ATHLETIC PHYSICALS

**Please Note: The Activities Director's Office is located at the
Huron Arena, 353-6970
150-5th Street SW**

All students (Grades 7-12) participating in the athletic program must have a physical examination. Physicals are valid for three years from date taken unless noted by health care provider. Students new to the Huron District are required to obtain this triennial (3-year) physical from their physician. A rotation of physicals was established so that each year incoming 7th and 10th graders are in line to need physicals.

The physical forms and pre-participation permit forms can be picked up in the Activities Office in the Huron Arena or the High School or Middle School offices. This form must be completed and taken to a local clinic where the physical is being taken. The local clinics have the physical forms. After the physical is completed, both the pre-participation form and the physical form can be turned in at the Activities Office in the Arena or given to the coach on the first day of practice.

Athletes in grades 9-12 must also take the ImPACT Test. Also middle school athletes who plan to participate in football, soccer, wrestling, cheer/dance and gymnastics must also take the ImPACT test prior to the start of the season. The ImPACT test baseline is good for two years. The test will take 30-40 minutes.

All paperwork, physicals, and ImPACT testing must be completed and turned in prior to the start of practice.

SCHOOL NUTRITION PROGRAM

School lunches and breakfasts are available to all students in kindergarten through grade twelve. Breakfast and lunch will be served on the first day of school. All students paying full or reduced meal prices should plan to deposit money at your student's open house or on the first day of school to ensure a positive meal account balance. Money can also be deposited online through Titan at <https://lingconnect.com>. On Titan you can also check account balances, set reminders and notifications for low balances.

SCHOOL BUS REMINDERS FOR PARENTS

1. See that your child is at his/her bus stop at least 5 minutes prior to pick up time.
2. Make sure that your KG-5 grade student has their ZPass each day. Please continue to remind them of the importance and the mandated use of the ZPass.
3. Teach your child to obey the bus driver.
4. Accompany the very young to the bus stop and meet them on their return.
5. Supervise and train your child early on in safety practices and proper conduct for riding the bus.
6. Cooperate with the disciplinary measures set up by your school officials – your direct line of communication with your school principal.
7. The driver is a member of your school system and merits the respect and courtesy due of all school personnel.
8. If your child has a friend coming home with him/her; or, if your child will be going to a different address, please send written notification or call the bus garage (605-353-6989) to let the bus driver know that he/she has permission to do so. If we do not have written permission, we will not honor the child's request.

SCHOOL BUS REMINDERS FOR STUDENTS

1. Do not stand in the roadway.
2. Do not crowd or push to get on or off the bus.
3. Wait for the bus to stop before getting out of your seat.
4. Go immediately to the seat assigned to you.
5. Do not change seats while the bus is in motion.
6. Keep all parts of your body inside the bus at all times while on the bus.
7. Don't be a litterbug on the bus or on the road.
8. Obey your driver promptly and cheerfully.
9. Avoid being loud or boisterous.
10. Do not talk to the driver while the bus is moving.
11. Do not damage any equipment and report anything dangerous to the driver.
12. In case of trouble, remain calm and stay in your seat (unless otherwise told differently).
13. Keep the aisles clear.
14. Be a courteous passenger at all times – be careful and help others.
15. Take care of the smaller riders.
16. Do not open or close windows without permission from the driver. Use the "2 click" rule.
17. Do not throw anything out of the windows.
18. Be absolutely quiet when the bus approaches a railroad crossing.
19. All tobacco products, alcohol, drugs and anything resembling a weapon are forbidden on all school buses.
20. Obey the school and bus patrol at all times.
21. Learn how to get off the bus quickly when told to do so.
22. The emergency door at the rear of the bus is to be used only when there is a real emergency.
23. After you leave the bus, don't loiter – go straight home.
24. Be extra careful when the weather is bad.
25. To cross a highway or street, go to the front of the bus and wait for a signal from the driver, look both ways for approaching vehicles, and cross only when it is clear.

