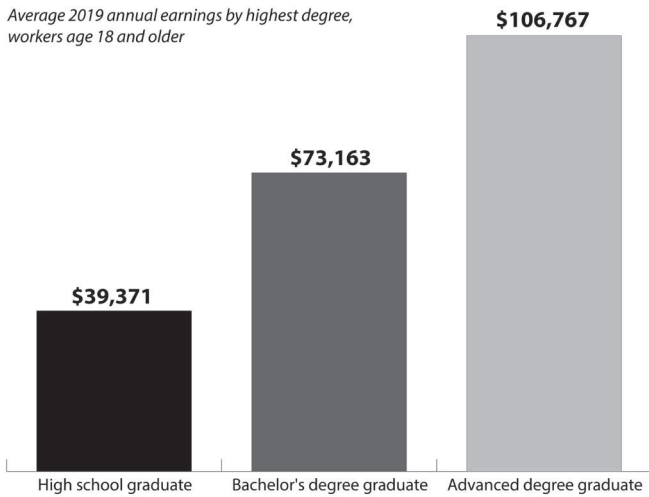

Average 2019 annual earnings by highest degree, workers age 18 and older

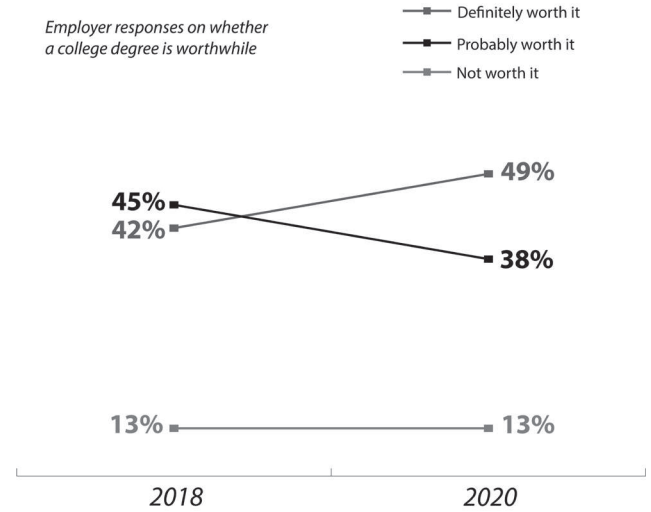

Employer responses on whether a college degree is worthwhile

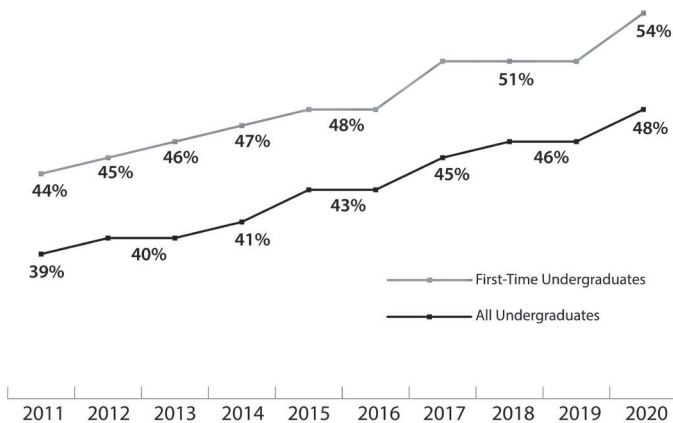

Average percent of tuition covered by institutional grants and scholarships at independent colleges

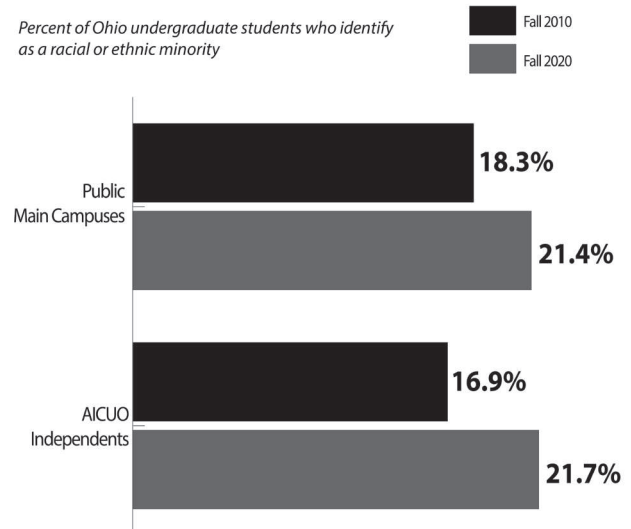

Percent of Ohio undergraduate students who identify as a racial or ethnic minority



