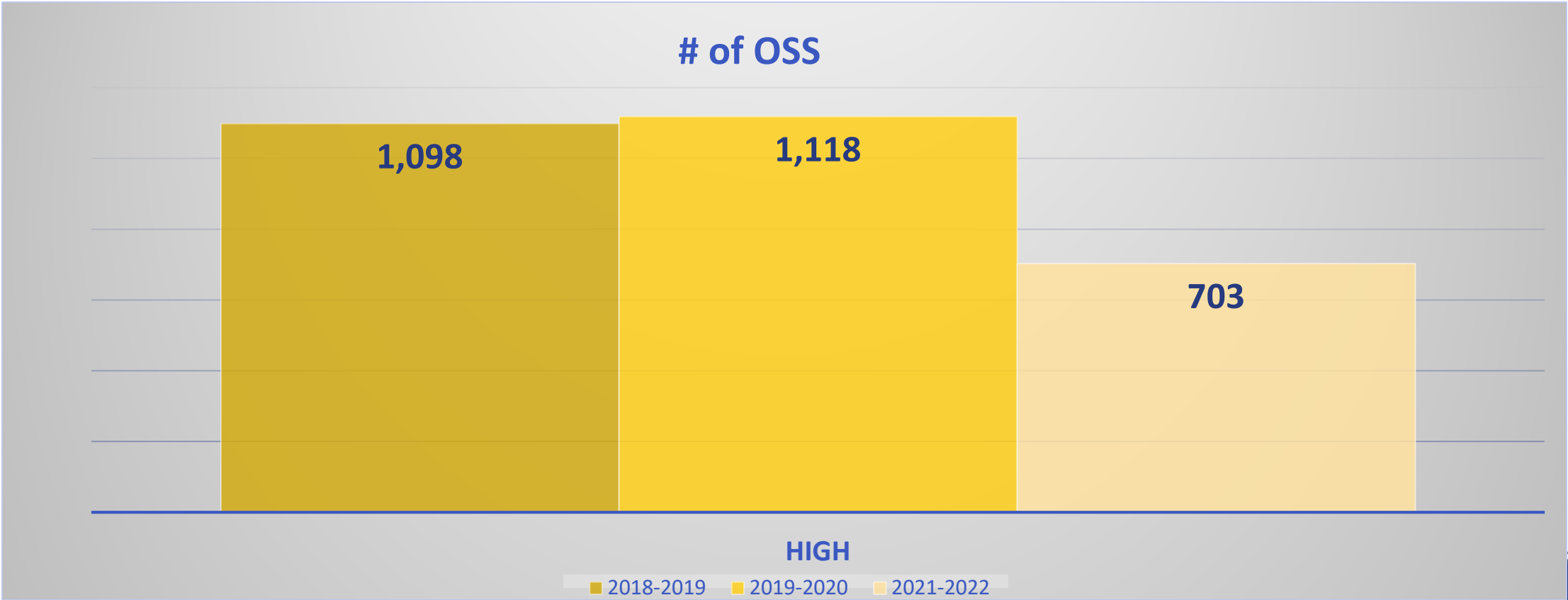

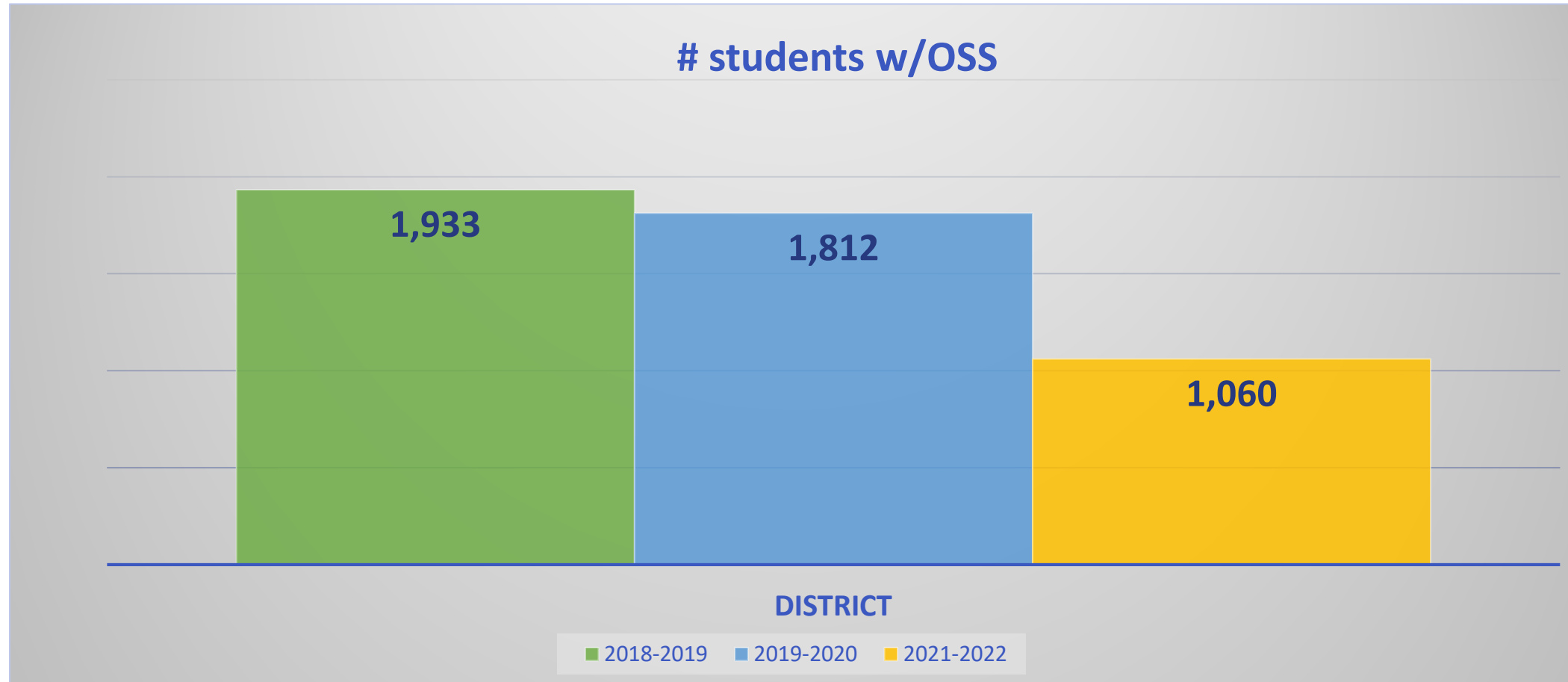

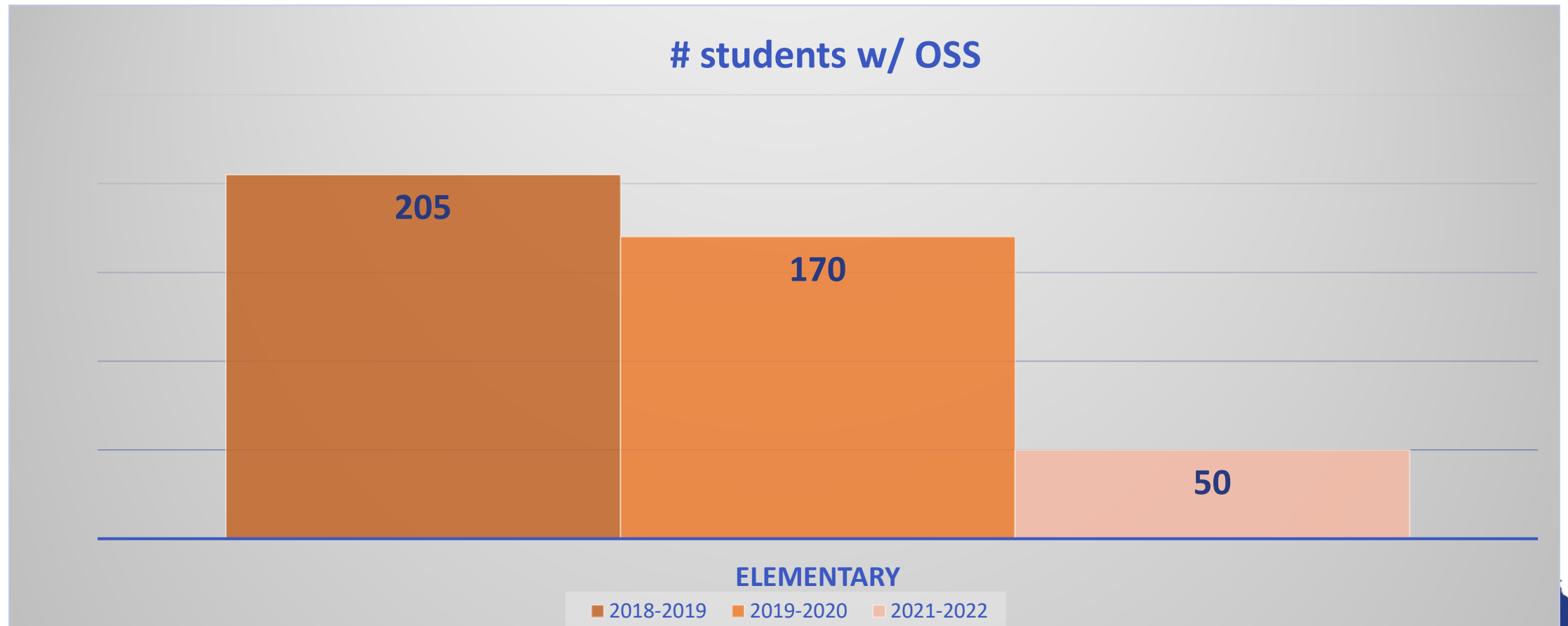


Students Receiving OSS

August, September, October

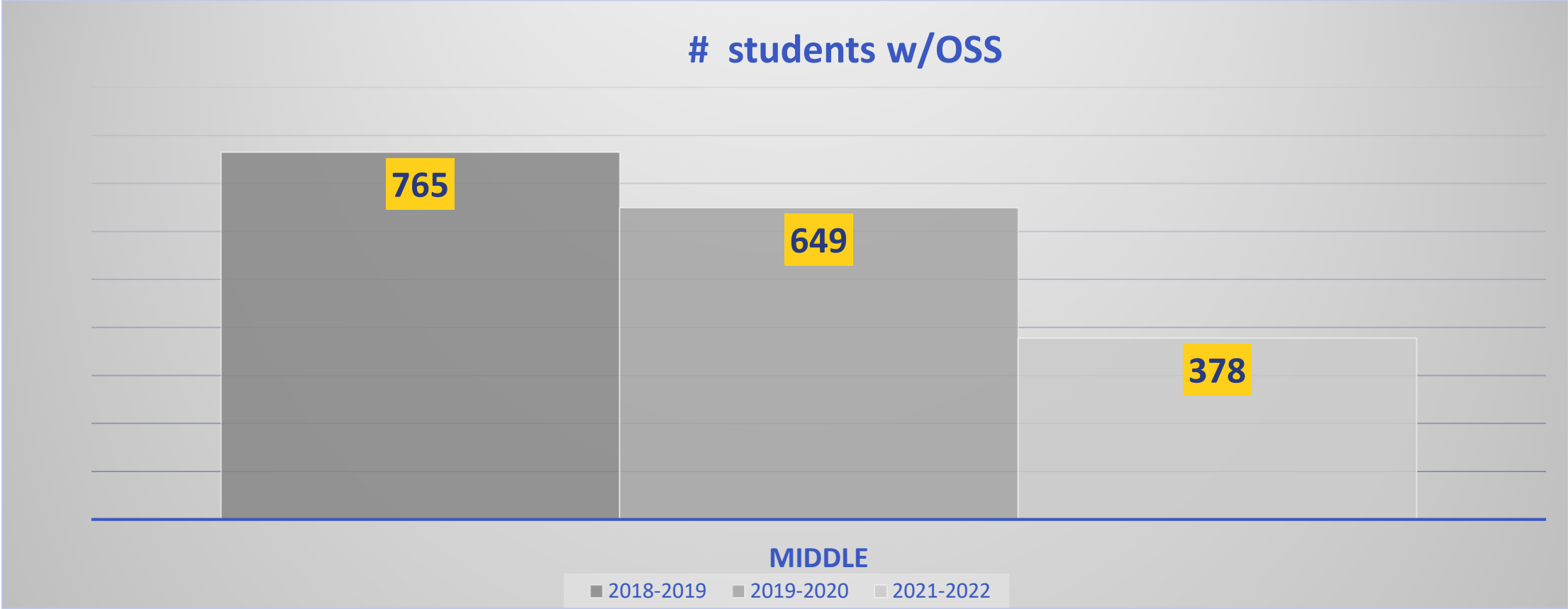


Students Receiving OSS August, September, October

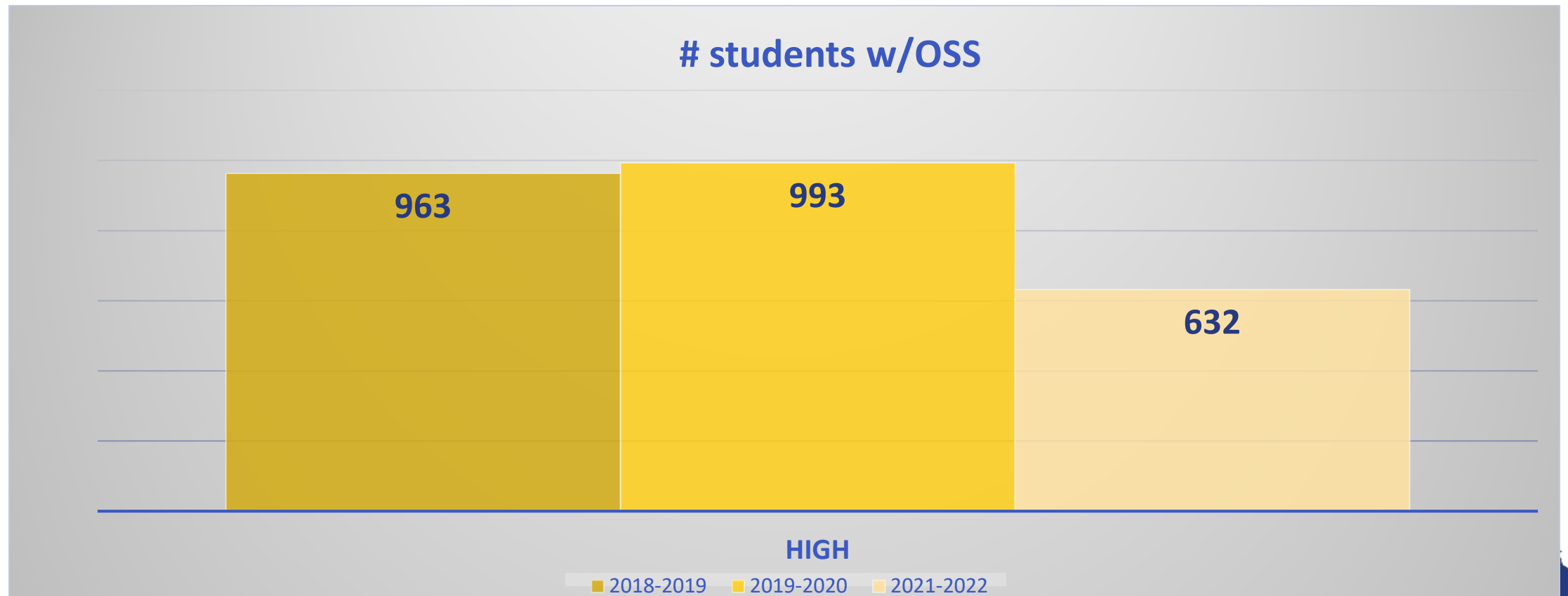