School Bus Video Camera Policy

Use of Video Cameras on School Buses

The goal of the Huron school district is for every student to have a safe, comfortable, and orderly ride to and from school. In order to promote appropriate behavior while riding buses, students are required to conform to certain guidelines for riding the bus as established by the administration in coordination with the transportation coordinator. Video/audio monitoring provides an additional method to further ensure the safety and security of students relating to timely and appropriate corrective action for violations of bus regulations. The district will utilize video cameras in school buses as a management tool for students, and as an educational tool to enhance the performance of drivers.

REGISTRATION

ELEMENTARY:

Elementary students attending the Huron Public Schools will register for school on Thursday, August 3rd and Friday, August 4th (between 9:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.) at their respective schools.

Newcomers to a district should register at the school serving their child's grade level. **Birth certificates and immunization records are required** by State Law for all students **new to the Huron district**.

Parents who have not registered their child(ren) are asked to contact their building principal as soon as possible.

KINDERGARTEN:

By State Law, children **must be five years of age on or before September 1** before they can enter kindergarten. State Law requires that an original, certified copy of the birth certificate must be presented at the time of enrollment. A copy must be provided for the child's school file.

COLONY SCHOOLS: Huron and Riverside Colony students, grades 1-8 will report to their respective schools on August 17th.

MIDDLE SCHOOL:

Students **new** to the school district should contact the middle school principal's office immediately if they have not already registered. (7:30 AM – 4:00 PM) 1045 18th St. SW (605-353-6900)

Note: Student school pictures for **6th, 7th, and 8th grades** will be taken during the school day on August 29th with retakes on October 11th.

Reminder: Parent Advisory Meetings – everyone is welcome to attend. Regular monthly meetings/one hour/date and time to be determined.

HIGH SCHOOL:

High school schedules will be available at open house at 7:00 p.m. on August 9th. They can be picked up at the High School Office after August 16th. If students would like to request a schedule change, they should go to the high school website and complete the Schedule Change Request Form. The high school office is open from 7:00 a.m. - 12 noon/1:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m.

High school students **NEW** to the district may call to request registration forms or stop by to the high school office any day between the hours of 7:00 a.m.-12:00 and/or 1:00 p.m.-4:00 p.m. to pick them up. (605-353-7800)

SPECIAL EDUCATION: Each school district in South Dakota is to develop and utilize a system for identifying, locating, and evaluating children in need of special education or special education and related services. The system must include all children residing within the jurisdiction of the district who are ages birth through 21 years regardless of the severity of their disability, including children in all public and private agencies, and institutions, private schools, including religious schools, and children receiving alternative instruction under SDCL 13-27-3 within the legal boundaries of the district. It should be noted that the collection and use of this information/data is kept confidential as required in SDCL 14:05:29.

In order to identify, locate, and evaluate any children, birth through 21 years of age, this notice is being published as part of the Huron Public Schools **Child Identification Process**. Anyone interested in more information about the identification process should call the office of special services, 605-353-6997.

All students who were enrolled in special education programs during the 2022-2023 school year and plan to return to the Huron Public Schools must register at their respective schools according to the dates identified earlier in this article. Any NEW STUDENTS to the district who have been identified as in need of special education services in their previous school district should also enroll at their respective schools.

Transportation will be provided for students receiving special education that were deemed eligible for transportation according to documentation in their Individual Education Plan (IEP). If parents/guardians have any questions about transportation, they should call the special services office (605-353-6997) at the time their child registers in August.

MEDICAL INFORMATION NEEDED: South Dakota State Law mandates that students who are not immunized must be excluded from attending school until the immunization records are complete. The records must include current and up-to-date immunizations/vaccinations for **polio, tetanus, measles, diphtheria, whooping cough, and chicken-pox**. Upon recommendation from the Department of Health, the school immunization requirement has been changed to require all school-age children (K-12) to receive 2 doses of MMR (measles-mumps-rubella) beginning with the 1997-98 school year. Students who started first grade during or after the 1993-94 school year were required to have 2 doses of MMR at the time of kindergarten entry and will not need any further immunizations. A physical examination report from the family physician is requested.