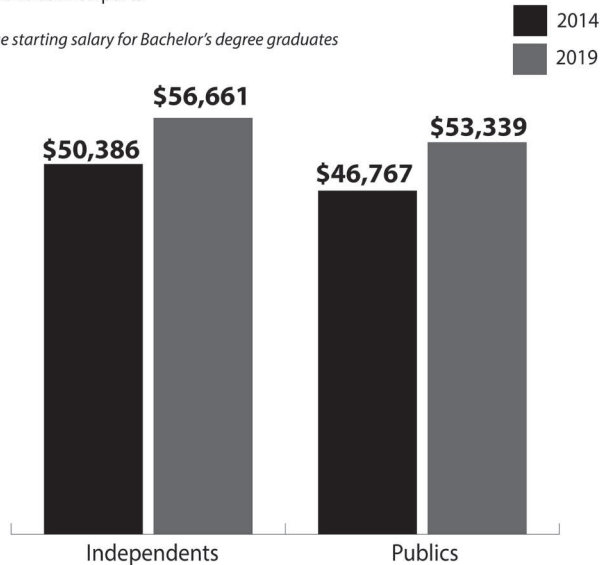

Average starting salary for Bachelor's degree graduates

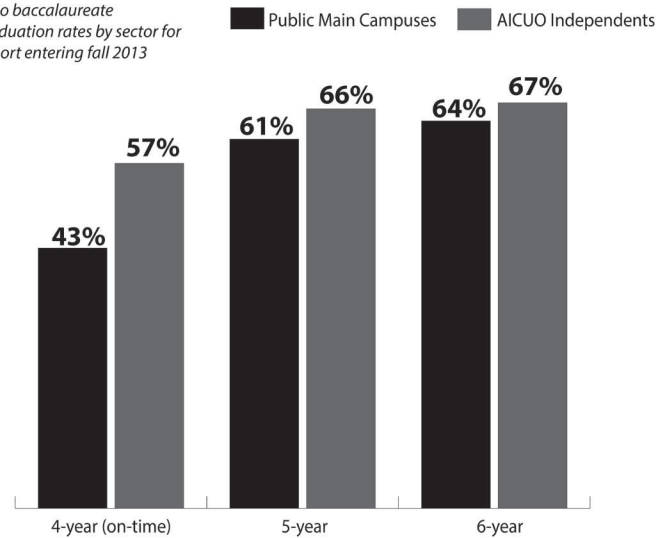

How do I apply for financial aid?

The financial aid step-by-step below provides an overview of the process. You can get started by filing your FASFA at fasfa.gov, which will make you eligible for federal (national), state, and institutional aid.

What types of financial aid are available to me?

Some types of aid are grants/scholarships, while others are loans. Aid can either be need-based or non-need-based (e.g., scholarships for academic achievement, athletics, and/or leadership). Check with the institutions in which you're interested to learn more about what types of aid they offer.

Why is there a difference in price between public and independent institutions?

The cost of providing higher education is generally the same at independent institutions as public. For example, both types of institutions incur costs associated with building and maintaining classrooms, computer facilities, and libraries; paying faculty salaries; and providing career and counseling services. However, independent institutions charge a higher price, or tuition, because they do not receive an instructional subsidy from the state of Ohio.

How much of the total listed tuition cost will I pay?

It depends upon to which institution you apply, but more than 80% of first-year students at independents received an aid package from their institution in addition to aid from federal and state governments. The average institutional aid packaged covered over half the costs of tuition as of 2021.

FINANCIAL AID STEP BY STEP

Step 1: Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at fafsa.gov.

The FAFSA is used to determine your eligibility for federal, state, and institutional aid, such as Pell Grants and Work Study. This video tutorial provides an overview process: bit.ly/usfafsaprocess

Step 2: Complete the College Scholarship Services (CSS) Financial Aid Profile

at cssprofile.collegeboard.org. Including some of Ohio independents, many colleges use this tool to help determine eligibility for financial aid.

Step 3: Review the Student Aid Report (SAR) from the U.S. Department of Education.

You will usually receive this within five days of submitting the FAFSA. The SAR will list your Expected Family Contribution (EFC), which will give you a better idea of how much aid you are eligible for.

Step 4: Review the financial aid offers from the schools you listed on the FAFSA.

Most colleges will send your financial aid offer around the same time as your admission offer. Closely read the materials your school provides and ask any questions you have to an admission counselor.

Step 5: Accept the financial aid award offered by the school you plan to attend.

Step 6: Let your school know if you receive outside scholarships and grants.

You can search for local scholarships through employers, government and community organizations, or by using online scholarship databases.

Step 7: Complete any forms required to secure the aid awarded by your school.

How Do I Pay for College?

What is the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and why is it important?

