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Summerfield Jr./Sr. High School Annual Education Report (AER)

January 2, 2024

Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2022-2023 educational progress for the Summerfield Junior/Senior High School.

The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-2024 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-2023. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-2022. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-2022.

Some schools, like Summerfield Junior/Senior High School, are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

State law further requires that we report on the following additional information:

1. **Process for Assigning Pupils to the School:** All students in grades 7-12 are assigned to Summerfield Junior/Senior High School.
2. **The Status of the 3-5 Year School Improvement Plan:** The school improvement plan is annually reviewed and updated by our school improvement team.

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Goal: Address student concerns and deficits in the areas of learning culture (problem solving, grit, stamina, application of knowledge) and social emotional learning (purposeful planning).

Challenge Statement: IF we engage in authentic, intention, and purposefully planned instruction to create a positive mindset and learning culture, THEN we will be able to better meet the social, emotional, and academic needs of our learners and would expect to see an increase in academic stamina, student engagement, and growth.

3. **A Brief Description of Each Specialized School:** Summerfield Junior/Senior High School offers an excellent academic program for all students in grades 7-12, with extensive use of technology. All of our instructional staff are rated as highly qualified for all of their academic courses.