BIRTH CERTIFICATE REQUIREMENTS: State Law requires that an original, certified copy of the birth certificate must be presented within 30 days of enrollment in the public schools. If a copy of the birth certificate is deemed unattainable, an affidavit in lieu of the birth certificate may be submitted.

INCLEMENT WEATHER

- The Huron Board of Education has appointed the superintendent – and in his absence his designee, to determine when school is called off, the start is delayed, or students are sent home early due to inclement weather. The following steps will be followed:
 - The staff will receive an e-mail.
 - A message will be placed on the Superintendent's Facebook Page "Huron #2-2 Supt" and on Twitter @HuronSDSchools
 - All Performance Radio stations will be notified – usually will broadcast based on above Tweet.
 - Television stations notified include KELOLAND and Dakota News Now.
 - An announcement will be placed on "Campus Messenger" call system.
- The ultimate decision as to whether or not an individual student goes to school during inclement weather is the responsibility of the parent. If the parent decides weather conditions are such that the child should not go to school, a note to the principal will excuse the child for the time missed; however, the absence will still be counted.
- In the rare event that school is in operation and the buses do not operate in the rural area, the teachers and administrators realize that rural students are absent not because of their choosing and that school work and related activities shall be governed by that fact.

The Huron school district will not discriminate in any of its policies and programs on the basis of age, race, color, creed, national origin, ancestry, religion, sex, marital status, or disability, and will not violate any provisions of applicable federal programs, statutes or regulations (e.g., Title IX, Title I, Rehabilitations Act, Americans with Disabilities [ADA], Section 504).

YOUR LEGAL RIGHTS:

Law requires us to release the directory information of our juniors and seniors to all branches of the military. The legislation allows parents and students to request to have their name withheld from those directory lists. We are required by law to notify you of this option.

If you desire to have your name removed from the military list, please notify the counselor.

FAMILY EDUCATIONAL RIGHTS AND PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education.

FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records. These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level. Students to whom the rights have transferred are "eligible students."

Students in Grades 1-12 will return to the classroom on Thursday, August 17th for a regular day of school. Kindergarten classes will begin on Wednesday, August 23rd at 8:15 a.m. Kindergarten readiness screenings will be conducted August 17th through August 22nd. Parents will receive appointment notifications prior to school beginning.

On August 17th – 6th, 7th, and 8th grade students are to report to homeroom at 8:05 a.m.

On August 17th all 9th grade students will go to the auditorium at 8:05 a.m. Grades 10, 11, and 12 will meet in homerooms starting at 8:30 a.m. All high school classes will meet for a short period schedule on the first day of school. School will be dismissed at 3:15 p.m.

In addition to the general supply of paper and pencils usually required for school, middle school and high school students should note the following items:

- Band students using school-owned woodwind, string, brass and percussion instruments are required to pay a rental fee of \$10 per semester or \$20 for the school year.
- Orchestra students using school-owned instruments are required to pay a rental fee of \$10 per semester or \$20 for the school year.

Activity tickets are available.

- Adult season pass, \$50; high school student season pass, \$25; middle school student season pass, \$20; elementary student season pass, \$20; family season pass, \$125. A college student may purchase an adult season pass for \$50 or be included in a family pass. A senior citizen season pass is \$20.
- If you are 62 or older, you qualify for a complimentary pass issued by the Huron Public Schools. These passes are now undated and are available by contacting the Superintendent's Office @ 150-5th Street SW—Huron Arena (2nd floor-east side)/605-353-6990.
- Individual tickets may be bought at the door. At the door prices are as follows:
 - Adult individual ticket \$5/student individual ticket \$3 (grade 1-12).

