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Scholarship Criteria

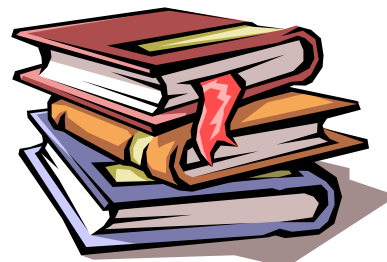
The Genesee County Association of School Board Members (GCASBM) has established six—\$750 scholarships per year for Genesee County high school seniors to assist them with their financial and educational needs at an institution of higher learning. These are competitive, nonrenewable scholarships for tuition, books, fees and supplies. The scholarships may be granted to full or part-time students with the use of the funds spread over more than one year, if desired.

Only ONE applicant from each high school endorsed by the local school district board president and superintendent will be considered for these scholarships.

Each county superintendent is asked to provide the enclosed application to qualifying seniors in your district.

(Note: Early Middle College students should apply in their 13th year of school)

Students should return the completed applications to your office by February 17, 2023. Superintendents select ONE candidate from each high school in your district and submit the completed application to the Genesee Intermediate School District, Office of the Superintendent, GCASBM, 2413 W. Maple Avenue, Flint, Michigan 48507 by March 3, 2023.



In order for students to be considered for these scholarships, students must be in their last year of high school (12th grade or 13th year for early middle college students), attained at least a 2.5 high school grade point average, completed a substantial amount of community volunteer service through a school program or other recognized community agency (such as Scouts, a place of worship, or Big Brothers-Big Sisters) and have a defined academic and/or vocational goal. The students must submit the attached application form, along with a resume, a typewritten essay describing their academic and/or vocational goals and the value of community service, official copy of transcripts and a letter of recommendation from an adult within school district.. **The essay must be not more than one page, double-spaced.**



Awardees will be notified of their selection on March 17, 2023 by U.S. Mail, and will be invited to accept the scholarship at our GCASBM awards meeting April 20, 2023.

It is the goal of the GCASBM to promote higher education and provide encouragement and assistance to students who are committed to the betterment of our community and are focused and willing to work toward their established goals. To be considered for these scholarships, **a student must be completing their last year of high school (12th grade or 13th year for early middle college students)**, have attained at least a 2.5 high school grade point average, be substantially involved in community volunteer service through a school program or other recognized community agency (such as Scouts, a place of worship or Big Brothers-Big Sisters) and have defined academic and/or vocational goals. The student must submit this application form, along with a typewritten essay of not more than **ONE** page, double-spaced, describing their academic and/or vocational goals and the value of community service.
