



Kindergartners are under the sea

Kinder-kiddos spent the last two weeks learning about the ocean habitat and the animals that live and grow there. Students shared what they knew about various ocean creatures and learned new facts from non-fiction stories. Writing skills were practiced by recalling interesting facts learned about each animal and writing them down. They also took time to create crafts for some of the animals. It's hard to say which ocean animal is the favorite, they are all pretty cool. Ask your kinder to share some ocean animal facts with you!

First graders and the human body

The 1st-graders in science/ health have been learning all about the Human Body. Throughout this unit, students are taught how each body system works and the parts that help our body move, grow and learn each day. The students learned all about the brain, heart, lungs, stomach, small intestines, large intestines, and kidneys. To help learn the location of these systems Miss Gotz's students partnered up to create paper models of where these body parts are located on a life-size 1st grader. The students also learned how we can help our bodies by making healthy choices and exercising each day.

Fourth grade and figurative language

Classroom 800 was transformed into a fine dining establishment for the day while students were given samples of seven different foods. As students snacked on their treats, they wrote a different type of figurative language about each food that described its texture, smell, or taste. The Poprocks and marshmallows were fan favorites. It was an engaging way for students to demonstrate their knowledge at the end of the unit!
