In addition, they will provide information during the year to give teachers and parents a better picture of where students are succeeding and where they need help. This Field Test will help ensure the assessments are accurate and fair for all students. The Field Test also will provide teachers and schools a chance to practice test administration procedures in advance of the first operational assessments in spring 2015. We are one of several schools in the state chosen to participate in the field test. This is an exciting time of North Dakota and Montpelier HS as we move into a new era of public education.