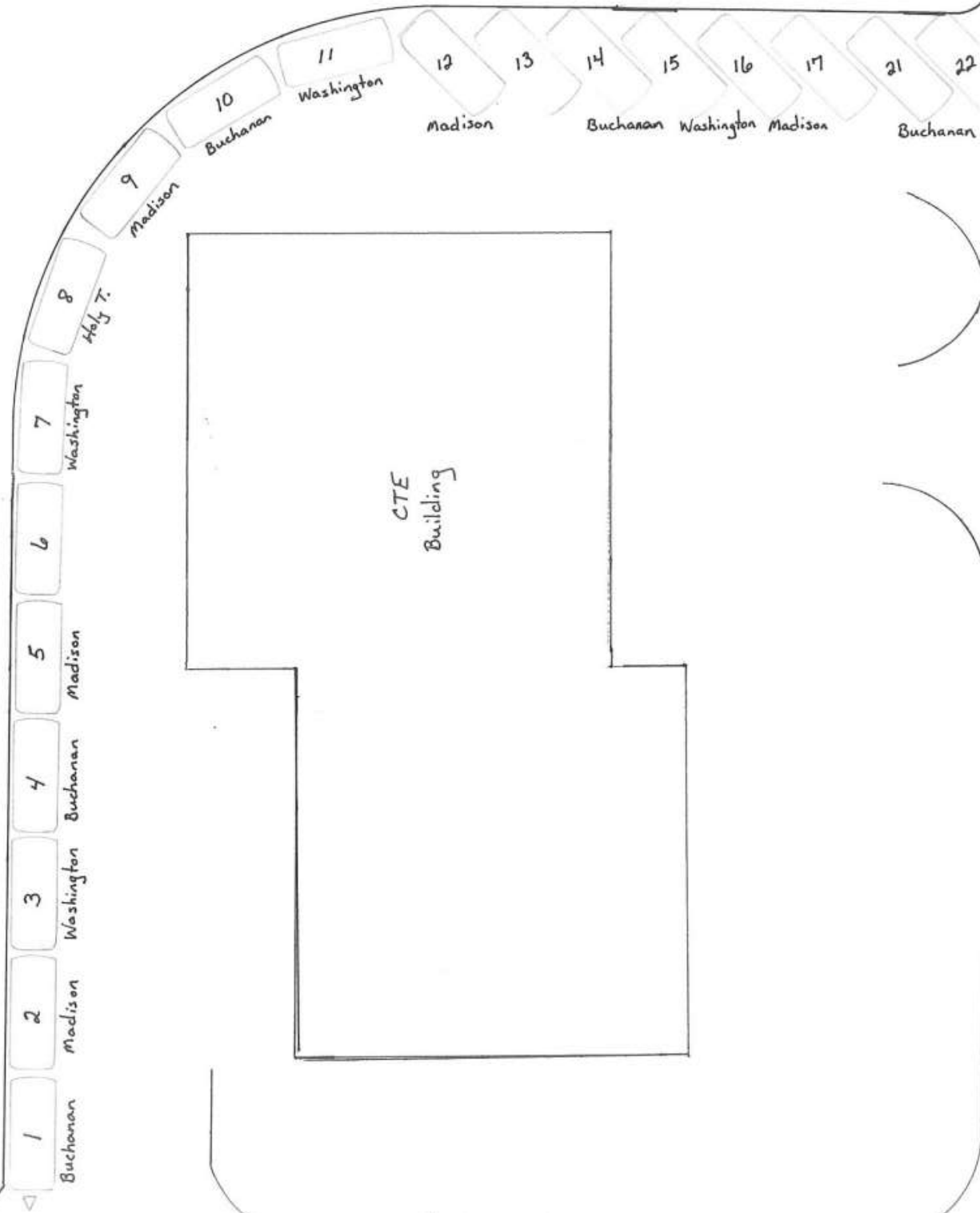

