Important things to remember...

- Foreign language credit is not required for graduation. However, if you plan to attend a 4-year college immediately after high school, 2 years of a foreign language is required for admission
- The SAT or ACT is required for admission to most 4-year colleges. *If* you plan to attend a community college (Mt. Hood, PCC, Clackamas) you <u>do not</u> need to take the SAT or ACT
- Each year, during forecasting, students take time to choose their courses for next year. Take this seriously and plan for your future!
- Start thinking about your career and college options today. Talk with friends, family and teachers about their educational paths if you are unsure what to do next!
- Money, and paying for college is often the biggest concern when discussing post high school plans. Financial aid is available! Talk with you counselor or the College and Career Center to learn more

What to do after David Douglas HS?

4- Year College: (Examples: Portland State University, University of Oregon, Oregon State University, University of Washington, Stanford)

- Vary in size, cost, admission requirements, and majors offered.
- Need to take College Prep courses such as Foreign Language, Algebra 2/Integrated 3, Science, etc.
- Also need to take the SAT or ACT.

 2 – Year College/Technical Program: (Examples: Mt. Hood Community College, Portland Community College, Clackamas Community College)

- Affordable programs that you can complete in 2 years or less, or you can transfer your credits to a 4 – Year College.
- You will need to complete a College Placement Test (not the SAT or ACT).

Military: (Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marines, Reserves or National Guard)

 Offers qualified individuals a good salary and free job training for service in the military
