Course Description

The 7th grade language arts curriculum focuses on three main areas: literature, grammar, and composition. Through writing, the students will learn effective usage and recognition of grammatical elements. Teaching of the writing process will encompass several different modes of writing, including narrative writing, informational writing, argumentative writing, and multi-genre writing. In addition, the teaching of literature is aimed for students' responses in subjective, analytic, and evaluative ways.

Major Course Objectives

- The student will be able to write narrative pieces, specific to a purpose and audience, which have clear organizational structure.
- The student will be able to write informational pieces (non-research based and research based), specific to a purpose and audience, which have clear organizational structure.
- The student will be able to write argumentative pieces, specific to a purpose and audience, which have clear organizational structure.
- The student will be able to write with an understanding of focus, content, organization, style and conventions.
- The students will be able to analyze characters, plots, and major themes in a piece of literature to form opinions and reactions.

Major Projects

1st marking period:

Narrative project – journal writing through the eyes of a child of the Holocaust

2nd marking period:

Non-research based informational project

3rd marking period:

Research based informational project – current event project/civil rights project

4th marking period:

Argumentative project – write an argumentative piece and defend the position

Additional Projects:

Possible additional projects: write an environmental children's book, and/or small writing assignments

*At least one of the major writing assignments will be presented as a speech/presentation

*All assignments are subject to change based on student interest and needs and novel connections in literacy class.

Teacher Homework Policy

Homework is given roughly 2-3 nights per week. Late daily homework assignments (that were collected and graded) will be accepted during the current unit only, however, points will be deducted. If the assignment was reviewed in class, the assignment will not be accepted after that point. Large projects and writing assignments will be deducted 5-10% for each day late. After 5 days, a maximum of half credit will be awarded. All assignments are given a point value based on the length and difficulty of the assignment. Students are expected to use their planners to record all assignments on a daily basis.

Teacher Grading Policy

The language arts grade is comprised from the following areas:

- Homework
- Projects
- Tests
- Ouizzes

- Writing Assignments
- Classwork
- Class participation
- Writer's Notebook
- Responsibility

All assignments are given a point value based on the length and difficulty of the assignment. At the conclusion of the marking period, a percentage is calculated.

Points earned divided by *points possible* x 100 = percentage

Example: 465 (points earned) / 500 (points possible) x 100 = 93%

When students are absent, they will be granted extensions for assignments as needed. All assignments will be posted online within 2 weeks of the due date.
