

JUNIOR HIGH LATE WORK POLICY

- Assignments not turned in when they are due will result in the student staying after school that day at 3:34 in Mr. Baca's classroom. Even if work is turned in during the day, there is a 15 minute after school time served.
- Students will be docked 20 percentage points for late homework on the first day* it is late.
- Students will be docked 40 percentage points for late homework on the second day it is late.
- Students will receive a "0" on any paper that is late on the third day.
