Nurse's Note



HELP! What do I do when my student calls and says he/she is sick and needs to come home?

Per school procedure, students who are not feeling well must come to the health office. We will ask their symptoms and assist them to stay in school if appropriate. If they do not feel that they can make it through the school day and/or benefit from their classes, they will be directed to call for parent/guardian permission to go home. We require that we hear the decision directly from you. Use the following chart to guide your decision on whether to send your child to school and when it is safe for them to return after an illness.

I NEED TO STAY HOME IF ...

I have a fever	I am vomiting	I have diarrhea	I have a rash	I have a common contagious illness	I have been in the hospital
Temperature of \geq 100 degrees	Within the past 24 hours	Within the past 24 hours	A rash that may be disease-related or the cause is unknown.	Strep throat, influenza, chicken pox, pertussis, etc.	Hospital stay and/or emergency visit

I have been fever free for at least 24 hours without fever-reducing medication (e.g., Tylenol, Motrin, Advil).	I haven't vomited for at least 24 hours	I haven't had diarrhea for at least 24 hours	Check with your health care provider before sending him/her to school.	Contact the High School Health Office at 226-8606 to discuss disease-specific information.	My medical provider has released me to return to school.

If your child will be absent from school due to illness, vacation, or appointments, etc.

If you need to take your child out of school for an appointment during the school day (call at least **30 minutes before** your pickup time)

If you forgot to call when your child was absent from school

You do not need to come into the school to pick-up your child. They will receive a pass to leave the building from the Attendance Secretary, they will sign themselves out of the building (at the desk located by the student entrance), and meet you at the car. All students **MUST** exit from the student entrance on the east side of the building.

Absence due to Appointments

Students who miss all or parts of a school day due to a dental, medical or other appointments must provide written note from the dental/medical office where they received treatment.

Absences Due to Family Vacations 3 or more days

Students need to pick up the "Parental Requests for Extended Absence" form in the attendance office and have it signed by each of their teachers and their parent(s).

College Visits

Juniors are given one college day and Seniors are given two. They are excused absences, but do count towards the student's total missed attendance days per quarter. Verification of attendance at a post-secondary school is required upon the return of the student to PLHS.

All students: Registration for the 2019-2020 school year will start in January. More information will come from the guidance office about information sessions and classroom visits in the near future.

9th Grade Parents: Students should have completed the Learning Styles assessment and survey on Naviance. If they have not done so yet, please encourage them to finish as soon as possible.

10th Grade Parents: This year we are asking that all students complete two tasks per year using our college and career planning resource, Naviance. For 10th graders their assignment to complete is the Strengths Explorer test found under the Career Tab on Naviance.com. The task will also appear on the home page as an assignment. Once they have completed the test, or if they have completed it already, they will be asked to complete a reflection survey which can be found on the About Me tab.
