In 2023, the varsity baseball team finished second in Division 1-4A with an overall record of 17-13. They competed in the second round of the state playoffs before losing to West Lauderdale. The team also had three student-athletes selected as all-stars by the Northeast Mississippi Coaches Association for Better Baseball (NEMCABB) and two student-athletes selected as a North/South All Star.

Additionally, Samuel Curtis, Ben Austin, Madden Butler, Grady Mitchell, and Eli Burciaga were named First Team All Division. The Division 1-4A Offensive Player of the Year was Griffin Enis and the Division 1-4A Pitcher of the Year was Ethan Huff. Three student-athletes also signed to play baseball at the collegiate level.

"2023 was very special season led by a special group of young men," said Head Coach Kevin Williams. "Our guys worked hard every day and competed even harder every game that they took the field. The 2023 team played the toughest schedule we have ever had here at Corinth High School, and they rose to the challenge every time the lights came on. We have a great core group of guys returning from last year's team and fantastic leadership. I am very excited to see the fruits of all of their hard work from this off-season."

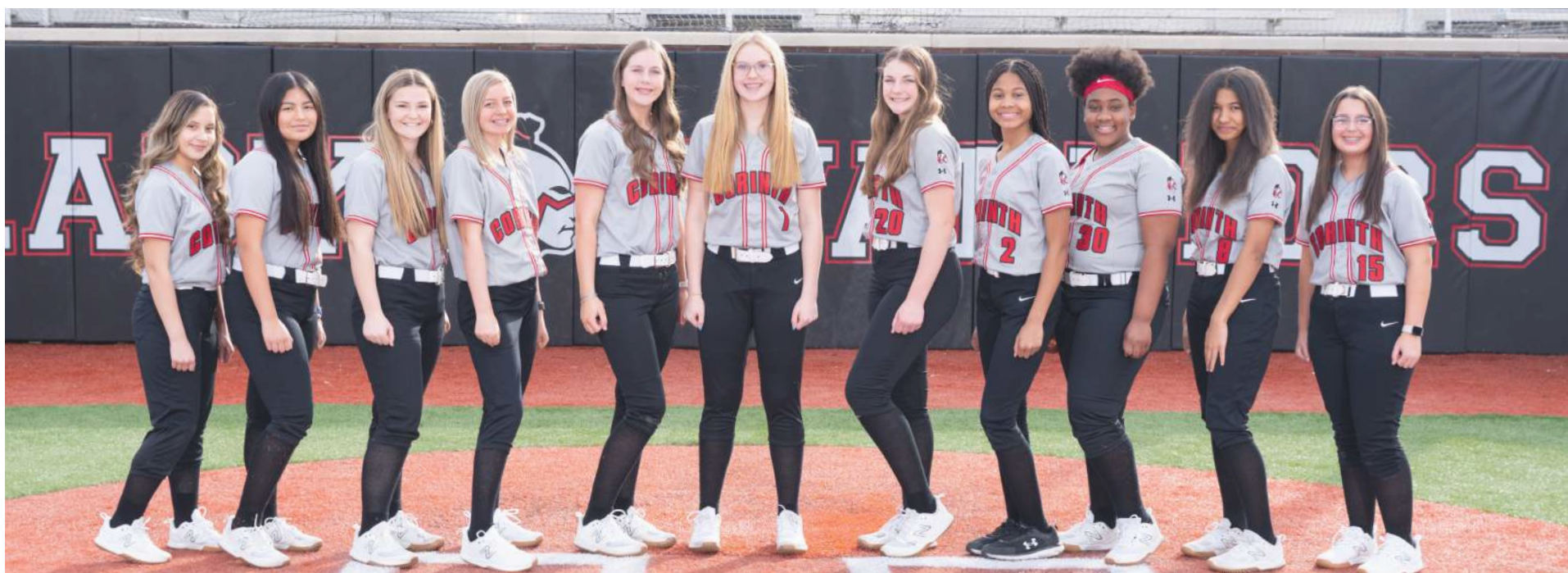

Last year, the Lady Warriors finished the season with a 17-7 record. They were able to capture the Division 1-4A Championship for the second year in a row, before ending their playoff run against a tough Kosciusko team in the 3rd round of playoffs. Lady Warriors are returning with a lot of experience from last year's team. Anna Hudson is the lone senior that graduated from the 2023 squad.

