For each of sections that follow, students may be required to understand, apply, analyze, evaluate or create the particular concepts being taught.

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

All students who will major in business or who will at one time have their own business (law firm, medical/dental office, etc.) are encouraged to take this course. This class will introduce students to computerized financial accounting. The primary objective of the course will be to learn the rules and procedures of accounting for a profit-motivated business. All journals, ledgers, worksheets, financial reports, and study guides will be completed using a web-based accounting tutorial site (Aplia.com) which will provide immediate feedback. Students will expand their knowledge of Excel spreadsheets, and computerized simulations for proprietorships, partnerships, and small corporations. Assessments will be web-based and students will become proficient in using Blackboard.com.
