


MATH PLACEMENT & PROGRESSION

The first step in providing a meaningful education for student is the determination of appropriate coursework. The faculty of ROCORI schools will utilize data gained from student records to determine the appropriate placement of students in core academic subjects. The school's Response to Intervention (RtI) Team has an objective data-driven process to place students in the appropriate core courses.

Math Course Progression: Many students and parents are concerned with math course placement in the middle school and how it translates to future opportunities in the high school. The chart below identifies the typical progression of math courses in the different tracks. Students who qualify to take prealgebra in grade 6, algebra in grade 7, and geometry in grade 8 have consistently performed at or above the 90th percentile on standardized assessments, including their three most recent standardized assessments. RMS uses data from assessment results and trends for individual students when placing them math courses. RMS uses data from the Minnesota Comprehensive Assessments (MCAs) and the STAR test.




- Math and Reading SOAR Classes