Kinley Pittman and Callie Pounders did a phenomenal job on the mound this past year, and we are looking to have another strong year from them as well this season. Corinth saw a bunch of Lady Warriors bring home division awards in 2023. Kinley Pittman was honored as the Division 1-4A Most Valuable Player, Callie Pounders received 1-4A Pitcher of the Year, and Lainey Briggs was Defensive Player of the Year. These three, along with Lylah Cox, Addyson Moore, and Maggie Parchman, made the 1-4A All-Division Team. Alyssa Settlemires and McKinley Moore also made the 1-4A 2nd Team All-Division Team.

Even though the Lady Warriors have moved up to 5A this year, Head Coach Maggi Vondenstein is still expecting big things from her squad. "This team is a fun group to coach. They have worked the hardest of any I've coached before," said Vondenstein. "They know what they are capable of and know they can compete with any team they step on a field with. The 2022-23 track season ended the best way possible. Corinth had more students participate in the state track meet than ever before and the boys team brought home a runner-up title. At the state meet, the students received three school records, one state record (4A in boys 4x800m relay with 8:19.92), four gold medals (Girls 4x800m Relay, Boys 4x800m Relay, Boys 4x400m Relay, Boys Pole Vault) and three bronze medals (Boys Pole Vault, Boys 3200m, Boys 1600m).

“On both the girls and boys teams, we saw tremendous improvement across all events,” said Head Coach Luke Hatcher. “We are bringing back a very deep distance group and pole vault group that made it to the state meet last year. On the girls distance side, Andi Kate Holley and Elsie Wilbanks will lead and push our team to becoming something very special.”

The team also has some young and new talent with the addition of sprinter and 400m runner Maddie Gray that will be one of the senior focal points on our sprinting side. The boys are bringing back a group of sophomores now juniors in Sam Evans, JT Draper, and Ricardo Venegas that will be important in driving our distance group. We also are looking very strong through our pole vault groups led by JB Labas, Briley Briggs, and Reid Williams.

“I look for this season to be special! We have a great group of coaches all with the same goal in mind,” said Hatcher. “Coach Dye, Coach Harris, and myself have a plan to make this season special and chase after a couple of state titles come May. As a team you have to be solid as a whole, from sprints to distance to throws to jumps. It takes a tight knit group all with the same goal in mind to accomplish the task of winning a state championship. We have the athletes to do it and the plan in place, so now I look forward to watching them as we begin that journey to winning a state title!”

6th Grade Beginning Band is an introduction on learning how to play instruments, while applying basic music theory, and music history concepts through a method book and beginning band concert literature. 7th and 8th Grade Band reviews and expands knowledge of music theory, music history, and technique on instruments by preparing to perform on a high school level.

The middle school band performs at selected middle school football games, middle school pep rallies, the Christmas parade, the Christmas concert, selected band clinics, the Spring Festival Ratings, and the spring concert. The 7th and 8th grade band participates in a Spring Band Festival for ratings each year. This year the middle school band received superior ratings (the highest rating) at the ICC Band Festival.

"Our middle school band has worked extremely hard this year and are continuing to prepare for their festival performance and spring concerts," said Allison Tutor, CMS band director. "Learning how to play an instrument is a lifelong skill and I am so grateful for the opportunity to teach our students the value of music. I can't wait to see these students grow as musicians throughout their years in school."





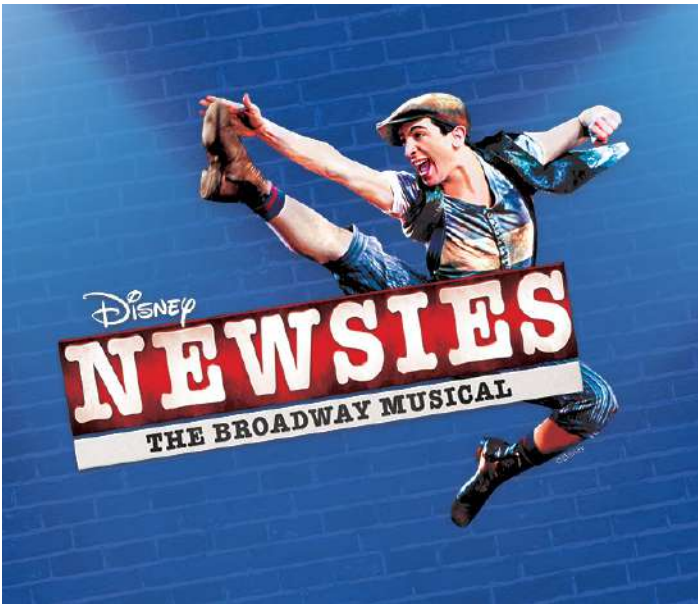
