Science - Choose one or more per week.

<p>Science - 1</p> <p>Go on a nature walk. Make a list of ten things you see. Keep your eyes open for living and nonliving things and take pictures along the way! Be specific on your list. For example, instead of writing 'bugs', write 'ladybug' and 'gnats'.</p>	<p>Science - 2</p> <p>Record a video of yourself doing an experiment using items you have around the house. In the video, explain what you are doing step by step. Be creative and have fun! This video can also be uploaded on the Google Classroom page.</p>	<p>Science/Social Studies - 3</p> <p>In celebration of Earth Day on April 23rd, gather some things to recycle. Save your collection until you can take them to a collection spot like the one near the police station in West Lafayette or near Baker's IGA in Newcomerstown.</p>
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Social Studies - Choose one or more per week.

<p>Social Studies - 1</p> <p>Make a Timeline of your life including at least 6 pictures. You may draw or glue these pictures on a poster board. Each picture needs to be labeled with a date and description. You may upload a picture to Google Classroom, or save it for a later date.</p>	<p>Social Studies - 2</p> <p>Write your own book about how the environment and climate affect how we live and jobs people do in their community. Is your community near water? In the mountains? How do people dress? What foods can they grow? Save your book to share with the class or upload pictures on Google Classroom.</p>	<p>Social Studies - 3</p> <p>Complete the Grandparent interview that was sent home on our last day. If you do not have the paper, call a grandparent or older friend or relative and ask them what life was like for them when they were growing up. How did they get to school? What was school like? What was their favorite TV show or book? Compare their life as a child to how life is for you.</p>
