




















## Director's Notes

I watched the famous film version of *The Music Man* when I was a kid, and at the time, I liked the things about it that a kid would like: the fast-paced dialogue of "Rock Island," the romantic chaos of "Marian the Librarian." I liked the fast-talkin' every-timea-bullseye salesman Harold Hill and how he was always one step ahead of the bumbling mayor.

Years later, when we decided to produce the musical here, I rewatched the film. When I popped in the DVD player, I thought, "Seen it a thousand times... nothing really new." Imagine my surprise when I rediscovered (or, perhaps, discovered for the first time,) the scenes that I merely tolerated (if not fast-forwarded) as a kid: the hauntingly beautiful "Goodnight, My Someone"; the musical brilliance of the barbershop quartet; the tender spirit locked up within the heart of little Winthrop.

Like the characters within it, *The Music Man* has much more to it than our first impressions would have us believe. Just as Marian is more than a "stuck-up librarian," or Harold is more than just a con artist, or Mayor Shinn is more than just a bumbling fool, *The Music Man* unfolds its many layers, colors and textures in a way that people of all ages and backgrounds can embrace.

In much the same way, the students working on this show have revealed the true depths, facets, and talents within them. I am so proud of the dozens of kids who have put their heart and soul into this production; this is truly their show, and I know you will join me in being proud of their fine work.

As *The Music Man* reminds us, a town without any fine arts program is pretty boring, so thank you very much for your support of the Jordan High School fine arts programs! May *The Music Man* remind you of your passions, your youth, your laughter, and the depth of beauty that can be found in the arts. Enjoy the show!
