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#### **New Meal Plan**

As you all have probably heard our food service program has changed! Our federal government has set new

regulations for meals served at schools that participate in the USDA school meal program. Our meals are subsidized by the federal government; therefore, we are mandated to these new changes through the 2010 Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids' Act.

The government has

reviewed many inquiries about hot lunch programs that are provided in the school system. Many committees have discussed that fat content that is in meals and not enough fruits and vegetables. One of the big changes will be no transfats in the meal plan. We will be offering more in the sub groups of

vegetables. Such as the green, red/ orange, legumes and starchy items. You will see more whole grain than white

breads and pastas.

Also, along with the meal our children can go back for seconds but will have to pay a price for the entrée. This price includes people that are on free/reduced plans, also. They will have to pay for the second helping out of pocket. If you feel you can not pay for the second entrée, please let the office know and your child (ren) will not go back for the second time through. Also, please

have a conversation with your child(ren) if you do not wish for them to go back for a second entrée. All the children will be able to go back to the salad bar as many times as they want without any costs. The board has decided to charge \$1.25 for the second helping. The second entrée will be billed to you on a

monthly basis. However, if you fall behind on your payment after the second month than your child will not be able to receive the second entrée. The Montpelier students have a heads up on all of this because they have been introduced to most of the good changes of eating habits last year. It is surprising how well these children have adapted to good eating while here at the school. We need to get them to continue good eating habits into their adult life. Thank you for your understanding in this situation. There was a notice sent out in your back to school packet.

### **Unpaid Milk Break and Lunch Bills**

There will be a

\$1.25 charge for

a second entrée.

The elementary students are allowed to have milk in the afternoon with their

snacks. Starting this year, if your bill has not been paid before school, your child will not be permitted to have an afternoon milk. The balances are either getting out of control or have been a negative balance for more than a year.

Once the balance has been paid, your child will be able to have milk in the

afternoon with their snack.
Julie has been sending out
lunch bills that include the
charge for extra milk on a
monthly basis. We ask that
you pay your bill on a
monthly basis. If you can not

pay the full bill or need to wait for a

paycheck, please call Julie at the school and arrangements can be made. If an arrangement is made, it will continue until the balance is paid off. However, if a payment is missed the full amount will be due immediately.