The EFC is the number used to determine how much you and your family are expected to pay towards your college education. The EFC formula is calculated by the federal government after you complete the FAFSA and stays the same from school to school. Your demonstrated need, or the gap between the EFC and cost of attendance, changes depending on total school price (e.g., tuition, room and board, or off-campus living expenses, and textbooks). See the table below for an example. All institutions strive to award aid to meet the gap between the cost of attendance and your EFC, but not all have the same types or amounts of aid available.

File your FAFSA as early as possible to ensure your eligibility for financial aid.

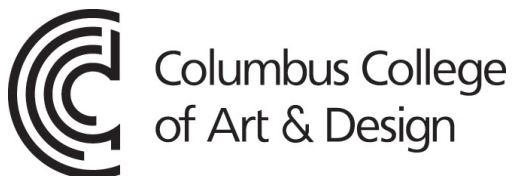

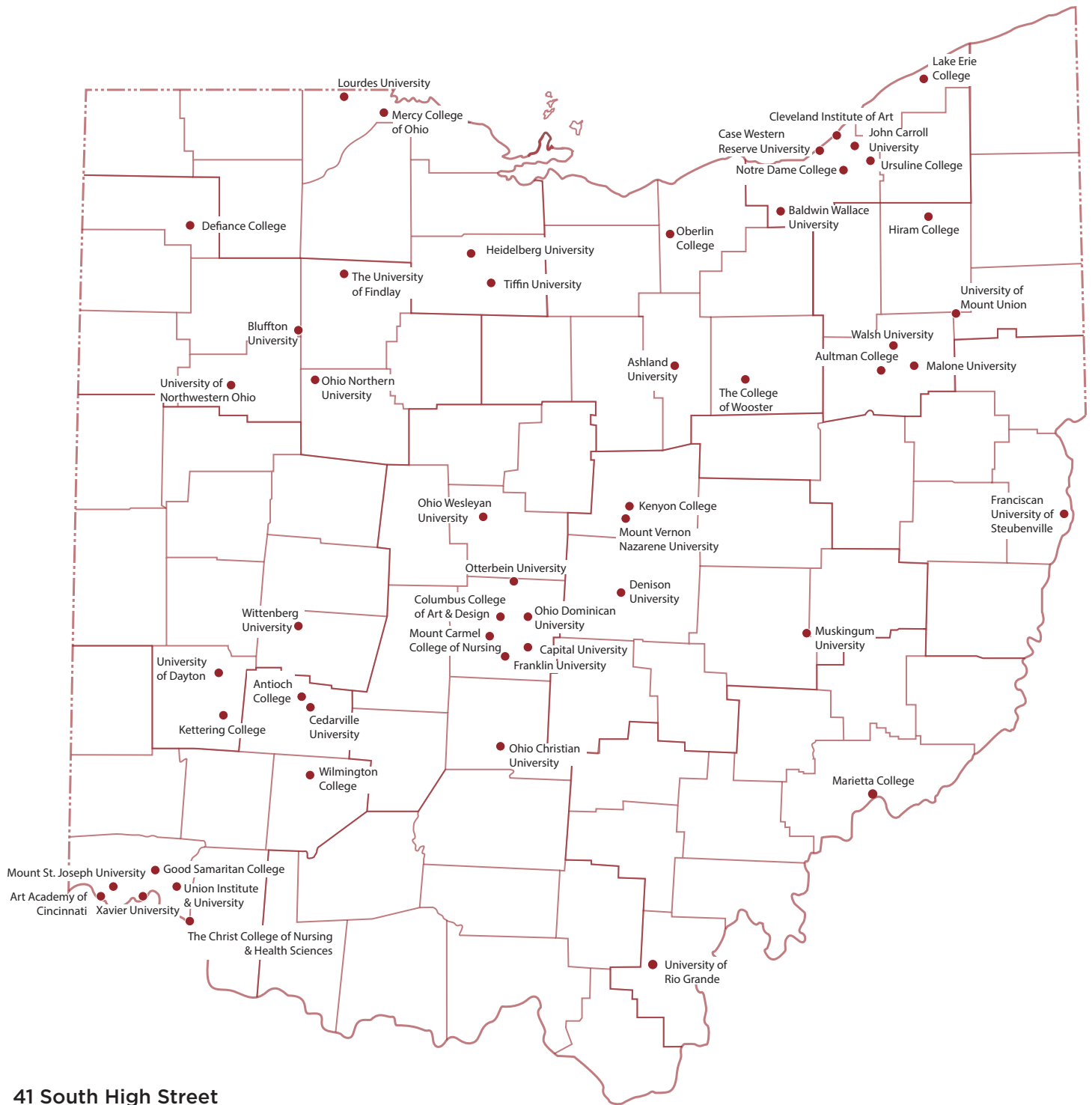
