Prior Lake-Savage Middle School: A Partnership

Two Buildings...Two Schools...One Campus

- **Hidden Oaks** and **Twin Oaks** (TOMS/HOMS) staff collaborate weekly to ensure practices/content are similar
- Shared Busing - buses pick up by neighborhood, not by school
- Potential of traveling between schools for classes
- Staff monitor the crosswalk to ensure safety
- Shared sports/clubs



Daily Schedule

- School day is from 7:25 AM - 2:06 PM
 - *Unless your child is staying after school with a teacher or attending an after school program, they need to get on their bus, get ride or walk home safely.*
- Six (53 minute) classes and an advisory/lunch period.
- Schedule allows 5 minutes passing time to accommodate for street crossing
- WIN Time on Wednesdays:
 - Shortened class schedule to allow for 30 minutes at the end of the day for extra support and flexible learning options

Registration Steps

STEP 1:

Carefully review the course descriptions (on the web site) to make your selections.

STEP 2:

The week of March 4th and 5th, Middle School School Counselors will visit 5th grade classrooms. Students will receive a registration form. A parent signature is required on the form.

STEP 3:

Registration forms are to be returned to your child's 5th grade teacher by March 12th .

STEP 4:

Please submit a written request to your school's counseling office for scheduling needs or special accommodations for your student by March 12th.

- Advanced Courses are designed to meet the needs of students who are motivated, highly capable and require higher levels of academic challenge.



Course Placement Guidelines

ADVANCED COURSES (continued)...

- While in middle and high school, it is important that each student be provided with an appropriate level of challenge.
- To match students' academic readiness a placement consideration process is used.
- Variables considered to determine which students would be placed in each Advanced Course sequence
 - *the number of placed students*
 - *class size*
 - *staffing*
 - *previous classroom and assessment performance*

Course Placement Guidelines

ADVANCED COURSES (*continued*)...

Advanced Courses in English, Science and Social Studies:

- *Same outcomes and curriculum as mainstream courses*
- *Variations in pacing, depth and complexity of study*
- *Increased level of expectation regarding student work*

Advanced Math Courses:

- *Are designed to accelerate students through the curriculum*
- *Faster pace and added depth of content*



Spring/Summer Transition Events

In May:

1. Students will be sent a letter notifying them of middle school placement.
2. 5th grade students will get an introduction to their new middle school and have a Q & A session with school counselors and current students.
3. Spring parent meeting (TBD date) at each school to introduce families to their specific school and provide more information regarding student support and the transition to middle school.

Spring/Summer Transition Events

In August:

The week before school we will hold “Back To School Night”, where students and parents/guardians can meet the teachers.

WEB program (*Where Everybody Belongs*):

- Summer orientation day for incoming 6th graders
- Pairs 6th graders with an 8th grade mentor.
- It is a morning full of fun activities and sharing of school information.

Additional information with the exact date/time will be sent in the spring.
