### Reports

#### Old Business

The Board conducted first reading on proposed changes to section A of the Board Policy Handbook. Discussion took place regarding what numbering system to use; more research will be done on a numbering system. No action was taken.

### New Business

Mr. Brian Hines addressed the Board regarding the role of the fifth graders in the middle school. Mr. Hines stated he is in favor of housing the fifth grade in the middle school. Mr. Hines has concerns about whether the fifth grade is considered elementary or middle school and is concerned the fifth grade is not represented on the middle school student council, the fifth grade has less opportunities than when in the elementary buildings, the fifth grade can't be in the middle school play, the fifth grade is dismissed before grades 6-8 but are joined by the students from grades 6-8 at the bus loading area, fifth grade conferences for next fall are not scheduled on the same night as conferences for grades 6-8, and fifth grade students are not included on the middle school honor roll. Mr. Hines requested the Board to decide if the fifth grade is middle school or if the fifth grade is elementary students housed in the middle school. Some Board members responded that in this first year of reconfiguration they do consider the fifth grade as elementary students being housed in the middle school. As time progresses the Board hopes a more seamless integration of the fifth grade students into the middle school will take place.

Motion by VanBerkum, second by Bennett, and unanimously carried to approve the 28 page resolution to refund the capital outlay certificates issued to remodel the Huron Arena in 2005 and reissue the remaining debt to save approximately \$30,000.

Motion by Yost, second by VanBerkum, and unanimously carried to pass an optout resolution for \$750,000 for one year and not schedule an election on the issue.

Motion by VanBerkum, second by Bennett, and unanimously carried to award the school bus bid to the low bidder, North Central Bus Sales, for one 2013 Bluebird 84 passenger transit bus in the amount of \$88,089. (A complete bid recap is on file in the Business Office.)

Motion by Bennett, second by Fryberger, and unanimously carried to enter executive session to discuss a student long-term suspension at 7:42 p.m.

Motion by Yost, second by Bennett, and unanimously approved to exit executive session at 8:00 p.m.

Motion by VanBerkum, second by Yost, and unanimously carried suspend student number 2011-12A through the end of the school year.

Motion by Yost, second by VanBerkum, and unanimously carried to enter executive session to discuss negotiations at 8:01 p.m.

Motion by Bennett, second by Yost, and unanimously approved to exit executive session at 9:00 p.m.

Motion by VanBerkum, second by Bennett, and unanimously carried to adjourn at 9:00 p.m.
