CORE BODY OF KNOWLEDGE

GLOBAL STUDIES HONORS GRADE 9

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

The course will provide students with the content and the skills necessary for exploring other cultures and will serve as an analysis of the interdependent nature of our Twenty-First Century global community. Students will investigate the past and present geographic, political, social, religious, and economic aspects of the non-western world. The course is devoted to inquiry based on global connections and factors that have shaped our present world. Emphasis is placed on synthesizing information to recognize historical and present patterns while valuing what makes each nation or region unique and significant.

STUDY SKILLS:

Social studies skills such as analyzing documents, categorizing information, evaluating evidence, and making inferences will be introduced and practiced. The course will serve as a foundation for further social studies courses and will focus on developing critical thinking, writing, and communication skills. Students will be independently take notes on foundational information, and adequately prepare for assessments through the development of study skills.

For each of the sections that follow, students may be required to analyze, recall, explain, interpret, apply, or evaluate the particular concepts being taught.

- Examine the global influence and significance of modern African nations

- Compare and contrast developments in the Middle East to other regions of the world
