Each year we have only a few slots open to rising 10th grade applicants. We have an enrollment cap for each grade level, therefore we only have slots for 10th graders if current 9th graders choose not to return. Competition is stiff; all who qualify might not be accepted.

To apply please submit an application, transcript, attendance summary, incident report, and both EOC and EOG scores. Applicants are required to make an appointment with South Piedmont Community College to take the College Placement Test (CPT). Final acceptance decisions will be made once all end-of-year documents have been reviewed and the CPT scores have been submitted.

Steps for the Application Process: Application Deadline June 25, 2018

- a) Complete the parent and student portion of the application.
- b) Gather all requested documentations from current high school.
- c) Schedule an appointment with South Piedmont Community College to take the CPT.
- d) Submit application documents from current high school and CPT scores to UCEC.
- e) Wait to be contacted by email from UCEC for the next steps by the end of July.

Take the DRE (Reading, English, Essay) and DMA (Math) sections of the College Placement Test. There is a \$12.00 fee for the tests and <u>an appointment is required</u> to test. Testing will ONLY take place on June 6 at 9am, June 11 at 1pm, June 20 at 9am and June 25 at 1pm.
