COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course introduces students to basic elements of theater, improvisation, pantomime and character development. Our readings will include short plays, speeches and scripts, and will include visual, musical and interactive components.

Performance based projects will include presentations, skits, and other collaborative presentations.

- Differentiate between quality and pitch of voice
- List and describe factors that an actor must consider when developing a character's voice

- Describe why questions are important when developing character
- Describe they the laugh curve is important for performance
- List and describe the keys to characterization
- Describe different theater structures and why the structure is important in theater
