PSAT Scores explanation:
12/13 X-block

DECEMBER

- Using PSAT/NMSQT results and materials begin to develop range of colleges
- Talk with graduates who are home from college
- Meet with your counselor to discuss PSAT and plan on which test to take (or go test-optional)

JANUARY

- Junior Seminars begin (1/15-2/26)
- Begin College Process with your counselor
- Begin college search using Naviance
- Attend Junior Assembly w/ Lenny (1/8, advisory)
- Attend Gap Year Fair (1/14, 6 pm)

FEBRUARY

- Attend Junior Night (2/12, 7 pm, parents & students)
- Research interesting summer courses, jobs (Kate Cordner), or activities
- Junior Seminars continue (1/15-2/26)

MARCH

- Attend Junior Guidance Seminars (MCAS week)
- Attend BHS College Fair (3/21, 7 pm)
- Plan challenging but balanced senior year
- Consider taking SAT Subject tests in courses you are finishing this year
- Take SAT Reasoning Test if desired

APRIL

- Schedule a college meeting with your counselor
- Develop a preliminary list of colleges
- Begin college visits
- ACT Exam
- Post BHS Options for Students with Disabilities: 4/2, 7 pm

MAY

- Begin to identify teachers whom you may ask for recommendations
- Explore Early Decision / Early Action options
- AP exams if appropriate
- SAT
- ACT

JUNE

- Take SAT
- Continue college search
- Arrange college visits and/or interviews for summer
- Review scores & plan if you need to take tests again in the Fall

SUMMER

- Continue to work on college list
- Continue extracurricular and community service activities
- Earn money for college
- Start thinking about college essays
- Consider filling out Common App
