

2021 Weddington Optimist Scholarship Program

Scholarship History:

The Weddington Optimist Scholarship Program began in the Spring of 1997. The scholarship started with a laptop computer awarded to one school (Sun Valley). Over the years it expanded to all eleven Union County High schools. Today, the program consists of 5 X \$2,000 cash scholarships awarded to five deserving high school seniors across Union County. Eligible schools are: CATA, Cuthbertson, Forest Hills, Marvin Ridge, Monroe, Parkwood, Piedmont, Porter Ridge, Sun Valley, Union Academy and Weddington High School.

Requirements:

This scholarship is open to high school seniors who will be graduating in the Spring 2021. Graduating Seniors will have to be accepted in a 2 or 4-year higher education institution in the fall of 2021. The Weddington Optimists are looking for individuals who will be enthusiastic and optimistic that the scholarship will help them meet their life goals as they embark on new life experiences.

Answer the following question on page 2 by writing a 2-page essay. Essay should be double spaced, 1-inch margins and font size no larger than 12. Bold words are allowed. Please include your full name, date, high school and guidance counselor's name in the essay's header. File format doc or pdf will be accepted.

Essays are due on March 17, 2021 at 5:00 pm to your Scholarship Guidance Counselor. Guidance counselors will pick 2 essays and will forward them to The Weddington Optimist Club by March 31, 2021. Winners will be selected by the Weddington Optimist Club by April 26, 2021.

Other information:

A Scholarship Winners' meet-and-greet at the Weddington Optimist Club outside picnic shelter on May 13, 2021 at 7:00 pm. Winners, family members and counselors are invited. The meet-and-greet will depend on the status of Covid-19 mandates.

Summary of Important dates:

March 17th – Essay due to scholarship guidance counselor (this date is flexible per your guidance counselor). March 31st – Essays due to Weddington Optimist Club. This will give us time to review essays before determining the winners.

April 26th – Winners will be announced to the school's contact.

May 13th – Scholarship winners meet-and-greet at Weddington Optimist Park.
