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Requirements: Materials and Supplies

Materials/Supplies: Students are required to bring the following items to class everyday:

- Pencils (Ink cannot be erased!)
- 3 ring binder/Folder
- Chromebook/access to Google Classroom
- Calculator (BV issues ONE Texas Instruments TI-30IIS to every student.)

Rules & Classroom Management Policies:

Students are expected to come to class everyday prepared and ready to learn with a positive attitude. Students are required to act in a behavior conducive to learning, according to Blacklick Valley Schools code of conduct, and those rules established by Blacklick Valley Jr./Sr. High School. If students are not able to follow the rules, they will be disciplined according to the steps and procedures detailed in the Student Handbook.

Classroom Grading & Evaluation Policy:

The mathematics department will be weighting grades using the following categories:

Classwork: Participation in class activities and class assignments are important to informally assess student learning and understanding. All students are expected to participate in class. Participating in note-taking is a part of the class experience. Students are expected to take notes in their textbooks or on Google Classroom. Students are responsible for any work missed during class.

Homework: Students will receive homework Monday-Thursday to enforce key math concepts. Time is usually given at the end of the class to complete most of the assignment. Homework is due the next day, unless otherwise specified by the teacher. Any work that is not completed within 3 days will be graded as a ZERO. Homework can either be graded as a participation or graded homework.

Quizzes/Tests: You will have approximately one quiz per week and 2-3 tests in a 9-week period. Quizzes may be paper/pencil or through Get More Math. All tests will be paper/pencil and MUST be taken in my classroom. No online versions will be available. A test will be given at the conclusion of every Chapter. Students will have an in class review the day before the test, which will include sample test questions. Tests should be completed independently. Using notes, talking, or cheating during a test is **NOT** allowed. If a student is found doing such things, he/she will receive a 0% on the test and cannot make up the test.

Final Exams: All students will take the final exam at the end of the course.

Late/Make-Up Work:

Students are responsible for obtaining any missed work when they are absent. It is the students' responsibility to complete it and turn it in within a timely manner. Notes and other missing assignments must be obtained from another student or can be obtained by seeing the teacher directly. Students will have **TWO (2) DAYS** to make up missing assignments, tests, and/or quizzes.

Extra Credit Policy & Procedures:

Extra credit assignments are given periodically, and are for all students. Students have a choice whether they would like to participate or not. Extra credit will be offered at the teacher's discretion. Students should not rely on extra credit as a means for getting a high grade in the class, or as a means to pass the class as the end of a grading period approaches.

Tutoring:

- ✓ After-school tutoring will be available throughout the school year. Please utilize this when necessary.
- ✓ Homeroom/Google Classroom (7:15-8:00)
- ✓ 10th period homeroom (1:50-2:20) is a great time to make up your missing work and exams. Please make arrangements to attend. I will sign a pass for individual students.

Cell Phones:

The mathematics classrooms are **ALL RED ZONES (No cell phones permitted unless authorized by the teacher) for in-person instruction.** Students may place their cell phone in the calculator caddy hanging in the back of my room or they may leave their cell phones locked in their lockers. If a student has a cell phone out in class without permission, it **WILL BE CONFISCATED** and turned in to the office. Chromebooks/cell phones are permitted to participate in teacher-approved exercises. (Kahoot, Get More Math, etc.)
