EIGHTH GRADE

For each of the sections that follow, students may be required to understand, apply, analyze, evaluate or create the particular concepts being taught.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This novel-based course meets every day for twelve weeks to develop and hone reading comprehension, vocabulary, and analysis skills via a selection of age-appropriate science fiction, fantasy, and nonfiction novels.

STUDY SKILLS

- create flashcards for vocabulary terms
- student-generated graphic organizers for writing prompts
- model and facilitate appropriate note-taking techniques
- demonstrate their consistent use of an assignment book
- demonstrate different study approaches to test preparation

MAJOR UNIT THEMES:

1. Elements of Literature

- locate examples of direct and indirect characterization
- apply elements of literature to various projects
- identify and analyze elements of literature
- identify both internal and external conflict and locate examples within the text
- analyze the author's style and us of cliffhangers
- define the types of genre and sub genre, as well as their characteristics
- analyze the author's style and use of cliffhangers
- identify both internal and external conflict and locate examples within the text
- define and identify verbal and situational irony
- identify elements of genre within the text
- locate examples of imagery in the text and create a sensory details chart

2. Vocabulary

- use context clues to define or infer meaning
- identify synonyms and antonyms of vocabulary terms
- demonstrate expanded vocabulary
- apply key vocabulary to cloze passages
- conjugate vocabulary words into parts of speech
- analyze figurative language within the novels

3. Comprehension and Analysis

- infer meaning through role-playing activities and discussion
- apply reading strategies to comprehend the novels
- compare/contrast the main characters at the beginning and end of the novel.
- answer comprehension questions on each chapter of the novel
- sequence the events from the novel
- identify cause and effect relationships
- create a plot chart to organize the plot of each story
- describe problem/solution relationships within the novel and the effects the outcome(s) have on the main character
