ROLL AND HOP ON NUMBER GRID

You will need: Number Grid, Counters, 1 or 2 dice

1st Grade

- Put your counter at 0 and roll one die and hop that many hops on the number grid.
- Keep on rolling and hopping until you reach the end.

2nd Grade

- Put your counter at 0 and roll one die and hop that many hops on the number grid.
- Keep on rolling and hopping until you reach the end.
- Roll backwards and count backwards on the number grid.
- Repeat 2 times.



3rd Grade

- Put your counter at 0 and roll 2 dice, add the numbers together and make that many hops forward on the number grid.
- Roll and hop backwards on the number grid.
- Repeat 2 times.
