Irrefutable research supports that students who read continually over the summer maintain competency both in fluency (the ease with which we read) and comprehension (the ability to read, process, and understand what we read). We encourage students to select books of interest, with parent/guardian approval, to enhance not only their fluency and comprehension but also their desire to read. ## EXPECTATIONS FOR GENERAL SUMMER READING FOR ALL STUDENTS, GRADES 9-12:

All students are encouraged to read four books over the summer. Links are provided below to help students select texts of interest with approval from parents/guardians. For general summer reading, students may read any genre, whether fiction or nonfiction. Students are encouraged to speak with a parent/guardian when selecting texts to ensure that the content is appropriate for them.

In September, students will discuss the books they read over the summer with peers and their teacher. There will be no formal or graded assessment of general summer reading.

Please check the honors and Advanced Placement (AP) summer reading section below. Honors and AP summer reading is assessed and graded. Please check assignments and due dates carefully, which will be updated by June 26, 2020.

## STUDENTS ENROLLED IN ENGLISH HONORS AND/OR ONE OR MORE ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES (ALL AP COURSES):

Students enrolled in any English honors or any Advanced Placement course(s) must complete a separate assignment for these courses and will receive specific instructions for each assignment—including due dates— before the end of the school year. The link to English honors and AP assignments in all subjects/courses will be added to this document by June 26, 2020 emailed to parents/guardians and posted on the Paramus High School website.
