- **Scientific calculator** Having a calculator can greatly help with homework and test prep. I recommend the TI-30X IIS (under \$10 many places) or a graphing calculator. We will be using the TI-Nspire CX in class, but it is a bit pricier so another good option is TI-84 Plus CE Silver Editio (the newest version of the TI-84 family). It normally costs over \$125 new, however, it is usually on sale during back-to-school sales for well under \$100. If you cannot get a graphing calculator (new or used) at this time, it is very understandable and I would recommend at least getting the TI-30X IIS scientific calculator if at all possible.

*Please understand that if students demonstrate a lack of ability to perform math operations by hand they may not be permitted to use a calculator until they get help with the basics from me or another math teacher.
