<u>Procedures for the Establishment of the Local Advisory Committee</u>

▶ Each school division <u>may</u> establish a local advisory committee composed of parents, school personnel, and other community members who are appointed by the school board. This committee shall reflect the ethnic and geographical composition of the school division. This section should include the school division's procedures for the establishment of the local advisory committee for the gifted program if the division has elected to establish a committee.

BCPS has an established gifted advisory committee made up of administrators, parents, teachers, counselors, and gifted resource teachers.



Gifted Eligibility/Referral Process

- 2nd Grade Screener NNAT Test (Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test | Third Edition)
- Woodcock-Johnson IV* and CogAT (The Cognitive Abilities Test)*-Administered to Students Referred to Eligibility Evaluation Process

*updated to latest test versions

- ▶ Following this administration and score evaluation students may be administered additional assessments if needed.
- Additionally, teachers and parents receive rating scales to be completed and used as part of the student profile (SIGS-2 / Scale for Identifying Gifted Students)
- Parents will receive an <u>eligibility determination letter</u> following testing and score analysis.

Can only second grade students be referred for a gifted evaluation?

Answer: No. Second grade students are given the NNAT as a screener, but can referred at later grade levels as well. Often parents and/or teachers refer a student for further evaluation.

Why can't students in grades K, 1, and 2 be identified and receive gifted services?

Answer: Our Gifted Resource Teachers do push into lower elementary classrooms and do Kingore Activities. By doing these activities, our teachers can observe student's traits and look for gifted characteristics.

Most Divisions choose 2nd grade as a screener year due to the maturity level of the students and readiness to be given a screener, such as the NNAT.

Where do I find what course offerings my child can choose from in middle school and high school?

Answer: BCPS publishes and posts a Program of Studies on the Division website. The Program of Studies is updated yearly by BCPS administrators and counselors.

What happens when a student takes Algebra, Geometry or a Foreign Language at the middle school level? Does the student get high school credit? Does the grade count towards their high school GPA? Can the student decline the grade?

Answer: The student may get high school credit for the identified courses above. The grade does not count towards a high school GPA.

A parent may request that the grade be omitted from the student's transcript and the student not earn high school credit for the course. Such request shall be made in the format and by the deadline set forth in regulations developed by the superintendent, per BCPS Policy IKEB.

Who should be contacted if my child has questions about courses at the middle school level or high school level?

Answer: The building level principal as well as the school counselors are excellent resources when there are questions about courses.

What are some traits of gifted learners?

Answer:

- *Unusual curiosity and questioning
- *Having interests that are varied and not necessarily common
- *Having the ability to solve difficult problems / thinking outside of the box
- *Using their ideas to reason and make abstract connections
- *Enjoying challenges put forth in front of them
- *The ability to communicate at a higher intellectual level
