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'Jays Fly Past Million Mark

On October 29 Montrose R -XIV principal Ryan Middleton recognized three students for successfully answering the challenge to read a million words this past school year. For this accomplishment eighth-grader Gabrielle Iliff was inducted into the honorary Millionaire Club, and freshman Betty Jurgensmeyer and junior Joyce Jurgensmeyer, charter members last year, were lauded for earning second-year titles as "Millionaires."

Reflecting a nation-wide trend of pushing students to read at least a million words a year, the Montrose School District instituted the Millionaire Club at the beginning of the 2011-2012 academic year, recognizing the impact that independent reading has in increasing students' comprehension, intelligence, speed, endurance, problem-solving competencies, memory, cop-

ing ability, writing skills, and exposure to new ideas and information while promoting reading's recreational and cultural values.

The local organization stipulates that a candidate document reading at least a million words during the regular school term and verify comprehension through tests, discussion, essays, or other diagnostic means.

District librarian and club sponsor Carol McEwan stated, "We wouldn't expect ball players to compete with one hand tied behind their backs. Yet students who do not exercise their literacy skills inflict upon themselves a comparable handicap detrimental during and, especially, after high school. Studies indicate teenagers need to read about 1,000,000 words a year to develop sufficient vocabulary and to improve reading proficiency. Joyce, Betty, and Gabrielle have shown how

easily this can be done. At Montrose High School, we've seen a big increase in reading so far this year and hope to honor more students next year."

Help Keep Our Bluejay Family Healthy



Our area has seen a dramatic increase in positive lab specimens for Influenza A for our community, which is H1N1 according to the Missouri Department of Health and CDC. Anyone vaccinated with flu this season has a decreased risk of flu or will have a milder case than those not vaccinated.

How to prevent flu:

 Flu is spread through coughing, sneezing, nose blowing or touching contaminated surfaces then touching your eye/nose/ or mouth.

- Cover coughs and sneezes with your arm
- Frequent hand hygiene with alcohol based hand cleaner or soap and water Clean and disinfect surfaces that are touched often (desks, countertops, doorknobs/handles, keyboards, hands on items, phones, toys, sports equipment, bathrooms) http://www.cdc.gov/flu/school/cleaning.htm

Persons ill with flu can be contagious to others from one day **before** feeling sick to 5-7 days after symptom onset.

Symptoms: fever, chills, cough, sore throat, runny nose, body aches, headache, tiredness, diarrhea, and vomiting.

Persons should be free of fever below 100 F for 24 hours without fever reducers of ibuprofen or acetaminophen