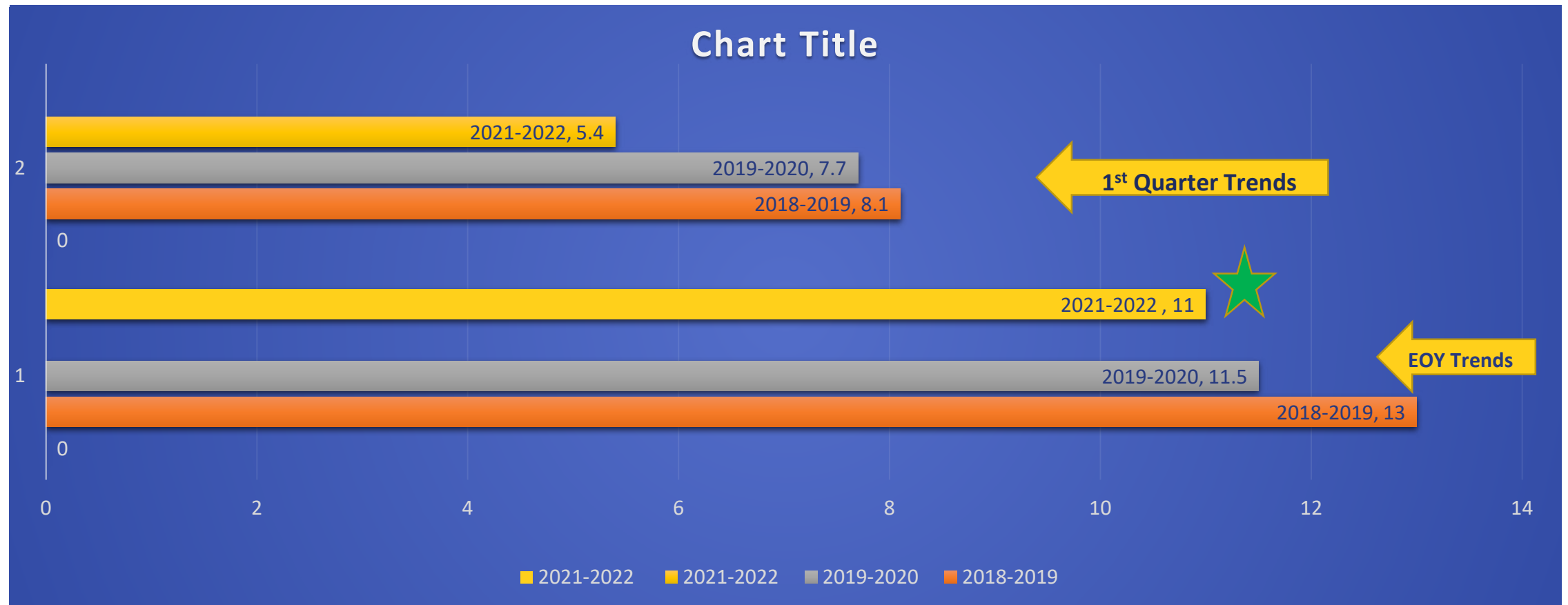

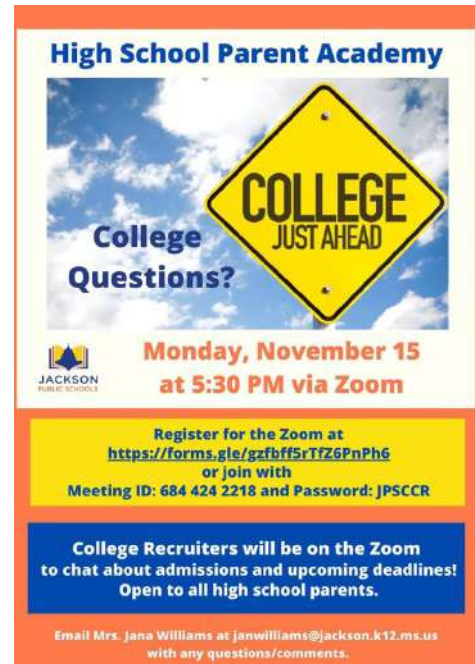

Researching and implementing a district-wide framework to address Social-Emotional Learning (SEL)



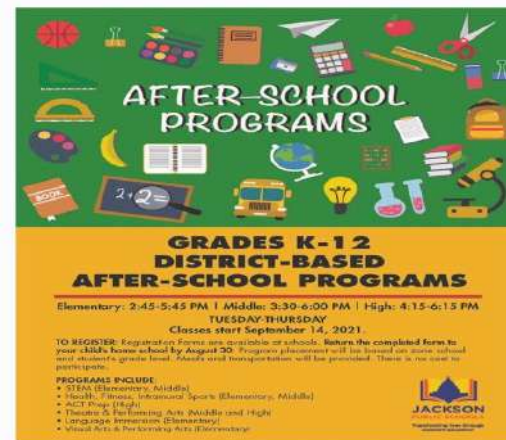


Researching and implementing a district -wide framework to address Social -Emotional Learning (SEL)

- **Counselors currently provide monthly SEL lessons for discussions during designated times.**
- **Staff members receive professional development on the five SEL competencies, trauma informed practices and self-care.**
- **Student representation/ student voice**
- **JPS administration will seek approval to implement a district-wide SEL curriculum.**

- Overall, the number of **disciplinary infractions with the consequence of out of school suspensions** are down **significantly** from the previous years.
- The District's commitment to provide joyful learning environments, implement Social Emotional Learning, promoting positive relationships with scholars and adults while engaging in fun and meaningful activities continues to produce positive results.
- We are **ON TRACK** to meet this year's strategic plan goal to reduce the percentage of student suspensions to 11% or fewer.