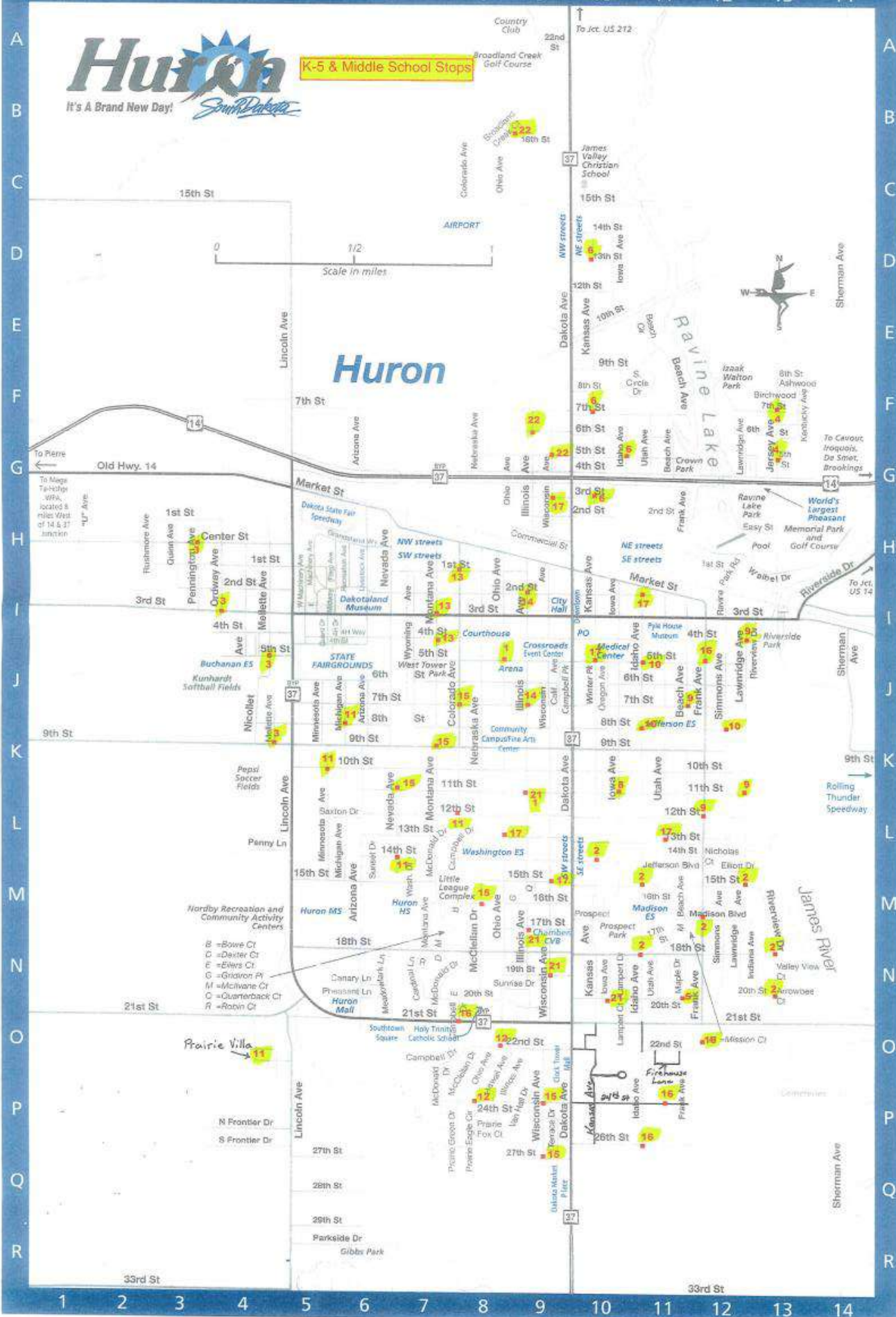

