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Chesapeake Bay Governor's School Takes Second Place in the in the 18th Annual Regional Ocean Science Bowl

Chesapeake Bay Governor's School secured a **Second Place** win at the **18th Annual Blue Crab Bowl**, held at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science in Gloucester Point on Saturday, February 7. The day-long marine science tournament attracted top high school science students from ten Virginia high schools. The **Blue Crab Bowl** is the Virginia regional competition of the National Ocean Science Bowl (NOSB®). Sixteen teams came from across the Commonwealth, from Warrenton in the west to Exmore on the Eastern Shore, from Manassas to Virginia Beach. The nearly 80 students spent the day in heated tournament competition focused on ocean sciences.

After a challenging day of both round robin and double elimination matches – 46 matches in all – **Chesapeake Bay Governor's School's Team B**, with members from both Glenss and Warsaw Campuses, lost only one match and earned the **Second Place** honors. The winning team was **coached by science teachers Sara Chaves Beam and Gregory Dorsey**. Team members included: **Team Captain Hallie Maass** (senior, New Kent High School); **David Bushhouse** (senior, New Kent High); **Sam Jasinski** (senior, Mathews High School); **John Richardson** (junior, Lancaster High); and **Robin Thady** (senior, New Kent High). Chesapeake Bay Governor's School Glenss/Warsaw also fielded a **Team A**, **coached by Sherry Pettyjohn** and including **Team Captain Josiah Schlosser, Haley Jenkins, Zachary Kaylor, and Nicholas Mann**.

The other top four teams included **Bishop Sullivan Catholic High School Team A** in First Place, **Seton School Team A** took Third Place, and **Broadwater Academy's Team A** placed Fourth.

The **Blue Crab Bowl** is a cooperative effort between the Virginia Institute of Marine Science, College of William and Mary, and Old Dominion University's Department of Ocean, Earth, and Atmospheric Sciences. Over 70 scientists, including faculty, graduate students and staff from both institutions and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, donated many hours of their time to ensure the success of this exciting event.

Virginia's **Blue Crab Bowl** was among the inaugural NOSB competitions in 1998. Designed to inspire and challenge high school students, NOSB contests like the Blue Crab Bowl test the competitors' knowledge of the marine sciences, covering the breadth of oceanography and maritime disciplines. **To date, the Blue Crab Bowl has involved over 1,450 of the Commonwealth's brightest science students from 52 public and private schools across Virginia.**

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Using questions designed by marine scientists and educators, the contest tested students' knowledge of oceanography, geology, biology, maritime history and policy. Guided by their teacher coaches, students broadened their awareness and understanding of the oceans as they prepared for the competition. The Bowl provides a forum for students who excel in math and science to receive regional and national recognition for their diligence and talent. During Saturday's event, the competition started with a field of sixteen teams, with four emerging as top contenders by late afternoon.


At the end of the grueling day, all teams were recognized during the Awards Ceremony by Bowl Coordinators **Dr. Carol Hopper Brill** from VIMS and **Dr. Victoria Hill** from ODU. Prizes were presented by **Dr. Mark Luckenbach**, Associate Dean of Research & Advisory Services at the Virginia Institute of Marine Science and **Dr. Roger Harvey**, Chair of ODU's Department of Ocean, Earth and Atmospheric Sciences. The students were applauded for their accomplishments and encouraged to continue their studies in marine sciences.

The winning team will represent Virginia in the national competition, facing other regional champions at the National finals, April 24-26, in Ocean Springs, Mississippi. The National Ocean Science Bowl is a program of the Consortium for Ocean Leadership in Washington, DC. NOSB seeks to interest students in ocean science as a college major and potential career. Through 25 regional competitions across the nation, NOSB provides an educational forum intended to: generate student interest in the ocean sciences; improve awareness of our oceans, coasts and Great Lakes; and create an "ocean literate" society that can meet the ocean challenges of the future. During 2015, an expected 2,000 students from over 300 high schools from around the country will participate in this 18th annual event.


