2019-2020 School Improvement Plan Progress Update

PRIORITY AREAS

Priority Area #1

 The Balch Elementary School will participate in piloting Elementary English Language Arts Curriculums and give informative feedback about each one for decision-making purposes.

Status Update

- Teams at grades 2, 4, and 5 participated in this September February pilot and feedback sessions.
- O This goal was 100% complete with the selection of Pearson MyView.

Priority Area #2

 The Balch Elementary School will focus on student writing across the grade levels, especially as it relates to responding to text.

Status Update

- The Balch School staff made significant progress on this goal in the 2019-2020 school year (prior to closure).
- Grade level teams and specialists met during CPT to create rubrics and benchmarks in writing.
- O Grade level writing pieces were graded collaboratively to calibrate expectations.
- MCAS sample writing activities were taught in grades 3-5.

Priority Area #3

The Balch Elementary School will participate in piloting Renaissance Flow 360 in grades 3-5.

Status Update

- Significant progress was made on this goal as grades 3-5 administered Star Assessments in Fall, Winter, and deciding what to do about Spring and the remote learning environment.
- O Renaissance reports were analyzed and used to inform instruction, grouping, and parent/teacher conferences.

Priority Area #4

The Balch Elementary School will continue to work toward improving student learning through the use
of innovative teaching practices.

Status Update

- Balch Teachers continued to move forward with blended and personalized learning opportunities for all students across curriculum areas.
- Two staff members became FUSE early adopters, joining our 4 early adopters from 2018-2019.

• The onset of school closure and Remote Learning exponentially moved all teachers to increase their capacity and abilities in google classroom, screencastify, google sheets, google slides, hyperdocs, google meets, and much more to meet the needs of our students as they participated in their learning from home.

Priority Area #5

 The Balch Elementary School will provide 60 min/week of Common Planning Time (CPT) to all teaching staff.

Status Update

This goal was met with CPT provided 30 minutes twice a week. The schedule will be looked at and tweaked for next school year to allow for the principal to participate in CPT more often.