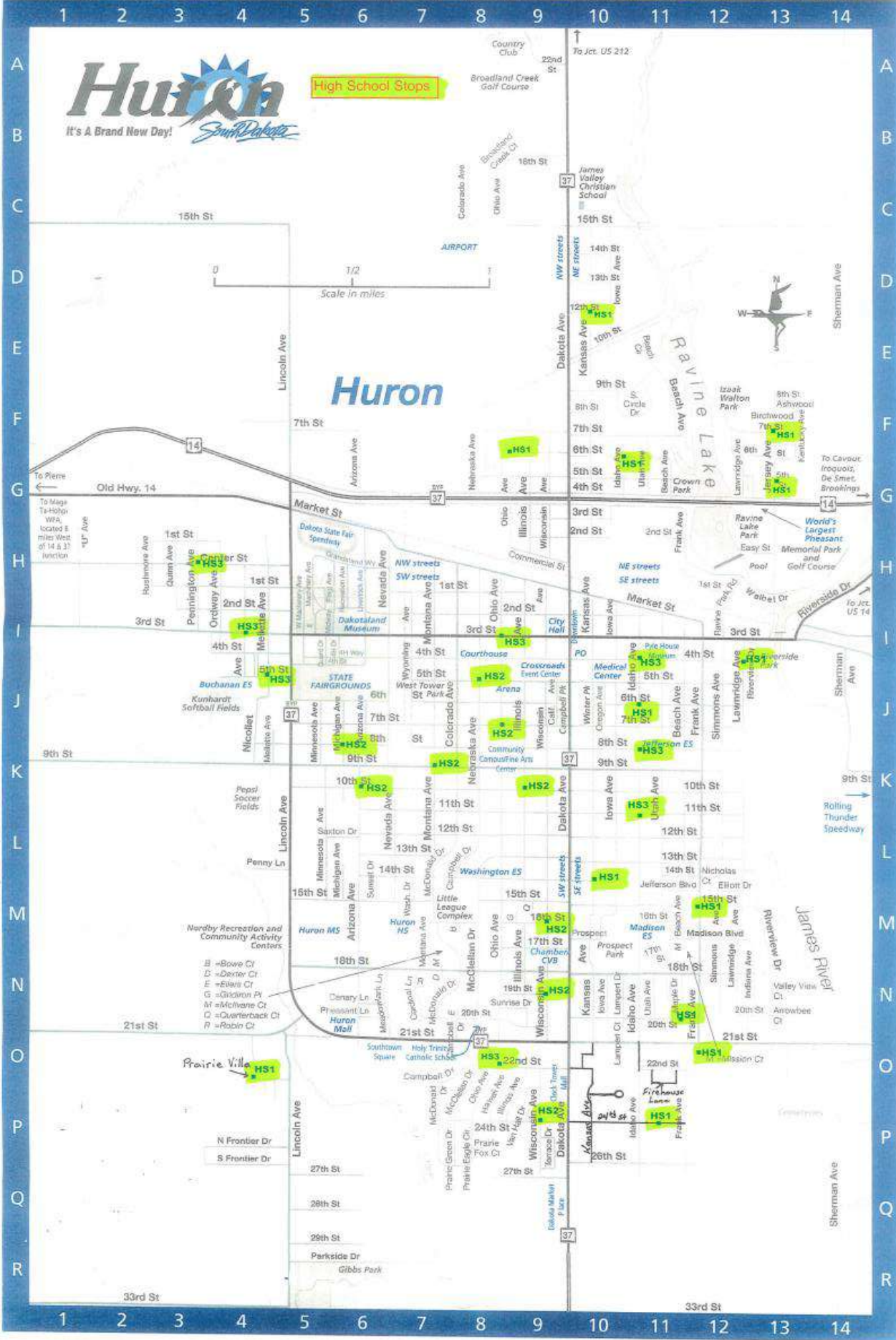
