General Information:

You must contact your counselor before you register for summer school to make sure you are enrolled in the correct class/es.

Upon failure of a course, students in Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools may elect to retake the course to demonstrate mastery and earn credit through **credit recovery**. This is verified by a failing mark on a transcript as the official record.

Grade Suppression - Students who have failed a class and elect to <u>retake</u> a class for new credit during Summer Programming will have the original, **failing grade** removed (suppressed) from their transcript and the newly earned numeric grade will be entered. This will have an impact on the GPA. **Only a** *failing grade can be suppressed*.

- Summer School will be held in two phases:
 - Phase I June 13 June 30 and July11 (13 days)
 - The last day for registration and to begin work is June 16 at 3PM

******There are no classes July 4 – 7 *****

• Phase II July 12 – August 3 (13 days)

The last day for registration and to begin work is July 14 at 3PM

- Summer School hours are 8 AM 2 PM Monday Thursday
 - Please note that because courses are offered via Edgenuity students may work at any time, but teachers will only be available for support on Monday – Thursday from 8AM – 2PM.
- Classes will be blended via Edgenuity a combination of in person and Zoom
- Lab support will be available at school Monday Thursday from 8AM 2PM
- Students must attend at least 4 hours of Zoom instruction each week
- Students who are not making progress and fall behind will be *required* to come into the building to complete work in order to remain enrolled in summer school.
- Transportation and meals will not be provided.

Course offerings:

Credit Recovery – Credit recovery can only be used for a course which has been previously failed OR if they received a WC19. If a student has never taken a course, they <u>cannot</u> take the CR course. Upon completion of the course the student will receive a grade of **P** or **F**. This will have no impact on the GPA, but the grade will be reflected on the transcript.

Grade Suppression - Students who elect to retake a class for new credit during Summer Programming will have the original, failing grade removed (suppressed) from their transcript. <u>Grade Replacement/Suppression Form</u> must be completed for students and parent/guardian who elect to take a New Coursework in order to suppress a grade.
