KINDERGARTEN

For each of the sections that follow, students may be required to understand, apply, analyze, evaluate or create the particular concepts being taught.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Language Arts in kindergarten will focus on the study of the foundational skills of reading, writing, speaking and listening. The kindergarten students will build these foundational skills through:

- developing concepts of print and print awareness through distinguishing between letters, words and sentences; recognizing upper and lower case letters; recognizing parts of a book; understanding directionality; matching print to speech; and understanding that written words are represented by specific sequences of letters.
- developing phonemic awareness skills of rhyming, counting phonemes, counting syllables, blending onset rimes, isolating beginning, middle and final phonemes, manipulating phonemes, segmenting words into phonemes and distinguishing between long and short vowel sounds.
- developing decoding and word recognition skills through the study of letters, sounds, and blending of sounds.
- developing comprehension strategies to understand written text by identifying literary elements of characters, setting and plot events; digging deeper into text to make inferences, conclusions and connections between texts; and predicting events, retelling and citing text evidence.
- developing writing skills through opportunities of shared, interactive and independent writing.
